Anaheim Sustainability Center

The City recently received notice that the City of Anaheim is currently considering allowing a company to build and operate an organic waste to energy facility located at 1300-1322 North Lakeview Avenue which borders the Placentia City Limits. The proposed project is an organic waste-to-energy facility that would use anaerobic digester technology to convert organic waste to biogas. This biogas would then be used to generate electricity for onsite needs and for sale to the City of Anaheim's electric utility. The organic waste would include food waste, green yard waste and some mixed solid waste. This material would be sorted and processed at an existing refuse transfer station owned and operated by Republic Services in the City of Anaheim and then transported to the energy facility to be used as fuel for the anaerobic digesters.

An environmental review has been conducted by the project applicant and the related documents are currently open for public review and comment. Placentia City staff have been reviewing the environmental documents as well as the proposed project to determine what the potential impacts this facility could pose for Placentia residents and businesses. The public comment period concludes on August 15th and the City will be submitting its comments and concerns to the City of Anaheim relative to the environmental impacts this project could present to Placentia. City staff also continue to examine the potential benefits, if any, this project could provide to the Placentia community.

Any public comments regarding the environmental document must be received by the City of Anaheim no later than August 15th, 2016, in order for those comments to be incorporated into the record. Those comments can be emailed directly to: ggonzalez@anaheim.net. All comments received must also be reviewed and responded to by the project applicant. This project will be presented to the Anaheim Planning Commission for its review and considering on August 22, 2016, at 5:00 p.m. The location of the meeting is: 200 S. Anaheim Boulevard, Anaheim, CA. The public is encouraged to attend the Anaheim Planning Commission meeting to raise any concerns this project may have on their respective communities.

General Municipal Election – November 8, 2016

The General Municipal Election for the City of Placentia will take place on Tuesday, November 8th, 2016 for the purpose of filling 3 seats on the City Council and 1 City Treasurer position. Significant Increase in West Nile Virus Infected Mosquitoes Found in Orange County

The Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District has seen a significant increase in mosquitoes infected by the West Nile Virus. The Vector Control District has confirmed the first mosquito sample infected with West Nile virus (WNV) in the City of Placentia.

The mosquitoes were collected in a mosquito trap from a residential neighborhood near Tuffree Hill Park last week (8/3/2016).

Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District crew members will be deployed to post the area, alert residents to the detection of WNV, and recommend preventative measures they can take to protect themselves and their families from mosquitoes and WNV.



At this time, the City advises, along with OC Mosquito and Vector Control, that all residents, park guests, sports leagues, and outdoor event attendees take precautions and wear mosquito repellents when mosquitoes are most active (dawn or dusk).

The Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District makes the following recommendations to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes:

- Eliminate any standing water around your home or office.
- Make sure all window and door screens on your house are in good repair.
- Wear a repellent containing DEET, Picaridin, Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus, or IR 3535.
- Contact the Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District to report dead birds or neglected pools.

These fields are now looking great and will offer the best and safest possible playing experience for the young athletes of our community.




PUBLIC WORKS

Landscape Improvements at Placentia Civic Center

As part of the City's commitment to water conservation during this historic drought, this week Public Works crews started removing the turf grass from six small median islands located within the Civic Center Parking Lot. The turf grass will be replaced with low-water usage plant materials, new trees and a drip irrigation system. These efforts will reduce water consumption, as well as irrigation and maintenance costs. The City Council also allocated \$80,000 in FY 2016-17 to renovate existing turf grass medians throughout the City with low water usage plant materials and drip irrigation. Current drought restrictions imposed by the State has precluded the City from watering the turf in those medians for over a year and those restrictions are expected to remain permanent.

Maintenance Division

This past week our staff performed various maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests citywide. The Sign Shop repaired and replaced signs per work order requests. In addition, they installed new signs for the Terraza Community. The Patch Crew filled in pot holes on La Jolla Street, Golden Avenue and Chapman Avenue. The Paint Crew painted traffic legends in zones 25. The Ball Field Maintenance Crew worked on the infields at the Sports Complex, Tuffree Park and Torii Hunter Field. The Facility Maintenance Crew completed work orders for City buildings including renovations for offices at City Hall and the Police Department. The Irrigation Crew repaired and replaced irrigation valves at City Hall for new drought tolerant plant material. The Maintenance Crew cleaned the downtown area and performed weed abatement in assigned areas. On August 6, Public Works personnel performed pest control spraying at all city buildings.

Our contractor, West Coast Arborists will be trimming the Ficus vines on the following arterial streets: Bastanchury Road, Golden Avenue, Kraemer Boulevard, Placentia Avenue, Rose Drive and Chapman Avenue over the next few weeks.

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Building & Safety Division:

1. On August 1st, the Building & Safety and Planning division approved building plans and structural calculations for a cell site renovation project located at 700 Trumpet Avenue. The scope of work includes installing new micro-electronic chips and antennas onto the existing cell tower. The estimated cost of construction is \$93,000.
2. On August 2nd, the Building & Safety and Planning division reviewed and approved architectural and building plans for a residential remodeling project located at Garfield Avenue. This project includes kitchen remodeling, interior wall relocation, higher ceilings as well as new electrical, plumbing and mechanical fixtures. The cost of the construction is 20,000.
3. On August 2nd, the Building & Safety and Planning division reviewed and approved building plans for a tenant improvement project located at 1290 Kraemer Boulevard. The new tenant will be opening a barber shop. The project includes new interior partition walls, restrooms with ADA compliance; and new plumbing, electrical, mechanical fixtures. The cost of the construction is \$60,000.
4. On August 3rd, the Building & Safety Division reviewed and approved solar panel installation plans and structural reports for 16 residential homes. These projects are for single family detached homes. The construction valuation ranges from \$18,000- \$42,000.
5. On August 3rd, the Building & Safety and Planning division approved plans for a room addition for a residential home at Browerwoods Place. The scope of work is to convert an existing car tandem garage into a bedroom. The cost of construction is \$25,000.

The County of Orange Grand Jury that was empaneled on July 1, visited the Orange County Fire Authority RFOTC on August 11. The group toured the facility and had an opportunity for a question and answer session with the Fire Chief and Executive Management.

OCFA featured week four of a planned series of social media campaigns aimed at highlighting our Air Ops division. A video highlighting the rescue capabilities of our helo's was posted on Facebook yesterday and will be reposted via other social media platforms today. OCFA partnered with the American Red Cross, the City of San Clemente, San Clemente CERT, and community volunteers for a smoke alarm installation event at the Shorecliffs Terrace Mobile Home Park, a senior manufactured home community in San Clemente. The event took place on Saturday, August 6 from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. A total of 210 smoke alarms and 86 carbon monoxide alarms were installed in 93 homes, and all residents received information on fire safety and home escape plans.
