### ◆ **Placentia's 5th Cycle (2013-2021) Adopted Housing Element**

The Placentia's Housing Element, adopted January 7, 2014 was received by the Department of Housing and Community Development, Division of Housing Policy Development on January 16, 2014. The Department submitted a letter to the City (please see attached) which indicated that the City's adopted housing element is in full compliance with the State's housing element law and all statutory requirements.



## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### ◆ Code Enforcement

#### **February 10, 2014**

Staff, south end patrol officers, and a public works crew cleared, cleaned and secured homeless camp located south of the rail road tracks and east of the 57 freeway and south of 550 W. Crowther.

#### **February 12, 2014**

Staff assisted the Investigations Division with a multiple warrant service operation. The operation resulted in the simultaneous booking of 4 arrestees that were later transported to Orange County Jail.

#### **February 14, 2014**

PSO transported two arrestees from day watch to Orange County Jail. Upon returning to the City, they booked 1 arrestee in the City Jail who was later transported to OC Jail. Again upon returning to the City, they responded to a residence to receive another arrestee who was taken to Placentia-Linda Hospital for medical clearance prior to booking in the City Jail, and later transported to OC Jail.

#### **February 15, 2014**

PSO assisted day watch personnel with releasing two arrestees and conducted a traffic collision investigation. During the night, one arrestee was booked in the City Jail and transported to Orange County Jail.

### ◆ Significant Events

#### **February 13, 2014**

Police Officers conducted a pedestrian check in the La Jolla area. During a search of the man, Police Officers located drugs and paraphernalia on the man. The man then fought with Police Officers resulting in a taser being deployed on the suspect. The suspect was treated at Placentia Linda Hospital for the incident but had no injuries. The man was booked into Orange County Jail for destroying evidence and obstructing a peace officer.

#### **February 14, 2014**

Police Officers became aware of a probationer that was at his parents' residence in violation of a restraining order. They went to the residence and made contact with the restrained party. The male adult resisted officers briefly and tried to discard drugs from his pocket. The male was arrested for violation of a restraining order, possession of heroin, possession of a syringe, and a parole hold.

#### **February 15, 2014**

Anaheim Police Department pursued a vehicle through our City. The suspect used their vehicle to push another vehicle out of their way at Orangethorpe and the 57 Freeway. The pursuit continued onto the southbound 57 Freeway and ended in South Orange County. The driver was arrested for felony evading, \$200,000 in warrants, and assault with a deadly weapon for the incident in our city. The driver of the struck vehicle was not injured.

#### **February 16, 2014**

Officers were dispatched to CVS Pharmacy in the 100 blk. Yorba Linda Blvd. regarding a beer run. Upon arrival, officers determined two 20 packs of beer had been taken by two suspects. Although the witnesses could not identify the suspects, officers viewed video of the crime. One of the suspects was identified as a resident of Placentia and current parolee. A parole search was conducted at the parolee's home; however, the parolee was not at home. The investigation was completed for commercial burglary and forwarded.

#### **February 17, 2014**

Police Officers arrested two male adults, one who is a habitual transient for trespassing and the other out of a vehicle stop for narcotic sales, possession of heroin, illegal drugs and paraphernalia.

### Laguna Hills

**Structure Fire – February 19<sup>th</sup>.** OCFA crews were dispatched at 10:34 a.m. to a structure fire on Buckskin Drive in Laguna Hills. ### **Ortega Highway Unincorporated**

**Remote Rescue – February 15<sup>th</sup>.** OCFA crews were dispatched at 11:03 a.m. to a remote rescue in the area north of Caspers Park off of the Ortega Highway. Units were led into the patient by Orange County Park Rangers which ended up being approximately 3 miles off the pavement. Ground units were able to drive approximately 2 miles and had to hike in the rest of the way. Once on scene with the patient they made an injury evaluation and determined that the patient would have to be hoisted out by the helicopter. The patient was hoisted out and taken to Caspers Park, loaded in a ground ambulance, and transported to Mission Hospital for treatment.

As ground units started up the mountain Helicopter 1 was able to clear off the first Remote Rescue and flew to the area. Helicopter 1 was able to locate the patient and inserted rescuers to start patient evaluation. It was determined that the patient was in BLS status and the helicopter flew to Loma Ridge in order to get fuel. Once refueled Helicopter 1 returned to the scene, extracted the patient, and flew back to Loma Ridge where they transferred the patient to a waiting ground ambulance.

**RE: City of Placentia's 5<sup>th</sup> Cycle (2013-2021) Adopted Housing Element**

Thank you for submitting the Placentia's housing element, adopted January 7, 2014 that was received for review on January 16, 2014. Pursuant to Government Code Section 65585(h), the Department is reporting the results of its review.

The Department is pleased to find the adopted housing element in full compliance with State housing element law (Article 10.6 of the Government Code). The adopted element was found to be substantially the same as the revised draft element the Department's September 13, 2013 review determined met statutory requirements.
