### Free Seasonal Flu Shots

Free seasonal flu shots for adults and children three years of age and older will be offered at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (LDS) located at **210 Livingston Avenue** as part of a continuing series of emergency preparedness exercises. Vaccinations will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis between **11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Friday, October 14, 2016.**

Both drive through and walk up flu shot locations will be offered. To receive a flu shot, participants should be feeling well on the day of the flu shot and must complete a brief health screening to ensure they can safely receive a flu vaccine. "We appreciate the opportunity to partner with the Orange County Health Care Agency and other community partners," said City Administrator Damien Arrula. "The event will help improve our capabilities to respond to a large scale event while offering free flu shots to our community."

The event would not be possible without community partnerships, including: the Orange County HealthCare Agency (OCHCA), Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA), Orange County Medical Reserve Corps, the City of Placentia and the Placentia Police Department, Placentia Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), Placentia Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services (RACES), Saddleback College, Stanbridge College, West Coast University, Cal State Fullerton and the LDS Church. As part of the ongoing Kraemer Boulevard Traffic Signal Synchronization Project, OCTA's contractor will be moving the traffic signal cabinet at the intersection of Chapman and Kraemer to a temporary location so that a new pedestal foundation and cabinet can be constructed. This will require taking the signal offline completely for several hours and will result in the intersection being placed on a four-way stop for approximately four hours on Friday, October 14<sup>th</sup>. The intersection will be taken offline after 9 a.m. to avoid morning rush hour traffic and the work should be completed within four hours.

This past week our staff performed various maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests citywide. OCFA [hosted a memorial highway sign dedication ceremony](#) for fallen firefighter Kevin Woyjeck on October 13. Kevin was one of the 19 hotshot firefighters killed while fighting a wildfire in Yarnell, Arizona on June 30, 2013. The event was emceed by Division Chief Ken Cruz and Fire Chief Jeff Bowman provided the welcoming remarks. California Assemblymember Travis Allen (R-Huntington Beach) addressed the crowd and provided an overview of how the sign dedication was initiated in Kevin's honor. OCFA Board Chair Gene Hernandez, OCFA Vice Chair Beth Swift, OCFA Board Members David Sloan and Shelly Hasselbrink attended the event, along with other dignitaries and a crowd of about 200 people. Firefighters from Los Angeles County Fire (LACF), Long Beach Fire, and OCFA were in attendance to support LACF Captain Joe Woyjeck, father of Kevin Woyjeck. Video and pictures of the event will be in next week's summary.

On October 15, Assistant Chief Dave Thomas and Division Chief Ken Cruz will attend the [14<sup>th</sup> Annual California Firefighters Memorial Ceremony](#) at the CA Firefighters Memorial in Capitol Park, Sacramento. OCFA fallen firefighter Greg Hennessey's name will be placed on a memorial wall which includes the name of every firefighter (more than 1,300) who has died in the line of duty since 1850.
