

OC Bridges Grand Opening Ceremony

On Tuesday, May 17th the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) marked the completion of overcrossings along Orangethorpe Avenue and Tustin Avenue/Rose Drive. The Tustin/Rose Bridge has now opened to drivers. Officials expect to have traffic flowing on the Orangethorpe overpass in June. The Orangethorpe Grade Separation Project is part of OCTA's OC Bridges Project, which will create seven underpasses and overpass, to separate the train tracks from surfaces streets along the busy BSNF Railway tracks.

Orange County Sanitation District's Newhope Sewer Replacement Project

Construction is about to begin on Phase A of the Orange County Sanitation District's (OCSD) Newhope Sewer Replacement Project. The replacement of the sewer line will be done in several segments on State College between Chapman and Nutwood in the City of Fullerton to relocate a city water line. As construction progresses, a new sewer line will be constructed where the water line was previously located. Starting as early as May 23, work will take place adjacent to the Cal State University Fullerton campus.

During the summer months, the construction schedule will be expedited with extended work hours. Work hours vary by location with most taking place Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. – 10 p.m., Saturday 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m., with some night, and Sunday work. Tree Removal and Replacement at Arroyo Park

The City's tree maintenance contractor removed 21 trees at Arroyo Verde Park. A combination of the drought and disease caused these mature trees to die requiring their removal. The City's contractor was careful to inspect each tree to ensure no active bird nests were found prior to their removal. The trees are scheduled to be replaced by May 26th. The replacement trees will be a combination of Canary Island Pine and Chinese Flame Trees. 24-inch box specimens will be replanted at the park. Although significantly smaller than the large, mature trees they are replacing, this size tree is appropriate to ensure the long-term health and viability of the trees. 

The Orange County Task Force on Drowning Prevention/OCTA Media Campaign Launch Event will take place on Wednesday, May 25 at 10:30 a.m. at William Woollett Jr. Aquatics Center in Irvine. The Task Force will unveil the messaging used on OCTA buses with a large, wrapped OCTA bus. Speakers will also address the importance of drowning prevention efforts and consistent messaging in Orange County.

OCFA, the American Red Cross, the City of Placentia, and volunteers from Valencia High School partnered to install free smoke alarms at The Hacienda Mobile Home Park. The event took place on Saturday, May 14 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. A total of 165 smoke alarms were installed in 81 homes and residents of the neighborhood received fire safety and emergency evacuation education. Smoke alarms were also installed in the recreation room and a building in the complex used for special events.

Traffic Collision Cut and Rescue – May 12 - At 10:32 a.m. ORCO Helicopter 2 responded to a reported TC Cut and Rescue at the south bound 241 near the 133 interchange. As ORCO Helicopter 2 arrived on scene a CHP Helicopter had already landed next to the patient's vehicle along with a CHP Ford Explorer that had also made access. The patient's vehicle had traveled 200 feet down an embankment parallel to the 241. The victim had been trapped and unnoticed for 14 hours, until spotted overhead by the CHP Helicopter. To access the patient, the CHP Patrol officer had to drive over a dirt culvert off the 241 and drive down a series of old cement access roads to make contact with the victim. The culvert was too steep for the ground ambulance, Truck 43, Engine 27 and ORG Engine 7 access to the patient was made by foot. The determination was made by the Incident Commander to insert the Medic and Truck 34 rescuer and hoist the patient out by stokes basket via ORCO Helicopter 2. It was also determined the patient had too many spinal issues to be driven out by a four wheel drive vehicle up the old cement road and steep culvert. The patient was hoisted to the aircraft and flown to OC Global as a trauma.

Remote Rescue – May 14 - At 12:20 p.m., a remote rescue response was dispatched to a medical aid on a trail near Live Oak Canyon Road/Hamilton Truck Trail. A 50-year-old male was reported to be having a diabetic problem. As ground units were making access, DUKE had already hoisted a rescuer/medic down to the patient and assumed responsibility of the patient. DUKE transported the patient directly to Mission without OCFA assistance.
