Fireworks Safety

Each year in the United States, more than 10,000 people suffer eye injuries and burns from fireworks. Annually, three thousand fires are caused by fireworks, and most of these incidents are related to the use of illegal fireworks, as well as state-approved fireworks that are lit by non-professionals. Some relevant nationwide firework-related injury statistics:

- Since 2003, 45% of persons injured from fireworks are children 14 years and younger.
- Children ages 5 to 9 years have the highest injury rate involving fireworks.
- Sparklers are associated with the most injuries involving children under the age of 5.
- Sparklers can reach temperatures of more than 1000°F.

In an effort to reduce both accidental fires and fireworks-related injuries, the City's Police Department will be working in conjunction with the Orange County Fire Authority to enforce the relevant laws on July 4th, and the days around this holiday. Violations of the City's municipal code are punishable by a fine up to \$1,000 or imprisonment up to 1 year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. The Police Department will enforce a zero tolerance policy on the use and possession of any fireworks.

47th Annual Heritage

Festival and Parade

Save the Date! On October 15, 2011 the City of Placentia will celebrate "A Blast from Our Past" at the 47th Annual Heritage Festival. The day will begin with the Chamber of Commerce Pancake Breakfast from 6:30 a.m. – 10:00 a.m. at Tri-City Park. The Parade will begin at 9:30 a.m. and travel from Morse Avenue north on Kraemer to Tri-City Park. The parade will feature over 200 parade entries including bands, marching groups, VIPs, clowns, and non-profit organizations. Parade bands will be judged prior to entering the parade line-up at the Band Review held on Palm Avenue. Band Review judging will begin at 9:00 a.m. The Heritage Festival will follow the parade and will be held at Tri-City Park, located on Kraemer Boulevard at Golden Avenue. The festival will be open from 10:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. with entertainment featuring DJ music, roving entertainers and a variety of "Specialty Areas." The Game Area will showcase jugglers, mimes, clowns, giant inflatable activities, slot car racing, face painting and a balloon animal artist. The Food Court Area will serve a variety of taste tempting treats including Mexican food, pizza, baked goods, kettle corn, Hawaiian food, ice cream, desserts and much more. The Chamber of Commerce Business Expo Area will showcase local businesses with opportunities to meet and gain knowledge from local entrepreneurs. The Craft Fair Area will have over 40 vendors stocked with plenty of handmade items for purchase. The Non-Profit Area will highlight local organizations distributing information about the services they provide for our city. The Car Show Area will feature over 200 antique, custom, hot rod and classic cars on display; boats will also be displayed. FREE Used Oil Collection

Don't pollute the environment by dumping used oil illegally. The City offers Free Collection of engine, transmission and gear oil, plastic motor oil bottles, oil filters, and oil rags from the convenience of your home with a simple phone call to (800) 449-7587.

Code Enforcement

The City actively enforces the Placentia Municipal Code through the Code Enforcement Division within the Development Services Department. The Division includes one full-time Code Enforcement Officer and two part-time positions. The mission of the Code Enforcement Division is to enforce the Placentia Municipal Code fairly and effectively to maintain the property standards set forth by the City Council.

Examples of items often reported to Code Enforcement include trash cans left out on the street after the collection day; recreational vehicles and trailers parked in the front setback; property maintenance items; illegal building activity and garage conversions; and, inoperative vehicles in a driveway.

There are multiple ways to contact Code Enforcement to report a possible code violation. The first is to call the division at (714) 993-8124. Second, you may go to the City's website at www.placentia.org and click on the "At Your Service" button located on the left side of the web page. This system allows you to track the response to any code complaint. Finally, you may stop by City Hall or send a letter with attention to "Code Enforcement."

The vast majority of violations are reported to Code Enforcement by residents. Generally, Code Enforcement staff do not drive the City looking for code violations in a pro-active manner. As such, enforcement is typically referred to as "re-active." However, if a Code Enforcement Officer is responding to a complaint and there are similar violations to the complaint evident in the immediate area, those property owners will receive a Courtesy Notice as well. This re-active/pro-active response seeks to educate nearby property owners and also prevents counter complaints because one may feel 'singled out' for a specific violation.

First and foremost, Code Enforcement seeks to educate residents about the codes and how to avoid potential violations. For all violations except those that are a threat to immediate health and safety, Code Enforcement will issue a Courtesy Notice. A Courtesy Notice is simply a notice to the property owner that a violation exists and a timeline to correct the violation is provided, typically up to 21 days from the notice. Historically, over 75% of all code violations are resolved through the Courtesy Notice process. If a violation is not corrected, an Administrative Citation is issued and the fine is \$100 for each violation. This fine can increase to \$200 and \$500 for each violation if not resolved within the given timeline. Code Enforcement staff seek to work with property owners on resolution and can provide time extensions on resolving violations. Additionally, Code Enforcement refers some owners to social service providers if they need assistance in resolving a violation. An example of this is an elderly property owner unable to maintain their property. While the best resolution would be for neighbors to assist such an individual, the City can refer and sometimes assist a person through grant funds if available.

Ultimately, Code Enforcement activities and the reduction of property maintenance violations better the community, prevent the loss of property values and improves neighborhood quality. Pool Safety

Drowning accidents are the leading cause of injury/deaths among children under five. More than 80 percent of the drowning occur in residential backyard pools and spas. To help avoid such a tragedy, please read the following pool safety tips:

1. Pools should be fenced from the rest of the house. Fences should be five feet high.
2. The areas around the pool should be free of objects which could aid children climbing over the fence.
3. Gates should be self-closing and self-latching, opening outward away from the pool.
4. A gate latch should be placed at the top of the gate and be inaccessible from the outside by small children.
5. All doors and windows leading to the pool should be secured and locked at all times.
*Doggie doors are also an access point to consider
6. Remember pool covers, gates and other layers of protection do not replace adult supervision.
7. Keep a telephone outside the pool area. Post the 9-1-1 emergency number on the phone.
8. Designate an adult Water Watcher to supervise the pool/spa area, especially during social gatherings. CALL FOR YOUR FREE "WATER WATCHER" TAG: (714) 532-8887. This highly visible tag to be worn by your Water Watcher contains lifesaving emergency instructions.

Note: Consider hiring a Life Guard for family parties and gatherings.

Crime Prevention materials and information will be on display, and distributed by Neighborhood Watch, and Police Crime Prevention. ALERT OC – Disaster Information System

The City of Placentia has launched the web-based subscription service AlertOC to provide realtime information to affected communities in emergency situations. A distinct feature of AlertOC is the ability to register more than one contact method to a specific address, thus enabling landlines, cell phones and e-mail addresses to be incorporated into a single notification system. Visitors to www.AlertOC.com may register their contact information and receive time-sensitive communications from the City in the event of a natural disaster or emergency, such as evacuation orders. When there is an event requiring community action, authorized officials record a voice, e-mail or text message that is delivered rapidly to affected individuals. During an emergency incident, AlertOC has the ability to send three million 60-second voice messages, two million e-mails and 360,000 text messages per hour. Community Center and Park Improvement Projects

The City has recently embarked on several improvement projects at Community Centers and Parks to improve services to the community. The Edwin T. Powell Building located at 143 S. Bradford Avenue was recently renovated improving ADA accessibility including floors and entryways, repairing the Patio and creating additional usable space and building a new computer area. The Edwin T. Powell Building had a Grand Re-Opening ceremony in April 2011 and will continue to serve as the City's Senior Center and the new site for the Cathy Torrez Learning Center. Kramer Park located at 201 N. Bradford Avenue Improvement Project began construction this spring and includes a new restroom facility, basketball and volleyball courts, and landscape improvements. The Kramer Park Improvements will be completed this summer. The Gomez Community Center located at 1701 Atwood Avenue will also undergo renovations including upgrading restrooms, flooring, windows, doors, and adding almost an extra 1,000 sq ft of space to the facility for community events and programs. Construction for the Gomez Community Center project will be completed before the end of the year. Future plans have also been developed for Tri-City Park located at 2301 N. Kraemer Blvd. After several community meetings a master plan has been developed that includes new walking and bike trails, lake and landscape improvements, and development of a community facility.

The prices are cheap with hardcover fiction titles setting you back \$2.75 a copy. Titles published within the last year cost a little more. Want a cookbook on vegan food? How about a translation dictionary or book of crossword puzzles or Sudoku? Books like these are often a buck or less. There are literally thousands of paperbacks of every variety to accompany you on your next flight or bedside reading. Pick up a title in an airport gift shop and spend about 10 bucks. At the Friends Bookstore you can get 5 paperbacks for a dollar and it's not hard to find popular titles. A selection of children's books is a buck a bag with other titles priced at about a dollar. I saw a complete encyclopedia Britannica set for five dollars! If you don't mind an outdated format Video cassette movies are 4 for a dollar with lots of Disney titles and blockbusters of yesteryear to choose from. While you're at it, grab a book on CD for your next road trip or commute to work.

On every 2nd Sunday books are moved to the back loading dock area for a big outdoor sale. Here you can rummage through all the titles grabbing your personal favorites. All proceeds go to the Library with the aim of supporting the many programs offered so your business goes for a great cause.

Learn To Swim Program

The City of Placentia Learn-To-Swim Program offers swimming instruction for youth ages nine months through twelve years. All Water Safety Instructors are trained and certified by the American Red Cross. The program is offered at Valencia High School and at El Dorado High School.

Registration Information

Learn-To-Swim program registration begins at the Summer Recreation Program Kick-off event on Saturday, May 21 at Placentia City Hall. Only Placentia residents will be permitted to register on this day. A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN MUST BE PRESENT TO REGISTER A CHILD. Proof of residency (i.e. driver's license, state issued ID card, or recent utility bill) must be provided to be eligible to register. Registration numbers will be handed out on a first-come, first-served basis beginning at 7:00 a.m. Registration will begin at 9:00 a.m. and continues until 12:00 p.m. **Proof of age is required at the time of registration for new program participants. (Birth certificate).**

Big Fish, Lil Fish 9 mos. to 3 yrs.

A basic water orientation class for tots and their parents. The child and parent work on skills together in the water such as: water adjustment, blowing bubbles, kicking, holding onto the wall, floating on back, water entry and exit, face submergence, and safety skills. A parent is required to accompany each child.

Tiny Tots 3 to 5 yrs.

A class for preschoolers who have very little to no aquatic experience. Fun and safety are emphasized while learning necessary swimming skills: water entry & exit, face submergence, blowing bubbles, water adjustment, treading water, kicking, exploring arm movements and safety skills.

Level 1 5 to 12 yrs.

A class for children who have very little to no aquatic experience. Fun and safety are emphasized while learning necessary swimming skills; water entry & exit, bobbing, face submergence, blowing bubbles, water adjustment, floating on front and back, kicking and arm movements, retrieval of submerged objects and safety skills.

Level 2 5 to 12 yrs.

Prereq.: Participant must be able to demonstrate the following without assistance; safely enter and exit the water, float on front and back with support, submerge face and exhale underwater.

A class for children who are comfortable being in the water. Class teaches: entry by stepping or jumping from side, bobbing, head submergence and holding breath, floating on front & back, treading water using arm and leg actions, rhythmic breathing, arm and leg stroke combination, and safety skills.

Level 3 5 to 12 yrs.

Prereq.: Float on front for 5 seconds, rollover to a back float, return to starting position, push off and swim using a combination of arm and leg actions for 15 ft. on both front and back.

This class will teach jumping into deep water, head-first entry from sitting or kneeling position, submerge and retrieve an object, rhythmic breathing, front and back glide, back float, water adjustment in deep water, treading water, front and back crawl, introduction to butterfly, flutter, dolphin and scissors kicks and safety skills.

Level 4 5 to 12 yrs.

Prereq.: Jump into chest deep water from side, swim front crawl for 15 yds. with face in water and rhythmic breathing pattern, maintain position by treading or floating for 30 seconds and swim back crawl for 15 yds.

Class will focus on: various entry techniques, swimming underwater, changing direction and position, treading water using specific kicking techniques, review of front and back crawl, breaststroke, butterfly, and elementary backstroke, introduction to scissors kick, flutter and dolphin kicks, and additional safety skills.

Level 5 5 to 12 yrs.

Prereq.: Perform a feet-first entry into chest-deep water, swim front crawl and back crawl for 25 yards each, maintain position on back 1 minute in deep water, swim elementary backstroke and breaststroke 15 yards each, tread water for 1 min.

Class will focus on shallow angle & pike dives, flip turns, underwater swimming, review of all strokes, and safety skills including survival swimming and rescue breathing.

Public Recreation Swim

The City of Placentia offers FREE recreation swim at Gomez Community Pool and at Whitten Community Pool. Children seven years and under must be accompanied by an adult in a swimsuit and must be within arm's reach at all times. Flotation devices are NOT allowed during recreation swim.

Pools open June 27 and remain open through August 18.


