City Recovers Majority of Funds

The City of Placentia has now recovered the majority of the public funds allegedly embezzled by its former Finance Services Manager. According to a court ruling on Friday, July 22, 2016, \$2,604,539.26 will be returned to the City of Placentia. These are funds the Orange County District Attorney's Office and the City have recovered as part of the ongoing embezzlement investigation. About \$3.16 million has now been returned to the City. In addition to these funds, the City is also processing a \$1 million crime bond insurance policy.

More than \$4 million of the \$5.16 million allegedly embezzled will be back in City coffers after the crime bond insurance policy is processed. The City continues to utilize any and all available actions to recover the remaining funds. "Placentia is grateful for the District Attorney's exhaustive work to recover and return the stolen funds to the City and taxpayers of Placentia. The recovery of the majority of funds within such a short timeframe demonstrates the power of the partnership between our two agencies. We will continue to remain steadfast in recovering the remaining stolen funds for the residents of Placentia and bring justice to those responsible," City Administrator Damien Arrula said.

Placentia's former Finance Services Manager, Michael Nguyen, is standing trial for allegedly sending a number of unauthorized wire transfers between January 27, 2014 and April 12, 2016 totaling \$5.16 million to various private accounts bypassing internal and external controls. Since discovering Nguyen's activities in April, new procedures and policies have been implemented by the City to strengthen accounting systems in a manner that far exceed government standards. In addition, a new fraud hotline has been established for reporting suspected cases of fraud, waste or abuse by the City, its employees, contractors or vendors. "Placentia is fully committed to recovering all the funds lost and restoring the public's trust in the City's business practices and operations," Mayor Jeremy Yamaguchi said. Lakeview Avenue Grade Separation Project – UPDATE

Late last week, OCTA opened the commercial loop road at the Lakeview Avenue Grade Separation Project. The loop road provides motorists traveling east and west on Orangethorpe Avenue access to Lakeview Avenue. At this time, motorists can transition only to northbound Lakeview Avenue from Orangethorpe as the bridge is still under construction. The loop road intersections are both signalized and fully operational.



OCTA is projecting that the Lakeview bridge overcrossing will be opened to traffic by February 2017 with the project completed by June 2017. Once the bridge is opened, motorists will be able to access southbound Lakeview Avenue from the loop road.'

Old Town Santa Fe Parking Permit Pilot Program Effective August 1st

Effective Monday, August 1, 2016, the Placentia Police Department Traffic Division will begin enforcement of the Old Town Parking Permit Pilot Program and issue citations to violators of the Pilot Program. The Pilot Program launched in April 2016 with a one month grace period for residents and business owners in the area to purchase permits for the Program. After further review and addressing concerns with different groups, the program was on an extended grace period until City Staff was able to meet with each of their respective groups.

The City has placed this Notice on all vehicles in the project area announcing the August 1st effective date during the week of July 18th to July 24th. We will monitor the Pilot Program for one year and provide an update to the City Council in July 2017. The City will be prorating costs based on a quarterly schedule, such that any individual who requests to purchase a permit later in the year will only be subject to paying for the remaining quarters in the year cycle. Maintenance Division

This past week our staff performed various maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests citywide. The Sign Shop repaired and replaced signs per work order requests. In addition, they installed new signs for the Terraza Community. The Patch Crew filled in pot holes on Kraemer Boulevard, Bradford Avenue and Palm Drive. The Paint Crew painted traffic legends in zones 22 and 23. The Ball Field Maintenance Crew worked on the infields at the Champions Sports Complex, Tuffree Park and Torii Hunter Field. The Facility Maintenance Crew completed work orders for City buildings including renovations for offices at City Hall and the Police Department. The Irrigation Crew repaired and replaced irrigation valves at Jefferson Street and Alta Vista Street. The Maintenance Crew cleaned the downtown area and performed weed abatement in assigned areas.

On July 27th, Public Works personnel responded to a traffic signal outage at Placentia Avenue and Orangethorpe Avenue and set up stop signs. Our contractor, West Coast Arborists will be trimming the Ficus trees on the following arterial streets: Bastanchury Road, Golden Avenue, Kraemer Boulevard, Placentia Avenue, Rose Drive and Chapman Avenue over the next few weeks.

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Building & Safety Division:

1. On July 18th, building plans for a new room addition project located at Ruby Dr. were submitted and reviewed by the Building & Safety and Planning Divisions. This project includes a new kitchen and den addition of 450 sq. ft. The cost of the construction is \$45,000.
2. On July 18th, final submittal of the Phase II of Backs Community Building Renovation Project at 201 N. Bradford Avenue was submitted to the City for final review and approval. Phase II of this project will include the following site improvements for ADA compliance: wheel chair ramp access, handicap parking spaces, signs, and guardrails.
3. On July 19th, the Building & Safety Division reviewed and approved 11 residential solar panel installation projects. The valuation of these projects range from \$25,000 to \$40,000.
4. On July 20th, building plans for a demolition project of an existing mono-palm structure located at 909 E. Yorba Linda Blvd. were reviewed and approved Building & Safety Division. The cause of this demolition is due to new higher mono-palm structures were built. The cost of this project is \$24,000.
5. On July 20th, architectural plans for the Police Department Lobby and Restrooms Renovation project were approved. The scope of work includes new restrooms to be in compliance with current ADA requirements.
