DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

On Tuesday, August 8, 2017, the Planning Commission reviewed and approved two new projects within the City that involves (a) the redevelopment of a new gas station and (b) establishment of a yoga instruction studio. The details of these projects are as follows:

7-Eleven Gas Station

Removal of an existing “Valero” gas station at the southwest corner of S. Placentia Avenue and W. Orangethorpe Avenue (818 W. Orange Avenue) and development of a new “7-Eleven” convenience market and gas station. The development project will include a 2,081-square foot, 24-hour convenience market building and gas pump island and canopy. The project will include an architecturally enhanced convenience market building, along with decorative landscaping and paving. The infill project will visually upgrade the aging site and aesthetically enhance the Placentia Avenue and Orangethorpe Avenue intersection, which serves as an important entry point into the City of Placentia. Additional information on it’s grand opening will be forth coming.



Happy Flow Yoga

The Yoga instruction studio identified as “Happy Flow Yoga” is intending to establish a business within an existing multi-tenant commercial shopping center at the southwest corner of N. Kraemer Boulevard and Morse Avenue (1290 N. Kraemer Boulevard). The studio will occupy a 1,153-square foot unit and will include a retail area dedicated to the sale of yoga related products. “Happy Flow Yoga” will assist in the diversification of commercial uses within the surrounding area. PLACENTIA AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT



CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

WHAT:

As part of the Placentia Avenue Reconstruction Project, crews will be performing work during the weekend at the intersections of Placentia/Nutwood and Placentia/Chapman. This improvement work will require closures, which may impact motorists and cause travel delays. Please plan extra time when traveling through the project area.

WHEN:

Friday, July 28 and Saturday, July 29, 8 a.m. to midnight

Work is scheduled at the **Placentia/Nutwood intersection**. Closures include:

- No left turn lane from northbound Placentia Ave. onto westbound Nutwood Ave.
- No thru traffic from southbound Placentia Ave.; all motorists will turn right onto Nutwood Ave.

Friday, Aug. 4 and Saturday, Aug. 5, 8 a.m. to midnight

Work is scheduled at the **Placentia/Chapman intersection**. The closure includes:

- No left turn lane from southbound Placentia Ave. onto eastbound Chapman Ave.

DETOURS:

During closures at Placentia/Nutwood, motorists traveling northbound on Placentia Ave. should use Yorba Linda Blvd. for freeway access. Motorists traveling southbound on Placentia Ave. should use Nutwood Ave., to Commonwealth Ave., to Chapman Ave. for access to Placentia Ave. During the closure at Placentia/Chapman, motorists should use Center St., to Murray St., for access to Chapman Ave.

This month, OCFA safety messaging will focus on [cooking safety](#) and [drowning prevention](#). Cooking is the leading cause of fires, fire injuries, and fire deaths in Orange County. Unattended cooking is the #1 cause of home cooking fires. Never leave anything on the stove unattended. Drowning is a preventable tragedy; however, it is the leading cause of accidental injury and death in children under the age of five. No one should ever swim alone. The ABC's of water safety stand for *A – Active Supervision*, *B – Barriers* around pools, and *C – Classes*, CPR and swim.

Structure Fire – August 10 – At 3:21 a.m. a Structure Fire response was dispatched to Jamboree Rd. First arriving units found a single story restaurant with black smoke coming from the structure and asked for the balance of the Working Structure Fire response. At 3:38 a.m. the Incident Commander stated that the fire was progressing to the point that it had self-ventilated through the roof. Vehicle Rollover – August 13 - At 4:06 a.m. RVC PD reported a vehicle rollover on Santiago Rd. E315 requested a helicopter for the search component; ECC was unable to contact the original RP by cellphone.
