

Remote Rescue – March 30- A person under the influence of drugs was reported at the top of Mathis Trail inside Aliso Woods Canyon at 1:49 p.m. A remote rescue was dispatched and Battalion 4 established Aliso Canyon Incident Command at 2 p.m. Park Rangers and Laguna Beach Fire arrived onscene where LAB Division 2 confirmed the patient could be transported on the drivable trail. LAB units handled patient care and transport; all other units and air assets were cancelled and complete at 2:11 p.m.

Remote Rescue – March 30 – A remote rescue was dispatched at 2:58 p.m. when Park Rangers reported a patient complaining of exhaustion on a trail inside Whiting Ranch Park. Battalion 7 arrived onscene at 5:40 p.m. establishing Whiting Incident Command. Engine 27 met with Park Rangers at 5:42 p.m. where both units drove up an access road to the patients reported location. Engine 27 made patient contact and confirmed there was no medical emergency, the patient refused treatment, but required a hoist to the Oakley site. DUKE 1 handled patient extraction. All other units were cancelled and complete at 6:01 p.m.

Remote Rescue – March 25 - At 9:19 a.m. a remote rescue was dispatched for report of a male with an arm fracture from a biking accident on a trail inside Laguna Coast Wilderness Park. At 9:33 a.m. DUKE1 reported DUKE3 was on the ground and making patient contact. At 9:39 a.m. DUKE 3 confirmed a patient with arm deformity and transported the patient to Mission Hospital in Mission Viejo. All ORC resources were cancelled and complete.

Remote Rescue – March 31 - At 12:16 p.m., OCSD reported a hiker down on the trail in Peters Canyon Regional Park, and a remote rescue response was dispatched. DUKE 1 and DUKE 3 helicopters were already en route to the scene. At 12:26 p.m., DUKE 1 advised Battalion 3 they had located the patient and would be inserting a medic for assessment. The patient was determined to be ambulatory, was walked out of the park by Engine 8's crew, and refused transport. All units were complete at 12:40 p.m.

Structure Fire – April 1 - A structure fire response was dispatched to Acacia Street at 8:59 p.m. based off report of the sound of an explosion and flames from an upstairs bathroom in a single family residence. Remote Rescue – April 5 - At 6:30 p.m., a remote rescue response was dispatched to a hiker down on a ridgeline in Whiting Ranch Regional Park. While ground units made access, Helicopter 1 and Duke 1 were overhead searching for the patient. Patrol 16 made contact and after patient assessment reported the patient would need to be flown out due to the location. The rescue medic was inserted and the patient was hoisted into Helicopter 1 via a pick off and flown to the Oakley helipad where Engine 31 and a CARE ambulance were waiting. The patient was then transported ALS to Kaiser Irvine.
