## Placentia's General Municipal Election

The City of Placentia's General Municipal Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup> for the purpose of filling three (3) seats on City Council, one (1) City Treasurer position, and Measure NN, which if passed, would establish five (5) equal, geographically based districts from which council members may be elected by residents of those districts to serve a four (4) year term.



Early in-person voting is available between October 29<sup>th</sup> and November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Please visit the City's website [www.placentia.org](http://www.placentia.org) or the Orange County Registrar of Voters website at [www.ocvote.com](http://www.ocvote.com) for more information on the locations for early voting.

On Election Day, the polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. On the night of the Election, the Registrar of Voters tabulates all the ballots in the Registrar of Voters Tally Center located in Santa Ana. The Registrar of Voters posts unofficial results throughout the evening of the election beginning at approximately 8:15 p.m. and continuing to update periodically until they have tallied all precinct ballots. Unofficial results can be viewed on the City's website or the Registrar of Voters website the night of the election. ### Airbag Recall Outreach

The California Office of Traffic Safety, California Highway Patrol, California Department of Motor Vehicles and Bureau of Automotive Repair are working together to urge Californians who own certain 2001-2003 Honda and Acura vehicles to immediately take their cars to an authorized dealer for repair of potentially deadly Takata airbag inflators and we need your help to get the word out. Certain vehicles, equipped with Takata Airbags are currently being recalled nationwide.

Customers are being urged to go to the NHTSA website (<https://vinrcl.safercar.gov/vin/>) and enter the vehicles Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) to see if their vehicle is included in this recall. VIN numbers can also be checked through the OTS website (<http://www.ots.ca.gov>). If the vehicle is included, they are to immediately contact their nearest dealer and schedule an appointment to have the vehicle repaired for free. ### Maintenance Division

This past week our staff performed various maintenance activities throughout the City. The Graffiti Crew removed graffiti per work order requests citywide. The Sign Shop repaired and replaced signs per work order requests on Penbroke Avenue and York Avenue. The Patch Crew filled in pot holes on arterial streets Golden Avenue, Bastanchury Road and Kraemer Boulevard. The Paint Crew painted yellow school legends citywide. The Ball Field Maintenance Crew worked on the infields at the Sports Complex, Tuffree Park and Torii Hunter Field. The Facility Maintenance Crew completed work orders for City buildings including renovations for offices at City Hall. The Irrigation Crew repaired and replaced irrigation valves and black flow device on Chapman Median Island. The Maintenance crews cleaned the downtown area and performed weed abatement in assigned areas.

## DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

### Building, Safety and Planning Division

1. On October 26th, the Planning and Building divisions reviewed and approved tenant improvement plans for an existing cell site (AT&T) at 1849 N. Kraemer Boulevard. The scope of work includes replacing existing electrical cabinets; and installing a new service antenna and battery systems. The cost of the construction is \$20,000.
2. On October 25th, the Development Services Department received residential room addition and remodeling plans for two existing residential units at 206 S. Melrose Street. The scope of work includes adding a new attached two-car garage to the existing 2nd unit; a new room addition for the primary house; and interior remodeling for both existing units. The cost of the construction is \$117,000.
3. On October 24th, the Development Services Department received tenant improvement plans for a new sandwich restaurant (Jersey Mike's) located at 850 N. Rose Drive, Suite #C. The scope of work includes new kitchen facilities, new seating area, electrical, mechanical and plumbing fixtures. The cost of the construction is approximately \$115,000.
4. The Development Services Department received room addition plans and structural calculations for a single family home located at Hamer Drive. The scope of work involves enlarging two (2) bedrooms and interior renovations. The cost of construction is \$65,000.
5. The Planning and Building divisions reviewed and approved a home located at Eve Circle. The scope of work includes remodeling existing kitchen, adding a nook, demolishing existing patio cover and building a new patio cover. The cost of the construction is \$150,000.

#### October 26, 2016



[Working smoke alarms](#) can alert people to a fire before it spreads, giving everyone enough time to get out. Your smoke alarm can't save you if it doesn't work. If you have the new 10-year lithium battery alarms, you still need to test them once a month. Press to test!
