### ◆ Sewer Lateral Inspection Program by the Gas Company

Southern California Gas Company (SoCal Gas) has proactively launched a comprehensive program called the Sewer Lateral Inspection Program (SLIP) to identify locations where a natural gas pipeline, installed using trenchless technology, may have crossed in close proximity to an existing sewer line. As SoCal Gas identifies such locations, the gas lines will be relocated and any damage to the sewer line will be repaired at no cost to the City or residents. The Gas Company assures the City that safe and reliable service is its top priority. **SEWER LINE INSPECTION**

A review of our construction records has identified your home as having a natural gas pipeline that was installed within close proximity to a sewer line.

When natural gas pipes were installed using trenchless construction methods, it created the very rare chance that the natural gas pipeline may have crossed through the sewer line. To ensure the continued delivery of safe and reliable service, a contractor from The Gas Company is inspecting the sewer and gas system to verify that this did not occur. If necessary, the contractor will make repairs and relocate the gas line if it has intersected the sewer piping.

Access through your sewer clean-out or roof vent may be required to perform these inspections. If this access is required, The Gas Company's contractor will contact you prior to beginning the inspection.

## **Building Division Activity**

1. 2<sup>nd</sup> submittal of the room addition plans for a single family detached home located @ Hock Street were reviewed and approved by Planning and Building Divisions on 10/5/15. This project involved in adding a 240 sq. ft. of new bedroom and some other interior remodeling work.
2. Residential remodeling project for a house located at Appling Street have been reviewed and approved by both Planning and Building Divisions on 10/6/15. Scope of work includes living room, dining room, kitchen remodeling, removing of exist. bearing walls, new structural farming members and new concrete footings.
3. Tenant improvement plans for a new restaurant “Waba Grill” located at 720 N. Rose Dr. have been submitted and approved by Planning & Building Divisions on 10/7/15. This new restaurant will have a total of 1,600 sq. ft. of floor area & maximum 49 for the total occupant load. Cost of the tenant improvement construction is \$140,000.00.
4. Revised grading plans for Beazer Homes (T- 17145) have been reviewed and approved by Engineering, Planning and Building Division on 10/7/15. This revision was based on some floor plan changes during the construction stage. Developers are finishing up two (2) more phases which contains total fifteen (15) new homes.
5. Construction of the new K-9 Memoriam Wall in front of the City Hall/Police Station started on Saturday 10/3/15. This is a 5’ high & 8’ long masonry wall construction with steel re-bars inside and concrete foundation underneath. Many volunteers from this Placentia community were involved in this construction.

**Structure Fire – October 8** - At 2:41 a.m. a Structure Fire response was dispatched to Pedro's Taco Shop on South El Camino Real in San Clemente. An Orange County Sheriff's Officer was on scene of a possible burglar alarm and was able to see smoke and some type of fire in the business. First arriving units confirmed they had a single story restaurant with smoke coming from the roof and asked for the balance of the Working Structure Fire response. The fire was quickly knocked down by 2:57 a.m. and County Health was requested to assist at the scene.

**Vegetation Fire – October 9** - At 12:23 p.m., multiple reports were received a vegetation fire in the Tonner Canyon area, near the Boys Scout Camp, and dispatched a vegetation response to Tonner Canyon Road in Brea. Simultaneously, LA County Fire reported a SOLAR response in the same area, and the OCFA response coordinated efforts with LA County units. Helicopter 2 provided a recon report of a 50x50 spot with slow rate of spread to the Incident Commander. Three Metro Net units remained on scene to assist with firefighting efforts, and the remainder of the OCFA response was cancelled.

### Mission Viejo

**Vegetation Fire – October 9** - At 1:58 a.m., ECC received a report of an unknown type fire in the bushes off the Northbound 5 at La Paz Road exit, and dispatched an unknown response. Truck 9 arrived on scene at 2:10 a.m., reporting a small brush fire on the shoulder, extending into the trees, and requested two additional engines. A spot fire approximately 200 yards away from the original fire was also reported. Santiago Crew and Superintendent 1 were assisted, along with a water tender. **Vegetation Fire – October 9** - At 6:20 a.m., several reports were received of possible smoldering bushes in the same vicinity as the earlier fire, and a vegetation response was dispatched. Engine 24 arrived on scene at 6:32 a.m., reporting a small vegetation fire in the same vicinity, to the rear of Mission Viejo High School, but access to the location was difficult. Units made forcible entry to the rear of the school property and contained the fire to some bushes and with damage to the high school's baseball field. Santiago Crew and Superintendent 1 were assisted for mop-up efforts. School officials were notified and the scene handed over to them. This was originally believed to be a rekindle from the earlier fire, but is determined to be a new start.

**Remote Rescue – October 10** - At 12:38 p.m., a remote rescue was dispatched to a reported hiker down on Car Wreck Trail in Aliso Woods Canyon Park. Ground units were able to make access and evaluated a total of two patients. It was determined both patients would need to be hoisted out. Helicopter 2 inserted two rescuers. Once on the ground each rescuer packaged a patient and both were hoisted into the aircraft during two separate extractions. The patients were transported to a nearby landing zone for further treatment and evaluation by ground units. One patient signed AMA and the other was transported Advanced Life Support by ground ambulance.

**Remote Rescue – October 11** - At approximately 2:10 p.m., Battalion 3, Engine 23, Helicopter 2 and Truck 6 assisted Orange City Fire with a remote rescue in Santiago Oaks Regional Park. Engine 23 and the Park Ranger were first on scene of downed mountain biker. It was determined the patient had a minor hip injury but was unable to hike out. Helicopter 2 inserted the Flight Medic and the patient was packaged for a stokes extraction.
