

## PUBLIC WORKS

### Public Works Department Update

Public Works staff continued to perform maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests. The Sign Shop repaired and replaced signs on Yorba Linda Boulevard, Kraemer Boulevard, Placentia Avenue and Santa Fe Street. The Patch Crew filled potholes on Santa Fe Street, La Jolla Street and Rose Drive. The Ballfield Maintenance Crew worked on infields at the Sports Complex, Tuffree Park and Tori Hunter Field. The Facility Maintenance Crew completed work orders at City buildings and installed new overhead lights on a carport at the City Yard. The Irrigation Crew worked on irrigation valves at Kansas Park, Dunnavant Parkway, and Tuffree Park. The Maintenance crews cleaned the downtown area and debris on arterial streets.

As a reminder to our residents, City staff is now assigned to remove the graffiti, pick up dead animals, maintain the downtown landscaping and make sure the OCTA bus stops throughout the City of Placentia are clean. ## Electric Vehicle Charging Station Installation at the Civic Center

Installation of new electric vehicle charging stations at the Civic Center is near completion. In an effort to reduce fuel and maintenance costs, the City recently acquired 10 new Chevy Spark electric vehicles for use in day-to-day City operations. The new vehicles have replaced traditional gasoline vehicles in the City's fleet and the vehicles were purchased utilizing grant funds from the Air Quality Management District. Additional grant funds were awarded to the City for the installation of 12 new vehicle charging stations.



The charging stations have been installed along the northern edge of the Civic Center parking lot. Two of the charging stations will be made available for the general public's use while visiting or conducting business at the Civic Center. The charging stations will keep the City's new electric vehicles on the road, providing various services to our community, while at the same time reducing long-term fuel and maintenance costs, as well as helping to reduce our carbon footprint.

## Significant Events

### February 10, 2016

A female juvenile runaway was located and fought with officers. She was arrested for felony, resisting and striking officers.

Placentia Police Officers assisted an off duty Anaheim Police Sergeant who was involved in a pursuit of a stolen vehicle through the City of Placentia. The vehicle eventually yielded in the area of Rose and Oakhurst, in the City of Yorba Linda and the driver was taken into custody without incident.

### February 12, 2016

Placentia Police Officers assisted Brea Police Department and then Orange County Sheriff's Department with back-to-back bank robberies involving the same suspect.

### February 15, 2016

There were numerous commercial burglary alarms that occurred and two traffic collisions. The first collision occurred on Kraemer at Livingston, when a vehicle collided into a center median light pole and destroyed the pole. A delayed response from Edison caused numerous personnel to be on scene. A second collision occurred at Orangethorpe and Rose. One of the drivers fled the scene and was chased down and held at gunpoint by an off duty Police Officer. The suspect was arrested.

### February 16, 2016

At approximately 9:30 p.m., Fullerton Police Department called for assistance at the end of a pursuit possibly involving an armed robbery suspect in the area of Orangethorpe and Brookhurst. A Placentia canine officer and his canine partner were able to locate the suspect involved in the pursuit and take him into custody without incident. However, it was later determined that the suspect in the pursuit was DUI and fleeing from a hit-and-run, not the actual robbery suspect they were looking for.



## **BUILDING AND PLANNING DIVISIONS**

1. Tenant improvement plans for a new office remodeling (Brookdale Hospice LLC) located at 701 W Kimberly Ave., were submitted to the Planning and Building Divisions for approval on 2/8/16. Scope of work includes new partition non-bearing interior walls, remodeling of existing restroom in compliance with ADA regulations, new electrical, mechanical, and plumbing fixtures. The cost of the construction is \$40,000.
2. Twelve (12) solar panel installation plans and structural calculations for residential projects were submitted and reviewed by the Building Division on 2/9/16. These solar installation projects are for residential detached homes only.
3. Tenant improvement plans for an existing cell tower (T-Mobile) located at 1102 E. Yorba Linda Blvd. were reviewed and approved by the Planning and Building Divisions on 2/9/16. The scope of works includes new antenna units to be attached to the monopole structure, new electrical wire system and above ground equipment boxes. The cost of the construction is \$20,000.

## Significant Emergency Incidents

### Irvine

**Technical Rescue – February 12** - At 7:26 a.m. a Technical Rescue response was dispatched to Spectrum Center Drive in Irvine. First arriving units identified that there were two patients trapped in a window washing rig that had failed approximately twelve feet above the roof. Both patients had been injured when the rig failed. Crews were able to lower the rig back onto the roof; both patients were evaluated and transported to area hospitals for treatment of their minor to moderate injuries.

### Placentia

**Chemical Spill – February 12** - At 12:06 p.m. a Chemical Spill Inside response was dispatched to Orchid Drive in Placentia, for the report of spilled mercury at the residence. First arriving units confirmed that there was a small amount of mercury spilled and possibly coming from a broken candy thermometer that was in a box in the garage. The Incident Commander requested a County Health representative and Placentia PD to assist at the scene. HazMat units arrived on scene and worked with the County Health representative to mitigate the problem. All units had cleared the scene by 2:45 p.m.

### Orange

**Remote Rescue – February 13** - At 10:27 a.m., Metro Net requested assistance with a Remote Rescue response for a hiker down on a trail east of Santiago Oaks Regional Park. Helicopter 1 with the flight medic and Truck 9 rescuer on board assisted the units on the ground with trail access and remained on scene to provide assistance and hoisting if necessary. The patient was transported BLS by City of Orange ground units.

### Modjeska Canyon

**Remote Rescue - February 13** - At 2:22 p.m., a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to a biker down on Horse Thief Trail near the Main Divide. The biker was unable to continue down the hill approximately five miles out from the trailhead. Helicopter 1 arrived on scene and inserted the flight medic via hoist. The biker had no injuries and was hoisted into the aircraft via a pick off. He was flown to Plano Trabuco where Engine 31 was waiting and assisted the biker back to his vehicle.

### Modjeska Canyon

**Remote Rescue - February 13** - At 3:16 p.m., a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to a biker down on a trail in Modjeska Canyon. Helicopter 1 located the patient and landed on an unimproved trail inserting the flight medic and Truck 9 rescuer. The 72-year-old biker was found with an altered level of consciousness with multiple punctures and bleeding injuries. He was transported as a trauma to Orange County Global Hospital.

### **Yorba Linda**

**Remote Rescue – February 14** - At 11:51 a.m. a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to the area of the Pipeline Truck Trail east of Coal Canyon Rd. As ground units were making access to the area described by the Reporting Party Helicopter 1 arrived in the area and began looking for the patient. The patient was located and Helicopter 1 was able to make a flat pitch landing and the rescuers began an assessment of the patient's injuries. It was determined that the patient would be able to ride in a vehicle back down to the Coal Canyon Rd. Anaheim Engine 309 transported the patient while Battalion 2 transported the others in the party. Once back to the pavement the patient refused further treatment and Battalion 2 then transported all parties back to their vehicle off Green River Rd.

### **Aliso Viejo**

**Remote Rescue - February 14** - At 4:04 p.m. a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to the area of Aliso Woods Canyon Park for the report of a hiker that was stuck on a cliff. OC Sherriff's Helicopter Duke1 was first on scene and determined that the hiker was uninjured and just unable to get further up/down the cliff. Ground units arrived in the area and also determined that they were going to be unable to make access to the hiker. Helicopter 1 started the coordination with Battalion 4 for a pick off type rescue. Battalion 4 requested that Laguna Beach Fire send an ALS response to Alta Laguna Park as that was the closest place for the Helicopter 1 to land if need be. The hiker was hoisted into Helicopter 1 at 4:34 p.m. and flown to Alta Laguna Park. The hiker was then taken by Laguna Beach PD back to their vehicle.

### **Trabuco Canyon**

**Remote Rescue – February 16** - At 11:50 a.m. the ECC received a report for a motorcyclist that had fallen and suffered a knee injury on the Main Divide Rd south of Santiago Peak. Helicopter 1 was in the area of Santiago Peak training, was contacted by ECC and immediately started toward the location. Ground units were sent to the Plano/Trabuco landing sight to await the helicopter/patient if needed. Helicopter 1 was able to locate the victim at 11:52 a.m. and flew a short distance away to make a flat pitch landing in order to reconfigure the aircraft for a hoisting operation. Once back over the scene Helicopter 1 inserted two rescuers with their gear to start evaluation and packaging of the patient. She was determined to in a BLS status, was hoisted into the aircraft and flown to the Plano/Trabuco landing sight and transferred to an awaiting ambulance.
