

## ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

### ◆ Schaner Ranch Property Update

On September 8th, the grading permit was issued for the Beazer Homes Development Project by the Engineering Division. The construction work includes sewer lines, water lines and storm drain installation on Kraemer Blvd. This work is expected to take up to three months to complete.

### ◆ New Business - Yopik Frozen Yogurt, Inc.

On September 2nd, Tenant Improvement Plans for a new Yopik Frozen Yogurt located at 660 N. Rose (Alta Vista & Rose) were approved by the Planning and Building Division and the Orange County Health Department.

## ENGINEERING AND CIP PROJECTS

### ◆ OCTA's Grade Separation Projects Update

Orangethorpe Avenue (west of Chapman Avenue) – Orangethorpe Avenue is closed between Chapman Avenue and Crowther Avenue/Miller Street, with access currently provided to Rose Drive. Chapman Avenue is expected to be closed at Orangethorpe Avenue in January, 2015.

Tustin Avenue/Rose Drive – The temporary bypass road currently under construction is expected to open at the end of September. The existing roadway will then be closed to traffic at the RR tracks and Orangethorpe Avenue to allow construction of the new Tustin Avenue/Rose Drive bridge.

Lakeview Avenue – Preliminary construction activities related to utilities is currently taking place. Lakeview Avenue is expected to close in April, 2015. A temporary traffic signal at Richfield Avenue & Miraloma Avenue and a permanent traffic signal at Richfield Avenue & Orchard Drive, both under construction, will assist traffic through the detour.

Placentia Avenue & Kraemer Boulevard – Both of these new undercrossings are now open to traffic, although final “clean-up” work continues on both. Both projects are expected to be completed in late September, 2014.

#### Orange County Crime Stoppers

The Placentia Police Department has partnered with Orange County Crime Stoppers to facilitate the public in reporting information on crimes. All tips are anonymous. Tipsters providing information that leads to an arrest will be eligible to receive a reward up to \$1,000. A person with information can call, text, or go to the website to report an anonymous tip. All three lines of communications are monitored 24 hours a day.

### ◆ Traffic Collision on East Yorba Linda Boulevard

On September 7th at approximately 6:00 p.m., Placentia Police received 911 calls of a single vehicle traffic collision in the 1000 block of East Yorba Linda Blvd. Upon the Police Officers arrival, they found a black Toyota Camry had collided with a tree on the South sidewalk of Yorba Linda Blvd. The driver and sole occupant of the Camry was pronounced deceased at the scene by Orange County Fire Authority Paramedics. The collision remains under investigation by Placentia Traffic Investigators; however, witnesses at the scene described the Camry driving at a high rate of speed prior to the collision. The male driver has been identified by the Orange County Sheriff-Coroner Investigators; but his name is not being released pending notification of next of kin. No other persons or vehicles were involved in the collision. If anyone has any information concerning this collision, they are encouraged to call Placentia Traffic Investigators at (714) 993-8157.

### Weekly Update on Response and Preparedness

**Weather Outlook:** *Normal to Above Normal Temperatures for September 14 – September 20.* For more information, please visit the [National Weather Service Climate Prediction Center](#).

**Fire Outlook – Low:** Large fire potential will be elevated across all areas outside the deserts through the weekend. Very warm and dry weather will allow for fuels to become increasingly susceptible to new starts during peak heating hours. Expect rapid fire spread in continuous fuels where terrain is in alignment even though winds will be light overall. Next week, higher relative humidity in Southern California along with a chance of precipitation should lower the threat of large fires, but it will still remain warm and dry over the central part of the state through early next week. Initial attack will be moderate through the weekend with some resource demand likely each day.
