

News & Events

This week OCFA Engineer Academy 25 completed their 5-week training program. The Engineer Academy is a promotional class provided to qualified firefighters who wish to advance to the rank of Fire Apparatus Engineer (FAE). The FAE is responsible for driving and operating all OCFA fire apparatus such as engines, aerial trucks, and specialized vehicles. The academy prepares them to drive our equipment safely to an emergency, supply and pump water to firefighting crews, and place aerial ladders to the roofs of buildings for ventilation or rescue.

The Orange County Fire Authority partnered with the American Red Cross, the City of Mission Viejo, and community volunteers to install free smoke alarms for residents of Baja Finisterra and Casa Loma on Saturday, April 8. A total of 175 alarms were installed in 128 homes, and all residents received information on fire safety and home escape plans.

Pre-Fire Management

- The recruitment for the Wildland Resource Planner position is complete. An announcement will be forthcoming.
- Initial interviews for Hand Crew Firefighters have been completed.
- Crews and Equipment started working on the annual maintenance of open space fire access roads (countywide).
- The annual Defensible Space Inspection Program started with an initial focus on SRA structures, using the new CAL FIRE Collector Application (State funded).
- On April 10, 12 and 13, 2017 Fire Prevention Specialists Teri Merritt and Kim Brown, along with Fire Captain Greg Hosburg delivered annual SRA Wildland Inspection Defensible Space inspection Training to Operations personnel at FS 56, 42, 18 and 15, which included the roll out of the new CALFIRE Collector App.
- In April, the Annual Power Line Inspection Program began, in cooperation with SCE and SDG&E.
- Cooperative meetings with OC Parks and State Parks continue, with the goal of establishing a collaborative response process.
- Sr. Fire Prevention Specialist, Shawn Fraley, attended the Hidden Canyon HOA orientation meeting in Irvine on April 12, 2017, and discussed how each home has requirements for accessory structures, and some homes have additional requirements for private homeowner setback areas with planting restrictions.
- As a grant update, Fire Prevention Specialist Teri Merritt reports that Emerald Bay has begun planting the Opuntia Cactus paddles along the County Parks' perimeter. The paddles were donated and collected from the new development along Jamboree/Santiago (City of Orange) and will allow Emerald Bay to reallocate monies from purchasing cactus to removing invasive plant species.
- With guidance from Fire Prevention Specialist Teri Merritt, the Rancho San Clemente Community Association was selected out of 420 applicants from 42 states to receive an NFPA "Community Wildfire Awareness Day" grant (\$500) that will be used to reduce/remove hazardous vegetation and create better defensible space for that community.



Significant Emergency Incidents

Tustin

Structure Fire – April 6 - At 9:58 a.m., FAE Training Engine 1 reported a working fire on Taulbee Court. The working structure response dispatched with a code 3 ambulance based off TRNGE1's report of persons trapped. At 9:59 a.m., TRNGE1 reported a two story single-family dwelling with fire between floors. TRNGE1 confirmed at 10:02 a.m. there was a heater in the garage on fire and that there was nobody trapped inside the residence. Battalion 3 arrived on scene and assumed Tustin Incident Command at 10:06 a.m. Tustin IC reported through the roof on the "A" side at 10:18 a.m. The fire was under control at 10:42 a.m. Red Cross responded for two displaced adults. An ORG FF sustained an arm injury due to a partial roof collapse. The ORG FF declined treatment and was released to his home unit to follow up with necessary documentation; OCFA notifications were made.

Rancho Mission Viejo

Medical Aid – April 6 – Engine 56 was dispatched to a medical aid after a passerby report of a man jumping off the Antonio Bridge. Units were dispatched to Antonio Parkway / Ortega Highway, at 6:29 p.m. E56 arrived on scene and immediately requested Helicopter 1 to respond. E56 assumed Antonio Incident Command. Responding units searched the area under the bridge on foot with a TIC and did not find a patient. Helicopter 1 made two passes reporting unable to locate. All units were complete at 7:10 p.m.

Hazardous Material Response – April 7 - At 8:36 a.m. an Auto Alarm Manual Pull response was dispatched to Toledo Way. Once on scene, Engine 38 identified that some type of chemical spill had occurred within the structure. E38 established the Incident Command and asked for the response of the Haz-Mat units. Once Battalion 4 arrived he assumed the IC from Engine 38. As further investigation of the incident was under way it was determined that there was a person suffering some type of reaction to the chemicals involved. The incident was then balanced to a Chemical Spill Inside response with an additional paramedic unit and an ambulance to treat the patient. Once all units were on scene the patient was treated and transported, and the Haz-Mat teams made an entry to determine the extent of the spill. The incident was neutralized and absorbent was placed on the product. The incident was turned over to the building's staff who had made arrangements for a cleanup company. County Health was also requested to assist at the scene.

Vehicle into Structure – April 8 - At 9:54 a.m., ECC received a report from La Palma Police of a traffic collision involving two cars into a residential structure located on Dallas Drive. Units arrived on scene and began a search of the residence for any victims, and none were located. Due to the significant damage to the structure, USAR Truck 61 and Heavy Rescue 6 were requested with an additional truck company for manpower. No injuries were reported from anyone in the vehicles. Assisting the OCFA with this incident was La Palma Police and La Palma Public Works.

Vehicle Fire / Pedestrian Fatality – April 10 - At 4:11 p.m., ECC received a report of a vehicle fire at NB 241/Santiago Canyon Road. At 4:15 p.m., CHP further reported a person (Good Samaritan) pulled over to assist with extinguishing the vehicle fire, and had been struck by a vehicle; a medical response was assisted to the call. At 4:21 p.m., CHP reported the fire had extended into the brush on the shoulder, and the response was further upgraded with additional resources. Units arrived on scene at 4:24 p.m., the patient was pronounced DOA on scene. Determined not to be caused from the fire, the patient had exited the passenger side of a work truck, went around to the rear to remove a fire extinguisher from the back of the truck. The driver, unaware the passenger was behind the truck, backed up and ran the passenger over in reverse. The fire was contained to ¼ acre, handled by units on scene; determined to be in the SRA land, SOPS notifications were made.
