Project Update on Proposed Anaheim Sustainability Center

The project applicant, Anaheim Energy, LLC, has notified the City of Anaheim that it has elected to pursue the preparation of a full Environmental Impact Report (EIR) in conjunction with the proposed project. Although the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) that had been prepared for the project is an acceptable level of environmental review per the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the City of Anaheim will honor the applicant's request and take the steps necessary to initiate the EIR process. Because of this change, the project's anticipated September 7, 2016 public hearing will be rescheduled to a future date as the preparation of an EIR involves additional steps that will extend the public hearing process. In addition, the previously-noticed August 15 deadline by which to provide comments on the Mitigated Negative Declaration is no longer applicable as the EIR will be subject to a separate public review and comment process.

Although the applicant has indicated a desire to pursue the preparation of an EIR, the Anaheim Planning Department staff still intends to hold the Planning Commission **public workshop** scheduled for **August 22, 2016**. The purpose of the workshop is to share project information with the Planning Commission and attending members of the public in advance of a future public hearing date. Additional information on the environmental review process to follow will also be discussed. Members of the public who wish to attend the workshop will have an opportunity to share comments during the Public Comment section of the agenda which will follow the workshop. A notice will immediately be mailed to all property owners and residents within 2,500 feet of the project site, informing them of the upcoming August 22 workshop and the applicant's request to commence preparation of an EIR. PUBLIC WORKS

Maintenance Division

This past week our staff performed various maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests citywide. The Sign Shop repaired and replaced signs per work order requests. The Patch Crew filled in pot holes on La Jolla Street, Golden Avenue and Chapman Avenue. The Paint Crew painted traffic legends in zones 26 and 27. The Ball Field Maintenance Crew worked on the infields at the Sports Complex, Tuffree Park and Torii Hunter Field. The Facility Maintenance Crew completed work orders for City buildings including renovations for offices at City Hall and the Police Department. The Irrigation Crew repaired and replaced irrigation valves at City Hall for new drought tolerant plant material. The Maintenance Crew cleaned the downtown area and performed weed abatement in assigned areas. In addition, they are planting new drought plant material at City Hall in the main parking lot medians.



On August 11th, Public Works personnel responded after hours to lock the doors at the Placentia Champions Sports Complex. On August 12th, the Public Works personnel assisted West Coast Arborists (WCA) in the grinding the tree stumps at the City Hall Parking Lot. WCA will be trimming the Ficus vines on the following arterial streets: Bastanchury Road, Golden Avenue, Kraemer Boulevard, Placentia Avenue, Rose Drive and Chapman Avenue over the next few weeks. DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Building & Safety Division:

1. On August 8th, the Building & Safety and Planning divisions reviewed and approved building plans and structural analysis for a residential project located at Cambridge. This project includes a family room expansion, remodeling of existing roof framing structure, as well as new electrical and plumbing fixtures. The cost of the construction is \$40,000.
2. On August 8th, a Use Permit application for new motorcycle trailer manufacturing operation business at 1672 Sierra Madre Circle was submitted for review and comment. The business owner will be doing extensive tenant improvements to create a facility for his manufacturing business which includes welding.
3. On August 9th, the Building & Safety and Planning divisions building tenant improvement plans for an industrial building located at 1900 Nancita Circle. The scope of work is to replace an



existing outdoor dust collecting system with a new 51' high new collecting system. The cost of the construction is \$75,000.

4. On August 10th, the Building & Safety Division reviewed and approved architectural and building plans for a tenant improvement project of an existing restaurant located at 127 E. Yorba Linda (Rubio's). The scope of work includes new restrooms in compliance with ADA regulations, a new seating floor plan as well as new electrical and plumbing systems in compliance with new green energy regulations. The cost of the construction is \$85,000.
5. On August 10th, the Building & Safety Division reviewed structural plans and detail analysis for a fire damaged residential home located at Michel Place. The project includes the removal and replacement of damaged roof framing, walls, and electrical and mechanical fixtures. The cost of the construction is \$75,000.

Due to the size of the structure, reports of arching on three floors, and light smoke observed on the third floor, Battalion 5 balanced the incident to a working structure fire.
