**Placentia City Administrator Receives “City Manager of the Year” Award**

The City of Placentia is pleased to announce that at the Association of California Cities Orange County’s (ACC-OC) 6th Annual Golden Hub of Innovation Award Luncheon, City Administrator Damien R. Arrula received the award for “City Manager of the Year.” The event took place on **Friday, May 12<sup>th</sup>** at the Island Hotel in Newport Beach, CA. The nominations for the award are judged by the appointees of the ACC-OC Executive Board based on the following criteria: significant achievements made within the scope of their regular duties, special contributions made outside of routine responsibilities, demonstrations of outstanding initiative, fostering new ideas, and perseverance or dedications to the profession or city. During Fiscal Year 2016-2017, Mr. Arrula and the City’s management team recovered several million dollars from an embezzlement, while also managing or advancing several special projects including the Placentia Veterans Village, the Transit Oriented Development Packing House District, the proposed Old Town Placentia Revitalization Plan, balanced the budget and secured \$15 million in additional funds, and recovered \$3 million in State funds.

“I am humbled and honored to receive this award. Last year was a very difficult and challenging time for the City”, said City Administrator Arrula. “After first learning about the \$5.2 million embezzlement, our team worked diligently with the Orange County District Attorney’s Office and as a result, we have successfully recovered over 80% of the stolen funds. We expect to have an announcement of additional recovery soon. Despite all of this, we managed to get some great things done and it’s a credit to our Council and the management team.”

City Administrator Arrula stated during the award presentation, “I have always believed that leadership doesn’t come in some cushy job where everything is perfect. True leadership is defined in crisis and taking on things that aren’t popular or others don’t want to take on. Meeting the challenge head on and not blinking. That is true leadership. Our team epitomized that true leadership this past year and I’m proud to say that it’s an honor to serve them and our great City.”

“I am extremely pleased that ACC-OC has named Damien as “City Manager of the Year”, said Mayor Craig Green. “This is a true testament to Damien’s integrity, passion and professionalism. In City government, some individuals are born leaders, extraordinary visionaries with the innate ability to solve challenging problems, tackle large-scale projects and effectively guide the City and its resources. I believe Damien has accomplished many of these things for our City,” said Mayor Green.



### New Gas Station Under Construction

On **May 4<sup>th</sup>**, building permits were issued for a self-service, unmanned gas station at 480 S. Placentia Avenue. Several weeks ago, grading permits were issued and site grading has been completed. On **December 13<sup>th</sup>**, the Planning Commission approved a Use Permit to permit the construction of this development. The City of Placentia owns the property upon which Galaxy Oil will operate the self-service station. This project will generate an annual base rental fee of \$25,000 and together with annual royalty payments which fluctuate depending on the volume of fuel sold, it is anticipated that this project will generate \$200,000 to \$350,000 in General Fund revenue annually for the City. Staff anticipates a July opening date for this new revenue generating project.



### **Placentia Police Station Lobby Renovation Project**

The Placentia Police Station Lobby is currently under construction and a temporary lobby is available to the public in the front Community Meeting Room located between the Police Department and City Hall. The project entails the reconstruction of the existing and staff restrooms to provide ADA compliant restrooms, as well as modifications to the public counter to provide ADA compliant accessibility, installation of new automated sliding doors as well as new interior paint, flooring and lighting in the lobby area. Funds for the construction of the lobby include a total of \$169,000 in Community Development Block Grant and \$87,740 in Asset Forfeiture Funds. The Project is expected to be completed by the end of June, 2017.



# PLACENTIA AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT



FACT SHEET



As part of an ongoing effort to repair public roads and improve pedestrian accessibility, the cities of Placentia and Fullerton have jointly initiated the Placentia Avenue Reconstruction Project. Both cities received Federal Arterial Pavement Management grant funds to reconstruct Placentia Avenue, a busy arterial roadway shared by both cities. This is a priority project as the current roadway conditions require it to be completely rebuilt. The project limits are Placentia Avenue between Ruby Drive and Chapman Avenue in addition to enhancing accessibility and safety.

The scope of work for this project includes the removal and replacement of the existing asphalt pavement and portions of the road base, as well as reconstructing damaged sidewalks, driveways, curbs and gutters, and ramps.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

Construction is slated to begin June 1, 2017, with an estimated completion date in late August 2017. Construction will take place Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. During construction work, one lane in each direction will be open to through traffic, however, there will be extended temporary lane closures in place. Driveway access may be temporarily impacted at times for those who have only one driveway.

Please observe traffic control and advisory signs that will be updated regularly to reflect current construction activities and schedules. Detour signs will be posted, and residents and businesses can direct their questions to the construction helpline at (714) 442-0010.
