California Parks and Recreation Society, District 10 Scholarship

The Community Services Department is proud to announce that our very own Andrea Mejia, Clerical Aide was awarded a cash scholarship from the California Parks and Recreation Society, District 10. In addition to the cash scholarship, Andrea was awarded a one-year CPRS student membership which entitles her to a discounted registration to the 2017 CPRS Conference in Long Beach. The prerequisites for applying were: live, work or attend an accredited college in the District 10 area, maintain a full-time student status of 12 semester units or more (or equivalent) or a part-time status of 6 semester units, be majoring in Recreation, Leisure Studies, Physical Education, Public Administration, Kinesiology, Gerontology or other closely related field and be seeking a career in the recreation or parks profession.

A panel reviewed and evaluated each application on the basis of overall GPA, resume content, charter references, and one-page written statement. Citizens' Academy Graduation

On Thursday, **May 4th** the first Placentia Police Department Citizen Academy in several years graduated. The graduation ceremony was held at the Placentia Library. Twenty-one citizens graduated from the program and have joined the Citizen Academy Alumni.

The Citizen Academy is a ten-week non-stress course, which meets one night a week from 6:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. The program is designed to provide community members with a better understanding of the Placentia Police Department and to help foster better communications between police personnel and citizens. The Academy includes instructions in the following area: history of the Placentia Police Department, investigations, traffic enforcement, accident investigation, driving under the influence investigations, gangs, narcotics, neighborhood watch, crime prevention, crime scene investigations, police K-9 program, and volunteer programs. There is a tour of the police facility, patrol vehicles and equipment used by the Department. Academy members are also given the chance to participate in a shoot/don't force options simulator and participate in mock car stop scenarios.







PLACENTIA AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT



FACT SHEET



As part of an ongoing effort to repair public roads and improve pedestrian accessibility, the cities of Placentia and Fullerton have jointly initiated the Placentia Avenue Reconstruction Project. Both cities received Federal Arterial Pavement Management grant funds to reconstruct Placentia Avenue, a busy arterial roadway shared by both cities. This is a priority project as the current roadway conditions require it to be completely rebuilt. The project limits are Placentia Avenue between Ruby Drive and Chapman Avenue in addition to enhancing accessibility and safety.

The scope of work for this project includes the removal and replacement of the existing asphalt pavement and portions of the road base, as well as reconstructing damaged sidewalks, driveways, curbs and gutters, and ramps.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

Construction is slated to begin June 1, 2017, with an estimated completion date in late August 2017. Construction will take place Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. During construction work, one lane in each direction will be open to through traffic, however, there will be extended temporary lane closures in place. Driveway access may be temporarily impacted at times for those who have only one driveway.

Please observe traffic control and advisory signs that will be updated regularly to reflect current construction activities and schedules. Detour signs will be posted, and residents and businesses can direct their questions to the construction helpline at (714) 442-0010. Additionally, updates will be posted on the cities of Placentia and Fullerton websites www.placentia.org/placentiaproject and www.cityoffullerton.com.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- Removal and replacement of aging pavement
- Improve access ramps to meet ADA requirements
- Restore damaged sidewalks, driveways, curbs and gutters

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO!

- Travel on Placentia Avenue will be limited to one-lane of traffic in each direction; motorists should expect delays.
- It is recommended that motorists use alternative routes, if possible.
- Construction is scheduled June 1 to August 31, 2017

As a result of the training, OCFA was able to provide opportunities for our HFEO Apprentice Program, exercise our Cooperative MOU with OC Public Works and build relationships with surrounding agencies. Another added benefit was the installation of the perimeter fuel break, designed reduce the threat to OCFA jurisdiction from fires burning off the Base. Thanks goes to our partners from Camp Pendleton.
- The Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) was completed for the wildland and WUI areas of the County. This cooperative document will be provided to the OCFA Board of Directors for Review and Approval in the coming weeks.
- The completed 2017 Unit Strategic Fire Plan, which provides a summary of wildfire activity, preventative efforts, and direction for the coming year, was submitted to CAL FIRE on Thursday, May 11th. Fire Prevention Specialists Kim Brown and Teri Merritt attended CAL FIRE’s CEQA training on Wednesday, May 10, 2017.
