The CMC program requires 60 points of education, as well as 50 points of experience, for a grand total of 110 points. The program prepares the applicants to meet the challenges of the complex role of the Municipal Clerk by providing them with quality education in partnership with institutions of higher learning, as well as State, Provincial, and National Associations. The CMC program has been assisting clerks to excel since 1970.

PLANNING

◆ **Updates on Highlighted Projects**

1022 N. Bradford Avenue- Hindu Church

The applicant is proposing to change the Planning Commission/City Council approved site plan in order to increase the footprint of the multi-purpose building by approximately 750 square feet. The approved parking layout has also been revised to accommodate an emergency vehicle access gate along the south property line. Tierra West Advisors has determined that no further environmental action is required for the proposed changes. Staff determined that revisions will require Planning Commission review and approval.

918 & 926 W. La Jolla Street

The applicant submitted a Development Plan Review application packet on October 22, 2013 for Planning Commission review and approval of a 10 unit apartment complex. The application is currently being processed.

1049 Golden Avenue

Grading permits were issued on October 22, 2013. The applicant is seeking a building permit for one model prior to final map recordation.

Tuffree Park

Verizon Wireless has submitted plans for a facility co-located on the existing wireless facility at Tuffree Park adjacent to the gymnasium. Plans include installation of new equipment shelter/storage area within Tuffree Park. The project is pending lease approval with the City. A draft lease agreement was sent to the applicant for review and comments.

Koch Park

A lease agreement with the City was completed for a wireless communication facility. Building plans were returned to the applicant with corrections.



POLICE DEPARTMENT

◆ Code Enforcement / PSO Activities

On November 11th, 16 Administrative Citations were issued.

Staff removed 27 illegal signage postings on November 12th, 49 more on November 13th and 28 on November 14th.

◆ Crime Prevention

Coffee with a Cop

Coffee with a Cop is a program designed for the community to get to know its Police Department in an informal setting. The first meeting was held on the morning of Wednesday, November 19, 2013 at Placentia Town Center's McDonald's. Staff visited with 17 adults and five children, and the management and owner of McDonald's welcomed the Department to come back anytime.

◆ Significant Events

November 15, 2013

Officers responded to a window smash commercial burglary in the 100 block of North Bradford. After clearing the business, the Police Department was informed by Resource Officer Madrigal that a witness reported seeing several Valencia High School students in the business just prior to school that day. Follow up was done at the High School and patrol units arrested four juveniles for commercial burglary. It is believed the window smash and original burglary was done earlier and by another suspect. The juveniles saw the unsecured business, and then entered and took items, creating a secondary burglary at the location.

November 16, 2013

Traffic conducted a DUI check point for commercial driver's license holders in the 100 block of E. Yorba Linda Boulevard. A total of ten citations were issued, five vehicles were impounded, and one arrest was made.

November 17, 2013

Officers arrested six adults for a variety of violations, primarily domestic violence, and one male adult was placed on a psychiatric hold after officers located him lying on his back, during hours of darkness in the middle of the #1 lane of Alta Vista, in an attempt to end his life.

November 19, 2013

Officers attempted a bike stop at Santa Fe and Walnut. The male adult bicyclist attempted to evade the officers and fled about a block on his bike. An Officer saw the male throw something and was able to detain him without incident. After a search of the area, an Officer located a baggie of methamphetamine. The suspect was then arrested for possession of methamphetamine, concealing evidence, and for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

November 20, 2013

Officers were dispatched to a disturbance in the east alley of the 100 block of N. Bradford Avenue. After investigation, a citizen's arrest of a male adult was accepted by the Police Department and the suspect was transported to jail. The suspect was additionally charged with felony for resisting arrest and for battery on a police officer.

An Officer followed a car that failed to yield that took him southbound on the 57 freeway from Chapman Avenue. A high risk traffic stop was conducted and the driver was detained. He was found to be driving under the influence and was arrested.



While patrolling the CVS parking lot of Yorba Linda Blvd. and Kraemer Blvd., an Officer saw a male adult run back into the store upon seeing the police car. The Officer detained the male in the store and checked a suspicious occupied vehicle in the parking lot. One of the subjects had a felony arrest warrant and was arrested.

PUBLIC WORKS

◆ Emergency Pipeline Repair

A deteriorated stormwater pipeline that crosses Bastanchury Road at Kraemer Boulevard has been discovered that presents an imminent hazard and potentially dangerous public safety risk. Video inspection was performed to determine the cause of substantial settlement in the surface pavement. The inspection revealed a deteriorated metal stormdrain pipe and a resulting sub-grade void. Left unaddressed, this void and failed pipeline would allow the street to collapse suddenly under vehicular traffic. Public Works staff temporarily filled the void in order to keep the roadway open and prevent the large sink hole from developing further. Under emergency authority, staff has engaged Valverde Construction to begin work on Friday November 22nd to replace the deteriorated pipe section and related repairs which cross all four traffic lanes of Bastanchury Road just East of Kraemer Boulevard. The estimated cost of repair is \$37,000. Per established City policy regarding appropriations for emergency repairs of this nature, staff will bring the appropriation to a future City Council meeting for ratification. Valverde Construction has previously performed satisfactory pipeline work for the City within established budgets and timelines and was available to begin the necessary repairs immediately.

◆ Stormwater Program

The City was notified by the County of Orange that the Olson Project was discharging sediment onto Golden Avenue and Rose Drive. Public Works staff inspected the site and issued a Stop Work notice until all of the trackout was cleaned to the maximum extent practicable prior to the forecasted rain event. Additionally, upon inspection of the site, staff noticed a variety of construction best management practices (BMPs) that were improperly installed and asked that they be rectified. The Construction Site Manager, Troy Wood, was notified and the site was cleaned and all BMPs were corrected.



◆ Public Education and Outreach

The Teen Team visited the Fullerton Arboretum on November 16th and toured the gardens.





The Teen Team also visited the Cathy Torres Learning Center on November 20th. The Team used the City's Enviro-Scape model to illustrate how pollutants enter the waterways. Additionally, each student created their own miniature watershed.



◆ **Engineering/CIP Projects**

Safe Routes to Schools – School Signs Compliance

The City has been approved to receive \$409,000 in Safe Routes to School (State) funds for the School Sign Compliance Project, to upgrade all of the school signs and markings throughout the City. This project has started with painting of legends at crosswalks located at schools. The contractor has received the permits necessary to begin installation of all the required signs. It is anticipated school sign installation will occur next week, along with the new striping of school crosswalks. The consultant that developed the plans is continuing to prepare suggested safe routes to school maps, which are being reviewed by the City's Traffic Engineer. Once complete, the City will meet all federal requirements necessary for proper school signage.

Richfield Road Widening

Lakeview Avenue will be closed to traffic during construction of the Lakeview Avenue Railroad Grade Separation Project. Traffic will be detoured to Richfield Road as a primary detour route. OCTA has approved two cooperative agreement amendments for the project to assist in funding its completion. The City has received late comments from Metropolitan Water District (MWD) requiring further studies that will delay the project. The studies are important as a large main line coming from the local Diemer Plant runs along the project site. Should this line be disrupted large parts of Orange County would be without drinking water. Additionally, if MWD is not satisfied prior to construction they could shut the project down while under construction, leaving the City open to delay damages by the contractor. The project is still anticipated to be completed before summer of 2014.

Richfield Road and Orchard Drive Traffic Signal

The Richfield Road Widening Project Cooperative Agreement, which included funding for the traffic signal, has been approved by both OCTA and the City. Included in the aforementioned agreement is a contribution from the City of Yorba Linda for \$20,000. The City of Yorba Linda will be presented a cooperative agreement and invoice for their share next week. The specifications and plans for the project are being finalized and are anticipated to be advertised in early December. A contract for construction of the project will be presented to the City Council in December. It is anticipated the traffic signal equipment will take a couple of months to order, so actual installation of the traffic signal may not occur until late February or early March 2014.



Quiet Zone Update

The City of Placentia and Anaheim have completed their reviews. Our consultant is waiting for comments from BNSF Railway before finalizing the documents. A complete package will be sent next week to Federal Railroad Administration and the California Public Utilities Commission continuing the Placentia Quiet Zone. As a result of the grade separations, BNSF railway required the City to provide a Quiet Zone update in order to continue the Federally approved no train horn use. Fortunately, the temporary shooflies for the grade separations will include the necessary measures to continue the Quiet Zone. After all grade separations are complete, the City will provide another update requesting the Quiet Zone continue at those locations that are not grade separated.

Bastanchury Road Rehabilitation

The City has received funding from CalRecycle through the Tire Derived Products Grant Program, formerly known as the Rubberized Asphalt Grant program to rehabilitate Bastanchury Road. The City has contracted out for preparation of designs and specifications. The City held a pre-design meeting with the contractor this week and preparations are underway for the designer to walk Bastanchury Road and begin design. All utilities have been contacted and are providing the City with their utility maps.

Speed Survey

State law requires that the City updates speed limits every 7 years, based on an engineering and traffic survey. The State has strict requirements that must be followed to avoid creating speed traps and creating enforceable speed limits. Based on the findings of a citywide engineering and traffic survey, the City Council recently approved increases in the speed limit for six street segments and decreases on eight street segments (shown below). The appropriate signs have been installed and are now being enforced.


