## ADMINISTRATION

### ◆ Update on the Response to State Mandated Water Use Reductions

On July 7, 2015, a presentation was made by representatives from Golden State Water Company (GSWC), Yorba Linda Water District (YLWD), and the Orange County Water District (OCWD) outlining the recent mandatory water conservation restrictions imposed Statewide and the direct affect on Placentia customers. The presentation discussed the conditions of the drought, the Governor's Executive Order, Placentia's water service, and water use efficiency programs and rebates.

In response to the Governor's Executive Order (B-29-15), the State Water Resources Control Board imposed restrictions to achieve a Statewide 25% reduction in potable urban water usage through February 28, 2016. These restrictions will require water consumers to reduce usage as compared to the amount they used in 2013. Golden State Water Company (GSW) and Yorba Linda Water District (YLWD) customers already reduced usage in 2014, but will need to achieve additional water conservation in 2015-16 to achieve the Statewide goal.

### ◆ Significant Events

#### July 3, 2015

A Police Officer located a “rolling stolen” vehicle in the area of Kraemer and Chapman. He continued following the vehicle while updating his location. The vehicle was blocked in on Southampton and a high risk stop was initiated. Three people were detained in the vehicle. The investigation revealed the plates that belong on the vehicle had been stolen and replaced with another set of stolen license plates.

#### July 4, 2015

A female adult with a history of suicide attempts was taken to Kaiser Hospital after making suicidal comments at a business in the 900 block of E. Yorba Linda Blvd.

Placentia Police responded to a residence on the 900 block of Goldenrod reference a drowning victim. Upon arrival, a 14 year old male was located lying next to the pool, unresponsive. The male’s father located him at the bottom of the pool, removed him and began life saving measures. Officers took over for the father until OCFA paramedics arrived. The male was ultimately transported to PLH after regaining a strong pulse and improved breathing.

#### July 5, 2015

At approximately 2:00 a.m., Police Officers received a call of a suicidal subject with several outstanding warrants who was driving around Placentia and Yorba Linda making statements via phone to his girlfriend that he wanted to commit suicide by cop. Working with the subject’s girlfriend, Officers were able to locate the subject and take him into custody for his outstanding warrants.

#### July 7, 2015

A Police Officer took a domestic violence report at the front counter of the Police Station. At approximately 3:30 a.m., the Police Officer located the suspect on the 200 block of S. Kraemer. With the assistance of two other Police Officers, the suspect was taken into custody.

## **Building Division Activity**

1. Building plans for a residential renovation project located at Madison Street were reviewed and approved by Planning & Building Divisions on 6/22/15. Scope of work includes bedroom remodeling, bathroom renovations, new electrical, HVAC, plumbing fixtures. Cost of the construction is \$100,000.00
  2. Solar panel installation plans and structural calculations for total twelve (12) residential homes were reviewed and approved by Building Division on 6/23/15. These installation plans apply to single family detached homes.
  3. Tenant improvement plans for an existing industrial building at 615 Fee Ana Street were reviewed & approved by Planning & Building Divisions on 6/24/15. This project involves with new outdoor metal steel frame canopy structure (4,763 sq. ft) to be added onto the existing metal canopy structure. Cost of the construction is \$35,000.
  4. Demolition work for the three (3) existing dwelling units at 1026 N. Bradford Avenue (Hindu Temple) has been completed subject to the final inspection. Parcel map is currently being reviewed by the Engineering Division prior to the property line wall and building permit issuances.
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1. Residential improvement plans for a single family detached home located at San Anselmo Lane were reviewed and approved by Planning and Building Divisions on 6/29/15. This project involved a kitchen addition of 133 sq. ft. and new electrical & plumbing fixture units. Cost of the construction is \$72,000.
  2. Preliminary architectural and building plans for a Use Permit application at 950 S. Via Rodeo were submitted on 6/30/15. This application is for a micro brewery operation and public tasting facility. Total occupied space will be 5,200 sq. ft. and future major tenant improvement plans will be involved if this use permit application is approved.
  3. Seven (7) solar installation plans and structural calculations were reviewed and approved by Building Division on 7/1/15. These solar installations are for single family detached homes.
  4. Architectural and structural plans for a residential remodeling project located at Fisher Lane were reviewed and approved by Building Division on 7/1/15. Scope of work includes removing load bearing and non-bearing walls, structural and kitchen renovations, living room expansions, window replacements, new plumbing fixtures. Cost of the construction is \$45,000.

**Remote Rescue – July 3** - At 10:30 a.m. a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to the area of South Laguna Ridgeline Trail between Laguna Nigel and Laguna Beach. Ground units arrived in the area and with the assistance of the Park Rangers began to attempt to make access to the patient. Helicopter 2 picked up two rescuers at Soka University and flew to the area to begin looking for the patient. The patient was located at the extreme west end of the trail. Ground units arrived and began evaluating the patient. After the evaluation the patient decided to continue on her hike and was released at the scene.

### **San Juan Capistrano**

**Remote Rescue – July 3** - At 12:47 p.m. a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to an area north of the Ortega Hwy near the county line. With very remote access to the patient all ground units were staged at either Casper's Regional Park or the USFS station off the Ortega Hwy. Helicopter 2 arrived over the area and was quickly able to locate the patient. A quick evaluation of the patient was done; the patient was prepped and hoisted into the helicopter. They flew to Casper's Regional Park, landed, and the patient was transferred to an awaiting ground ambulance which in turn transported to the patient to a local hospital.

### **Laguna Beach**

**Vegetation Fire – July 3** - At 3:09 p.m. a Medium Vegetation Fire response was dispatched to the area of Laguna Canyon Rd and Canyon Acres Dr, Laguna Beach.
