## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### ◆ Narcotic Enforcement K9

Detective Menely and K9 Buddy have completed drug detection school, including passing the POST certification test. They will be assigned to the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) task force as their primary assignment, but will be available for call outs. K9 Buddy is a drug detection dog, and is not certified for Patrol use.

### ◆ Code Enforcement

February 6, 2014

Staff assisted with 10-15 bookings and transport of prisoners to Orange County Jail.

Staff transported one arrestee to Orange County Jail where he was refused for medical reasons and took prisoner to West Med for several hours to get medically cleared for booking.

### ◆ Significant Events

#### **February 6, 2014**

During a traffic stop at Vincente and Richfield, a passenger fled from the vehicle. Officer Conroy pursued the subject across Richfield, through the flood control channel and through the adjacent storage business. Officers took the suspect into custody after the lengthy foot pursuit. He was charged for a parole violation, narcotic sales and resisting. The driver of the vehicle was also arrested for possession of narcotics.

Officer Martinez noticed two suspicious people walking away from a vehicle in the Denny's parking lot at Placentia and Nutwood. Martinez established surveillance on the vehicle and waited until the couple returned to the car and drove away. Officer Martinez conducted a traffic stop and an eventual probation search on the vehicle. The search resulted in the arrest of both occupants for possession of drugs, identity theft materials, and stolen property. During the interview, the suspects admitted to coming to the Placentia / Fullerton area to buy narcotics.

#### **February 8, 2014**

Officer Conroy located a stolen car in the 900 block of Gonzales Street. After conducting surveillance on the vehicle, he ultimately arrested a female for grand theft auto. A patrol search at the residence affiliated with the woman resulted in the arrest of the woman's boyfriend, a known La Jolla gang member. The man was charged with unauthorized possession of ammunition and drug related crimes.

#### **February 11, 2013**

At 7:30 a.m., Officers responded to a traffic collision on Bradford and Madison. Upon completion of the investigation the adult driver was arrested for DUI/Drugs. At about 12:09 p.m., Officers responded to a injury traffic collision, roll over, at Rose Dr. and Palm Dr. Officers found that a single vehicle had struck the curb and rolled the vehicle, causing injuries to the female adult driver and infant in the rear seat. Upon conclusion of the investigation the driver was cited at the hospital for DUI/Drugs.

#### **Fire Outlook – Low:**

Good drying conditions will continue today and Friday over Southern California which will allow for afternoon ignition components to become quite high in some of the fine and dead fuels. Expect rapid rates of spread in continuous fuels during afternoon hours due to critically dry conditions. Winds should be light and RH recovery will be good through Friday, which will help with any containment efforts. Minimum RH should remain above 20% and skies will be cloudy, but look for the winds to be quite strong during the day Saturday. Initial attack should be light through the period.
