ADMINISTRATION

◆ KNX 1070 News Radio "At Your Corner" Featuring Placentia

KNX 1070 AM News Radio broadcasts a monthly series of programs highlighting the unique communities of Southern California called "On Your Corner". KNX 1070 is profiling the communities of Placentia, La Habra, Brea, and Yorba Linda on Friday, July 25. The day-long program focuses on business, politics, transportation, entertainment, history, community, tourism and culture, etc. The City of Placentia, with commentary by Mayor Scott Nelson, will be featured at 3:37 p.m. and will focus on the Downtown Placentia Metrolink project.



◆ Nomination Period for City Council and City Clerk Positions

A General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Placentia on Tuesday, November 4, 2014 for two (2) members of the City Council and one (1) City Clerk position. Each position serves a four-year term. The nomination period for candidates is now open and will close on Friday, August 8th at 5:00 p.m. Candidates must be residents and registered voters in the City of Placentia. Official nomination papers and candidate manuals will be available in the City Clerk's Office during the above referenced nomination period. ◆ OC Bridges Orangethorpe Avenue Road Closure

The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) previously planned for the construction of the bridge to be built while Orangethorpe remained open via a bypass road. However, due to the complexity of utility relocations by AT&T, Edison, and the Gas Company, full closure of Orangethorpe Avenue will be necessary in order to remain on schedule. Starting in August, Orangethorpe Avenue will be closed to through traffic from Thames Street to Chapman Avenue. Portable changeable message signs will be engaged at key points for a minimum of ten days before the road closure. Please exercise caution while driving near the construction area. When the roadway construction is complete, drivers and pedestrians will be able to travel on Orangethorpe Avenue with no delays caused by railroad activity on the bridge below them.

ENGINEERING AND CIP PROJECTS

◆ Richfield Road and Orchard Drive Traffic Signal

Work on the Richfield Road Widening Project continues with the installation of curb, gutter, and handicap ramps. Installation of the traffic signal will occur in late September when the traffic signal equipment is received by the contractor.



ENGINEERING AND CIP PROJECTS

- **Emergency Sewer Line Repairs on Orangethorpe Avenue**

The City is repairing a sewer line that was damaged on Orangethorpe Avenue. The line was damaged as a result of Southern California Edison (SCE) relocating their high voltage distribution poles. City Staff is working with SCE to repair the damages.

- **Buena Vista Street Improvement Project**

The City of Placentia will partner with the City of Yorba Linda for street improvements on Buena Vista Street. The project will rehabilitate the roadway from the City's eastern limits on Buena Vista to Jefferson Street on the west. The City of Yorba Linda will be the lead for the project and will solicit bids in August 2014. It is anticipated the improvements will be made in the Fall of 2014.

- **Yorba Linda Boulevard Street Improvement Project**

The City of Placentia will partner with the City of Fullerton for improvements to Yorba Linda Boulevard. The Fullerton project will make improvements to the roadway from Placentia Avenue to Bradford Avenue. The City of Placentia will receive improvements to the intersection which includes a handicap ramp, street improvements, and traffic signal improvements. The work will begin on August 18, 2014. All improvements are anticipated to be completed by October 2014.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- ◆ **DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint Planned for July 25th**

The Placentia Police Department Traffic Bureau will be conducting a DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint on Friday, June 25th in the City between the hours of 8:00 p.m. – 2:00 a.m. Police Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Police Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing. When possible, specially trained Police Officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, and other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the Placentia Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. If you see a drunk driver, please call 9-1-1.





POLICE DEPARTMENT

◆ Code Enforcement

July 14, 2014

A Police Services Officer took one graffiti report, one residential burglary report, and handled one other call for service. Two code compliance courtesy notices were issued. Another Police Services Officer assisted patrol officers with two (2) bookings and transports, both prisoners were transported to Orange County Jail.

July 15, 2014

A Police Services Officer handled one call for service and conducted Placentia municipal code signage enforcement in the area of Rose and Alta Vista (7 signs removed). One arrestee was booked and transported to Orange County Jail. Another Police Services Officer assisted with booking and releasing of a belligerent arrestee. He also assisted a K9 Police Officer with a prisoner transport from the field to the City jail where the prisoner was booked and transported to Orange County Jail.

July 16, 2014

Fourteen code compliance inspections were performed; seven courtesy notices and three administrative citations were issued. Another Police Services Officer assisted patrol officers with one prisoner booking and transported two to Orange County Jail.

◆ Significant Events

July 18, 2014

A Police Officer observed two vehicles racing on Yorba Linda Blvd. A brief vehicle pursuit ensued before the suspect ran into the parking lot at Placentia Linda Hospital where he tried to hide his vehicle. The man was arrested for street racing and evading Police.

A DUI traffic collision occurred in Atwood when a woman struck a parked car, dragging it several meters along the curb line.

A Police Officer located a man who was possibly dealing drugs in the Placentia area. Upon investigation, the man was arrested for several narcotics and weapons charges including, furnishing drugs to a minor.

◆ Significant Events

July 20, 2014

At 2:08 p.m., Police Officers were dispatched to the 300 block of Hudson Avenue in reference to a welfare check of the resident. The reporting party stated that the resident was an 80 year old male with multiple medical issues who lived there alone and had not been seen and/or heard from in over a week. When officers arrived, they spoke with some neighbors who also confirmed that the resident had not been seen in over a week. The neighbors also stated that there were 3 dogs in the residence and that at least 2 of them would bite anyone who entered the residence. Animal Control Officers responded to assist in controlling the dogs and Police Officers attempted to make contact with the resident. Verbal contact was made with the resident through an open screen and the resident advised that he was down on the floor in the living room and could not move. Entry was made into the residence through an open rear sliding door and the resident was located on the living room floor in serious need of medical attention. Animal Control Officers were able to restrain the dogs and ultimately took possession of all 3. Orange County Fire Authority responded and transported the resident to Placentia Linda Hospital for further medical attention.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

◆ Significant Events

July 22, 2014

At approximately 9:18 a.m., Police Officers were dispatched to the 600 block of Benjamin Avenue in reference to a possible dry ice bomb detonation. The reporting party stated that there was a male subject in the backyard of the location who had detonated a dry ice bomb and was now possibly building a pipe bomb. Police Officers arrived and located a 30 year old male in the backyard who was then detained. In the backyard, Police Officers located possible bomb making materials, as well as a glass bottle which had some unknown type of liquid (ultimately found to be lighter fluid) in the bottom with an open match book stuffed into the top of the bottle. The residence and surrounding residences were evacuated and Orange County Sheriff's Department Bomb Squad (OCSD) was requested. OCSD Bomb Squad as well as Orange County Fire Authority personnel arrived on scene to assist in the investigation. Bomb Squad personnel investigated/searched the scene and did not locate any evidence of a bomb detonation. Bomb Squad personnel seized the items located in the backyard and then advised that at this point in time they really did not believe that there was enough information to make an arrest. The male subject was questioned by Placentia Police Department personnel, Bomb Squad personnel and personnel from the Orange County Intelligence Assessment Center and ultimately released.

A gang member attempted to stab another individual at Santa Fe Park. After a preliminary investigation was concluded by Police Officers, Detectives responded and remain on the case.

The California Highway Patrol in Los Angeles got in a vehicle pursuit of a stolen vehicle in the Los Angeles area. The pursuit ended when the suspect exited the 57 freeway and drove on Chapman Avenue to the Northgate Market where the Highway Patrol conducted a "pit" maneuver in order to stop the vehicle. One suspect was taken into custody.

Weekly Update on Response and Preparedness

Weather Outlook: *Above Normal Temperatures for July 26th – August 1st.* For more information, please visit the [National Weather Service Climate Prediction Center](#).

Fire Outlook – Low:

Large fire potential climb over the next few days due to hot, sunny weather. Afternoon burning indices will be very high each day with record high energy release component values in all fuel types. Expect an exceptionally high ignition component with both live and dead fuels readily accepting flame with rapid rates of spread. This weekend, isolated storms will be possible. Unlike the last round of convection, these storms will be preceded by several days of strong drying conditions and a higher number of starts may occur even though the storms will be few in number. Expect moderate initial attack through the end of the week, then possibly heavier initial attack this weekend if thunderstorms return to the region. National Fire Preparedness Level: 2 (On a scale of 1-5, with Level 5 being the highest level of fire activity.) Description: Several Geographic Areas are experiencing high to extreme fire danger. There is moderate commitment of National Resources with the potential to mobilize additional resources from other Geographic Areas.
