Free Seasonal Flu Shots

Free seasonal flu shots for adults and children three years of age and older will be offered at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (LDS) located at **210 Livingston Avenue** as part of a continuing series of emergency preparedness exercises. Vaccinations will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis between **11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Friday, October 14, 2016.**

Both drive through and walk up flu shot locations will be offered. To receive a flu shot, participants should be feeling well on the day of the flu shot and must complete a brief health screening to ensure they can safely receive a flu vaccine. "We appreciate the opportunity to partner with the Orange County Health Care Agency and other community partners," said City Administrator Damien Arrula. "The event will help improve our capabilities to respond to a large scale event while offering free flu shots to our community."

Update on the Proposed Anaergia Organic Waste to Energy Facility

Anaergia is proposing to build and manage an organic waste to energy facility on Lakeview Avenue in the City of Anaheim, which is just outside the Placentia City boundary line. Anaergia has opted to conduct a site-specific Environmental Impact Report (EIR) in lieu of a Mitigated Negative Declaration as previously purposed. The City of Placentia has yet to receive the Notice of Preparation (NOP) for the project. The NOP provides the public with the first opportunity to provide comments on the initial preparation of the Environmental Impact Report. Those comments help identify specific environmental issues and other areas of concerns the



Environmental Impact Report should analyze in-depth. Staff plans to provide comments to the City of Anaheim once the NOP has been issued. Once the City receives the NOP, we will post the information on our website for the community to view and or comment.

In the meantime, City Council and City Staff are working to organize a tour of a similar organic waste to energy facility in the City of Chino. In addition, we are working with the City of Anaheim to facilitate a Community Workshop on the proposed Anaergia facility and to hear the community's concerns. Once the Community Workshop has been scheduled, we will notify Placentia residents on the date and location of the workshop.

At 10:09 a.m. Police Officers responded to a report of shots fired in the parking lot of El Camino High School. The school was instructed to activate lockdown protocols and numerous officers responded to the campus. After securing the school grounds and searching each classroom, the shooting was determined to be unfounded. Detectives remained on campus to investigate what turned out to be a gang-related vandalism.

September 30, 2016

An assault with a deadly weapon occurred in the 1600 block of Sierra Vista. The named suspect fled the location prior to officer's arrival. The victim was transported to Placentia Linda Hospital for moderate facial injuries. Detectives were notified and responded, investigation on ongoing.

September 30, 2016

At approximately 2:16 a.m., Police Officers received a call of shots fired in the 500 block of W. La Jolla Street. Upon arrival, officers located two unoccupied vehicles and a residence that were struck by gunfire. After conducting a thorough search of the area, one shell casing was found and there were no injuries to the residents inside the house. Officers were unable to locate any gunshot victims and a HEARS broadcast was made. HEARS is a hospital alert broadcast system to assist both police and emergency medical personnel.

A [Red Flag Warning](#) has been issued for the Santa Ana Mountains and Inland Orange County through 3 p.m. Saturday. Any fires that develop could spread rapidly due to these conditions. Orange County Fire Authority has increased staffing in anticipation of a Santa Ana Wind event. This up-staffing includes a hand crew, a second helicopter, and a water tender.

In recognition of National Fire Prevention Week, OCFA staff and board members will be taking part in the following activities.

- On October 8 and 9, five California Fallen Firefighters will be honored at the National Memorial Service in Emmitsburg, Maryland. The five firefighters will include OCFA fallen firefighter Greg Hennessey. Assistant Chief Mike Schroeder, Captain Daryll Millot, OCFA Board Chair Gene Hernandez, Vice-Chair Beth Swift and former Board Chair Al Murray will be attending the event.
