Overview of the State of the City Address

The Placentia Chamber of Commerce hosted Mayor Craig Green's State of the City Address on **Thursday, March 23rd**, at the Alta Vista Country Club. Mayor Craig Green's theme for the event was "We're Getting Better & We're Moving Forward." Mayor Green discussed our vital partnership with the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) to design and construct the upcoming Metro link Station and Parking Structure. This monumental project is scheduled to break ground in April of 2018. Mayor Green also discussed our partnership with the County of Orange, Mercy Housing and New Directions to construct the Placentia Veterans Village, a permanent supportive housing development for homeless or disabled military veterans. Mayor Green shared the importance of citizen involvement, economic development opportunities, successful grant awards, new businesses, and our fiscal sustainability efforts. Overview of Placentia's Free Dental Clinic Event for Elementary School Students

On **Saturday, March 25th** a Free Dental Clinic was held at Melrose Elementary School at Oberle Gymnasium for the children in the La Jolla neighborhood and those that attend Melrose Elementary School. This event was sponsored by the Placentia Rotary Club and Rotary International. The program was coordinated by Placentia Rotary Past President Kevin Padilla and Newport Beach Rotary Club member Steve Bender. They coordinated the event with dentists and students from the USC Dental School. The event was also coordinated and supported by the Placentia Yorba Linda Unified School District. Councilmember and Rotarian Ward Smith volunteered and assisted in the event as well.



On the day of the event, there were 10 dentists, 40 dental students and several members of Placentia Rotary on hand to handle the operation and logistics. The students arrived at 7:00 a.m. and by 7:45, registrations were well under way. The students were greeted by the Melrose Elementary School Principal, Cynthia Alvarez and the school nurses.

The students were examined and some with little or no issues went straight to cleaning while others went on to further evaluation and x-rays. Those that needed work done were then sent to an operative area which had some 16 to 18 stations in which to see patients. There the students under the supervision of the dentists themselves bonded teeth, drilled and filled cavities and even did several tooth extractions.

There were 110 kids that had been signed up for event and the clinic saw 97 children by the days end. While not an exact number yet, it is estimated that there was in excess of \$45,000 dollars worth of FREE dental service and materials provided to the residents in the neighborhood and community.




Veterans Monument Community-Wide Fundraiser

Gas Station Development

On December 13, 2016, the Planning Commission approved a Use Permit to permit the operation of a self-service, unmanned gas station at 480 S. Placentia Avenue. The City of Placentia owns the property upon which Galaxy Oil is proposing to operate the service station. This project will generate an annual royalty payments which fluctuate depending on the volume of fuel sold, it is anticipated that this project will generate \$200,000 to \$350,000 in General Fund revenue annually for the City. Currently, grading is occurring at the site in conformance with approved Grading Plans, and Building Plans have been submitted for plan check.
