Rosalina Davis is currently the President of the Placita Santa Fe Merchants Association, Chairwoman of the 29th Annual Hispanic Scholarship Golf Tournament for CSUF, Vice Chairperson of CSUF Auxiliary Services Corporation, Committee Member on the Placentia Economic Development Committee, and Board Member of the North Orange County Chamber. Rosalina Davis and her husband Raul Davis, own the Tlaquepaque Restaurant in Downtown Placentia. The restaurant is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year. Several years ago, Mrs. Davis was awarded the prestigious and coveted "Woman of the Year" recognition Senatorial award by Senator Bob Huff. Recently, Mrs. Davis received the CSUF Vision and Visionaries Award for 2015.

Public Works Updates

Public Works staff performed maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests and citywide. The Sign Shop repaired and replaced signs on Placentia Avenue and La Jolla Street. Helicopter 1 arrived on scene, located the victim approximately 10 feet from the cliff in 8 to 10 foot brush. He was at least a quarter mile from the nearest road. The crew of Helicopter 1 inserted a Rescue /Medic in anticipation of doing a pick-off extraction once it was determined the victim had no injuries. The victim was hoisted into the aircraft without incident and transported to Loma Ridge where Engine 23 did a complete medical evaluation. The victim was then turned over to the Orange County Sheriff's Department.
