ADMINISTRATION

◆ City Facilities Holiday Closure

All City facilities will be closed from December 19th through January 2nd. City Hall and other City facilities will reopen on Monday, January 5th. The Police Department will remain open during the holidays. For non-life threatening emergencies, such as a fallen tree, street flooding, or other public works issues, please call (714) 993-8100. The Building Division will offer limited inspections during the holiday closure. Building inspection requests must be made by 2:0 p.m. on December 18th. To schedule an inspection, please call (714) 993-8124.

◆ Republic Services Holiday Schedule

Free holiday tree collection is provided for single family with automated collection beginning Monday, December 29th through Friday, January 9th. Holiday trees are picked up in a special collection truck, not the regular automated truck. Residents are reminded to:

- ◆ Have trees out by 7:00 a.m.
- ◆ Remove stand and all decorations.
- ◆ Do not put trees in a plastic bag.
- ◆ All trees larger than six-feet must be cut-in-half.
- ◆ Flocked trees are not recyclable, and therefore, are not eligible for the free collection.
- ◆ Flocked trees may be disposed of in the regular trash container or by scheduling a bulky item pickup.

Republic Services will offer FREE drop-off at our facility, to accommodate residents that may have missed their tree collection opportunity. Limit one tree per customer (not for commercial use). Hours: Monday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.



ADMINISTRATION

◆ Anaheim Regional Transportation Intermodel Center (ARTIC) Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

City Staff attended the Anaheim Regional Transportation Intermodel Center (ARTIC) Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on Monday, December 8th. ARTIC offers direct access to various forms of public transportation including the Metrolink, Amtrak, buses and taxis that are yards away from the Honda Center, Angels Stadium and the 57 freeway. Construction of the transit hub started in September 2012, with funds from the State and Federal governments and Measure M, the county's half-cent sales tax approved by voters to pay for transit projects across the region.

Sandbags will also be available at Fire Station #34, 1530 Valencia Avenue. Sand bags can be very useful in diverting water, protecting slopes and structures, and assisting in erosion control.



POLICE DEPARTMENT

◆ DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint

Placentia Police Department Traffic Bureau will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on Friday, December 12th. DUI checkpoints are a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely. Funding for this checkpoint is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. We would like to remind everyone to report drunk drivers, please call 9-1-1.

◆ Vehicle versus Train Collision

On December 4th at approximately 4:30 p.m., a Nissan Juke was travelling southbound on Richfield Street south of Orangethorpe Avenue. The driver and sole occupant drove the Nissan off the road, up an embankment, and around the crossing guard arms which were down. The driver drove onto the railroad tracks and was struck by a freight train which was travelling eastbound at approximately 50 mph. The impact propelled the Nissan off the tracks. Witnesses observed the driver discarding what appeared to be alcoholic beverages prior to Police Officers' arrival and the collision is being investigated as a possible DUI. The driver was transported to Western Medical Center in Santa Ana with non-life threatening injuries. The collision caused the freight train to block several intersections along Orangethorpe Avenue. The Placentia Police Department Traffic Bureau is investigating the collision. If anyone has any information concerning this collision, they are encouraged to contact (714) 993-8157.

◆ Code Enforcement

December 3, 2014

A Police Services Officer represented the City in a code enforcement appeal hearing, and assisted Orange County Fire Authority with a fire safety inspection of the Police Department. One code enforcement contact was made, five re-inspections were conducted, and one arrestee was booked and released after posting bail. A night watch Police Services Officer issued seventeen parking citations. In the process of a patrol check at The Royal, sworn personal were called out for a disturbing the peace complaint.

December 4, 2014

A Police Services Officer booked and released one arrestee and assisted Public Works with a sewer backup at the Northgate shopping center. Four code enforcement re-inspections were conducted and two code enforcement contacts were handled. Another Police Services Officer issued three code enforcement courtesy notices, one code enforcement administrative citation and assisted with tenant notification at Northgate shopping center regarding a sewage back-up issue. A night watch Police Services Officer assisted Police Officers with one booking, two transports to Orange County Jail and issued twenty five parking citations.

December 5, 2014

A Police Services Officer issued two code enforcement courtesy notices, observed vandalism in progress at the 900 block Chapman (riverbed), which led to a foot pursuit by Police Officers with an arrest made. A Night watch Police Services Officer assisted officers with seven cite out bookings, six in field female searches and issued three parking citations.



POLICE DEPARTMENT

◆ Crime Prevention

On Tuesday, December 9th the Police Department assisted Orange County Health Agency with a student walking survey at Ruby Drive Elementary School. The purpose of the survey is to assess the walking routes for students and improve the safety and accessibility for the students. The students were instrumental in pointing out the safety issues. This is the first stage of the project. Future stages include the students prioritizing the concerns, preparing a report, and presenting to City officials to improve the walking routes.

◆ Significant Events

December 4, 2014

An injury traffic collision was reported in the area of Yorba Linda and Hamer with one vehicle possibly on fire. Police Officers arrived on scene and it was learned that one of the vehicle's involved was a reported stolen vehicle. The two occupants in the stolen vehicle were transported to area hospitals and the California Highway Patrol handled the investigation due to it occurring in the County area.

December 5, 2014

A foot pursuit in the area of Chapman/Orangethorpe when a PSO observed vandalism in progress and called it in with detailed information. A lengthy foot pursuit through residential and through the construction site southwest of the intersection.

An armed bank robbery occurred at Gina Maria's Pizza in the 1500 block of N. Placentia Ave. Two suspects entered the store and demanded money. The employees gave the suspects the money from the register and the suspects then fled the location northbound towards Palm Dr. on foot.

Police Officers responded to the 600 block of W. Center St reference an adult male subject who had been stabbed in the head. The victim suffered approximately four (4) stab wounds to the back of the head and was uncooperative with Police Officers on scene. It is unknown at this time where the crime occurred and the victim was transported to UCI Medical Center as a trauma patient.

December 6, 2014

Police Officers responded to a structure fire at 900 block of Easton. Upon arrival, Police Officers found the residence to be filled with smoke and all of the residents standing outside. Orange County Fire Authority, Anaheim and Fullerton Fire Departments' responded and located the source of the smoke to be from an electrical fire in the roof. The residence sustained major smoke damage and ventilation holes were cut into the roof by fire personnel.

December 8, 2014

A sinkhole in the area of Tustin and Orangethorpe was reported at approximately 5:00 p.m. Two vehicles reported striking the sinkhole, which Police Officers located northbound Tustin north of the tracks in the #2 lane. The sinkhole was approximately 4' x 4'. Both vehicles reported flat tires. Orange County Traffic Authority was notified and responded to the scene.

Building Division Activity

1. Tenant improvement plans for an existing industrial building at 300 E. Orangethorpe were approved by Planning and Building Divisions on 12/1/14. Owner of the building is separating this building by installing a fire rated (3 hour) fire-wall assembly in order to accommodate a new furniture store.
2. Solar panel installation plans and building permits were approved for 13 different single family homes on 12/2/14.
3. Room addition building plans & structural calculations for a single family home located on Lavender Lane were approved on 12/2/14. Scope of work includes 256 sq. ft. of new den, remodeling of existing kitchen and a new 288 sq. ft. of patio cover in the rear yard.
4. Tenant improvement plans for a new ice cream shop located at 1800 block of Orangethorpe were submitted to Planning and Building Division for review and approval on 11/26/14. This set of improvement plans are subject to O.C. Health Department approval prior to building permit issuance.
5. Building plans & structural calculations for high storage rack installations at 200 Boysenberry Lane were submitted to Building Division for review and approval. Due to the height of these storage racks, building permits will be issued with approval from the O.C. Fire Authority.
6. Room addition plans and structural calculations for a single family residence located on Cascades St. were submitted to Planning and Building Divisions for review and approval on 12/3/14. Scope of work includes demolish of existing patio cover and build a new 264 sq. ft. of family room addition as well as new kitchen remodeling work.
7. Tenant improvement plans for the Bruery @ Dunn Way were submitted to Building and Planning Division for review on 12/2/14. Business is doing well for this brewing company which produces local bottled beers for both whole sale and retail (beer tasting facilities) purposes. Scope of work for this new tenant improvement plans includes to occupy additional floor area (4,200 sq. ft.) for new offices, break rooms, kitchen area, bathrooms, storages..etc. Please see attached photos for their current on-site operations.
