PUBLIC WORKS

Maintenance Division

This past week our staff performed various maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests City-wide. The Sign Shop repaired and replaced signs per work order requests. The Patch Crew filled in pot holes on arterial streets and performed minor street repairs on Chapman Avenue. The Paint Crew painted traffic legends in zones 12 and 13. The Ball Field Maintenance Crew worked on the infields at the Sports Complex, Tuffree Park and Torii Hunter Field. The Facility Maintenance Crew completed work orders for City buildings. The Irrigation Crew repaired and replaced water valves at Rose Drive and Alta Vista Street. The Maintenance Crew cleaned the downtown area and performed weed abatement in assigned areas.

On July 3rd, Public Works personnel responded after-hours to pick-up a dead animal at La Jolla Street. On July 4th, personnel responded after-hours to repair a backed up sewer line at the Cobblestone Village shopping center located at Orangethorpe Avenue and Lakeview Avenue. POLICE DEPARTMENT

Significant Events

July 1, 2016

Officers attempted to contact a Parolee when they noticed him sitting in his garage. As soon as the subject noticed the Officers approaching, he immediately fled inside his residence and barricaded himself. Officers quickly established a perimeter around the location with the assistance of several outside agencies. After giving announcements for approximately 15 minutes, the suspect surrendered to Officers and was taken into custody without incident.

July 2, 2016

Day Watch walked the railroad tracks behind Quick Turn assessing the homeless issues in the area. Officers arrested a male for an outstanding drug related warrant and issued a citation to



another individual for possession of a methamphetamine pipe. All subjects were told they have three days to vacate the premises.

At 11:43 a.m., an armed robbery in the parking lot of Wells Fargo at Bradford and Yorba Linda occurred. A male armed with a handgun was waiting in the parking lot and approached a female exiting the bank while brandishing the handgun. The loss was her purse and its contents. Brea PD had a similar robbery approximately half an hour before Placentia's was reported.

Officers set up a sting operation based on information passed from Night Watch with a male who was attempting to extort a female for 5,000 dollars by posing as a US Immigration Officer. He was threatening to deport the female if he was not paid. Officers set up a meeting with the suspect to deliver the money. At approximately 2:00 p.m., the male suspect showed up to collect his money and was taken into custody without incident. He was in possession of a vehicle equipped with flashing lights and siren as well as authentic looking immigration badges. Detectives responded to the station and the investigation is ongoing.

Officers were dispatched to the 500 block of Ponce regarding a fight. Upon arrival Officers became involved in a physical fight with a male adult. Several items of drug paraphernalia were located inside the house. The male was booked for felony assault and battery on a police officer and other drug related charges. None of the officers or the suspect was injured during the altercation.

July 3, 2016

A hit-and-run incident took place in the early morning at Kraemer and Alta Vista involving a stolen vehicle. The driver was located nearby and arrested for felony hit and run, felony DUI, and auto theft.

Significant Emergency Incidents

San Juan Capistrano

Traffic Collision Cut & Rescue – July 1 - At 7:22 p.m. a Traffic Collision Cut and Rescue response was dispatched to the area of Trabuco Creek east of Trabuco Canyon Road. As ground units started up the canyon Duke1 arrived over the area and began a search for the accident. Duke1 located the incident and gave the location to ground units who arrived on scene a short time later. After a quick evaluation it was determined that there were a total of five patients: one critical trauma, two moderate traumas and two Basic Life Support. Helicopter 2 arrived on scene and was unable to perform a hoist rescue due to wind conditions so they did a flat pitch landing and loaded the critical trauma and flew to Mission Hospital. Fire units from the scene were used to transport the remaining patients to the ambulance staging area at the mouth of the canyon. All units were clear of the incident by approximately 11 p.m.

Trabuco Canyon

Remote Rescue – July 2 - At 12:45 p.m. units were dispatched to a remote medical aid, located in Holy Jim Canyon. The initial report was for a male mountain biker down with a possible hip fracture on the trailhead 200 yards from the last Cabin. Helicopter 2 was dispatched with other Battalion 7 units and Duke-1 to the location. While enroute Helicopter 2 communicated with Duke on the Air to Air frequency and on 5-Alpha to coordinate the air space. Duke-1 performed search and confirmed the location of the patient while Helicopter 2 waited outside the air space waiting for Duke to complete the search. Once the patient was located by Duke, Helicopter 2 was cleared into the air space to complete the medical portion of the call. Helicopter 2 communicated to the Incident Commander Battalion 7 (Chief Pardi) the patient location and advised ground crews the best access to the patient. Due to the location of the patient, Helicopter 2 inserted the Flight Rescue Medic with ALS gear. Helicopter 2 then flew to the Plano Landing Zone and picked up USAR Truck 9 Rescuer. After the insertion of Truck 9 Rescuer, Helicopter 2 requested that Heli-Tender 41 respond to Star drive and standby for fuel after the incident. After ALS level care was completed from the Rescue Medic. One male patient was extracted by hoist with the Stokes Basket Litter into Helicopter 2. One patient and the Flight Rescuer Medic flew direct by air to Mission Hospital.

Remote Rescue – July 3 - At 12:14 p.m. a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to the area of Irvine Regional Park for the report of a horse and rider fallen from a hill. As ground units were making their way in to the area Duke1 arrived on the scene and began looking for the victim. Ground units met with the reporting party to verify the information given originally and to further clarify an accurate location of the victim. With that information Duke1 and the ground units continued to look for the victim. After a thorough check of the entire area and speaking with many people in the park it was determined that the victim had left the area.

Vegetation Fire – July 3 - At 1:18 a.m. units from Metro Net and OCFA responded to a Vegetation Fire in the area of Carbon Canyon Rd and Olinda Drive in the City of Brea. First units on scene found a large spot of annual vegetation on a steep slope involved in fire. They asked for the balance of the Medium Vegetation Fire response with the addition of a Type III Engine Strike Team. Helicopter 2 arrived over the fire and determined that the fire was making no further progress and the Type III Engine Strike Team was cancelled. Ground crews were quickly able to surround the fire and declared the fire Contained at 2:03 a.m. The Santiago Crew was continued to ensure there was a cold line around the entire fire.

Remote Rescue – July 4 - At 10:43 a.m. a report of a dehydrated elderly female 50 feet from the top of the 4 corners area of Whiting Ranch Wilderness Park was given by an off duty firefighter rendering care.
