Items such as televisions, computer monitors, game consoles, stereos, cell phones, microwaves, and items containing circuit boards will be collected. Hazardous materials or business e-waste will not be accepted. Residents will be required to provide proof of residency in order to participate. ## Pre-Fire Management

- Wildland Pre-Fire Management's BC, Brian Norton, and Wildland Resource Manager, George Ewan, attended the annual Southern California Edison Cooperators Meeting regarding seasonal fire and access road maintenance. The meeting was attended by all major landowners and environmental managers, and establishes the foundation for OCFA Wildland Pre-Fire Management/Heavy Fire Equipment road maintenance for the upcoming fire season.
- Wildland Pre-Fire Management's BC, Brian Norton and AFM, Nick Pivaroff, attended the Fire Safety Meeting with San Diego Gas & Electric for the upcoming South Orange County Reliability Project. This is a major power grid enhancement project that will commence later this year.

## Significant Emergency Incidents

### Orange

**Remote Rescue – April 15** - At approximately 10 a.m., Orange City Fire requested assistance with a Remote Rescue in Santiago Oaks Regional Park. Battalion 3 and Helicopter 1 were dispatched. While enroute Duke 3 advised HC1 that they had located the patient and had inserted a rescuer. Duke 3 transported the patient to OC Global and HC1 cancelled and returned to Fullerton.

### Santa Ana

**Structure Fire – April 15** – At 1:11 p.m., a structure response was dispatched to West Flight Avenue. While enroute Battalion 9 reported a column of smoke showing and requested a working structure response. Engine 78 arrived on scene 1:18 p.m. with fire showing from a single family residence with exposures. A Primary All Clear was reported at 1:25 p.m. An exterior fire had extended into the residence. The fire was reported out at 1:34 p.m. The Red Cross responded to assist with three displaced family members.

### Dana Point

**Remote Rescue – April 16** - A medical aid was dispatched at 12:43 p.m. for a 40-year-old male who fell while climbing on the rocks on the far end of the jetty. Patient complaining of right shoulder, right flank, and right scapular pain. OCFA Truck 49 was first onscene and assessed patient and requested Helicopter 1 due to the patient being approximately 600 yards out on jetty and unable to walk out. Due to the difficult footing and no vehicle access, it was determined the HC1 would be best for patient extraction and transport. HC1 arrived onscene and inserted Rescue Medic via hoist. Rescue medic determined patient needed full spinal precautions and the stokes basket was inserted. Patient was packaged on a backboard in stokes basket in full spinal precautions and hoisted up to HC1. Rescue Medic was then hoisted to HC1 and patient was transported to Mission Hospital without delay. Vitals signs were taken while enroute to hospital. Patient was deemed stable by Rescue medic and cold offload was performed at hospital. Upon arrival in the emergency room, hospital staff upgraded the patient to a trauma.

### Santa Ana

**Structure Fire – April 17** - At 8:01 p.m., a structure response was dispatched to South Orange Avenue. After receiving multiple reports, the assignment was upgraded to a working structure response. Engine 79 arrived on scene at 8:06 p.m. with a working fire in a vacant single family residence. A Primary All Clear was reported at 8:23 p.m. and the fire was knocked down at 8:24 p.m.

### Silverado

**Traffic Collision – April 19** - At 6:35 p.m., units responded to a third hand report of traffic collision in the area of Santiago Peak. The informant stated to Inland CHP that a vehicle had overturned and was leaking some type of fluid. Battalion 3 upgraded the response to a Remote Rescue and established the Maple Springs Incident Command at the entrance to Lomas. RVC Engine 51 was dispatched to assist and the Forest Service was notified. Duke 1 advised they would be delayed, having to return to JWA for refueling. Patrol 14, Engine 370, and the crew from Engine 8 (in a utility) started a ground search from the Maple Springs trailhead. Helicopter 1 responded without delay and was briefed en route. The Incident Commander advised Duke 1 that when they arrived on scene HC1 would perform a low orbit search, Duke 1 would perform a high orbit search and Duke 1 copied their assignment. HC1 located the vehicle accident and inserted the medic rescuer to ascertain if there were injuries. No injuries were reported. The vehicle was blocking the trail so the medic rescuer, Patrol 14 personnel, and bystanders were successful in moving the vehicle so other vehicles were allowed to pass. The three uninjured occupants were transported by Patrol 14 to the trailhead.
