ENGINEERING AND CIP PROJECTS

◆ OC Bridges Project Update on Lakeview Avenue

The Orange County Transportation Authority is currently working on reconstructing Lakeview Avenue as a bridge to allow vehicles to pass over the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway tracks. Full street closure of Lakeview Avenue near Orangethorpe Avenue will be in place for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians as early as February 23rd. The closure will remain in place until approximately Fall 2016. Orangethorpe Avenue will remain open during this phase. This closure will allow crews to safely build the new bridge structure. POLICE DEPARTMENT

◆ Significant Events

February 4, 2015

At about 3:30 a.m., Police Officers were sent to 1400 block of Via Balboa regarding a residential burglary in progress. The reporting party stated she heard breaking glass and sounds coming from the downstairs. Upon arrival, Police Officers detained a heavily intoxicated male outside the location who thought he was in the area of his Fullerton apartment. He was arrested for public intoxication and booked at the Placentia Police Department.

February 5, 2015

February 6, 2015

An assault with a deadly weapon was committed against one of our Traffic Cadets in the area of Highland/Orchard. The Traffic Cadet was writing a parking ticket at the time of the incident. The suspect was identified by the victim and Investigations was notified.

Development Services Project List

1. Tenant improvement plans for an existing pre-fabricated steel mezzanine structure and storage racks located at an industrial complex on Segovia Street were approved by both Planning and Building Division on 2/2/15.
2. Twelve (12) residential solar panel building plans and building permits were reviewed and approved by the Building Division on 2/2/15.
3. Tenant improvement plans for an existing cell site (T-Mobile) located at 1102 E. Yorba Linda Blvd. were approved by Planning and Building Divisions on 2/3/15. Scope of work includes adding additional antenna and electronic devices onto the existing 38 feet high monopole structure.
4. Tenant improvement building plans and structural calculations for a high storage rack structure (12 feet) on Crowther Street were approved by the Building Division and Orange County Fire Authority on 2/2/15.
5. Room addition plans for a residential home on Wilson Street were reviewed and approved by Planning and Building Divisions on 2/4/15. Scope of work includes addition 450 sq. ft. living room and 250 sq. ft. of patio cover as well as a 195 sq. ft. of new garage area.

In the wake of the devastating fire in San Juan Capistrano and in an effort to reduce the risk of deaths related to home fires, volunteers will go door-to-door on February 21 and offer the installation of free smoke alarms to residents in the La Zanja area. Volunteers from the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA), Orange County Sheriff Department, the American Red Cross and Mission Basilica in partnership with the City of San Juan Capistrano and other community partners will install free smoke alarms in homes in the La Zanja neighborhood in the City of San Juan Capistrano. Residents will also receive information on fire safety and preparedness and learn how to create a home evacuation plan.

Structure Fire – February 7 - At 12:26 a.m. an Auto Alarm Water Flow Alarm was dispatched to Orangethorpe Avenue in Buena Park. As Engine 62 was en route the ECC received a call of a working fire on Orangethorpe Avenue and the call was balanced to a Working Structure Fire response. Engine 62 arrived on scene and identified a single story strip center with heavy smoke coming from the end unit and located a civilian inside the structure. The person was removed from the structure and an ambulance was requested. The Primary All Clear was given and the fire brought Under Control at 12:40 a.m. The potential patient was treated and released at the scene with possible smoke inhalation.
