City Practices Emergency Response through Point of Dispensing Exercise

On Friday, October 14, 2016, the City of Placentia conducted a Point of Dispensing (POD) Exercise at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (LDS) located at **210 Livingston Avenue** as part of a continuing series of emergency preparedness exercises. The POD Site included both drive through and walk up dispensing options of the seasonal flu vaccine. Vaccines were free to any community member that attended the event between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. A total of approximately 175 participants were inoculated without incident. The exercise will help improve our capabilities as a City and community to respond to a large scale incident where mass distribution of a vaccine or commodity would be required.

The event would not be possible without community partnerships which included the Orange County HealthCare Agency (OCHCA), Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA), Orange County Medical Reserve Corps, the City of Placentia and the Placentia Police Department, Placentia Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), Placentia Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services (RACES), Saddleback College, Stanbridge College, West Coast University, Cal State Fullerton and the LDS Church. The Great California ShakeOut

Recognition of Rylen Jones for Heroic Lifesaving Actions



At the October 4th City Council Meeting, Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) Battalion Chief Michael Blawn presented Placentia resident Rylen Jones with a Certificate of Merit for his brave acts and heroic actions that led to saving the life of his grandmother. While playing video games at his grandmother's home and hearing a noise coming from another room, Rylen quickly discovered that his grandmother had fallen unconscious and was unresponsive. He immediately called 9-1-1 and talked to the dispatcher in a calm manner and waited for the first responders to arrive. He

took it upon himself to initiate CPR on his grandmother. Once first responders arrived, they elevated her cardiac arrest and immediately transported her to the hospital. Due to Rylen's swift ability to assess the situation, stay calm, and act, he was able to save his grandmother's life. Mayor Jeremy Yamaguchi also presented Rylen a recognition plaque on behalf of the City for his brave and heroic actions.
