


### Expanding Hours at St. Jude Mobile Clinic

### News & Events

As of October 12, the Canyon 2 Fire is 60% contained. The fire started on October 9 near the 91 Freeway and Cole Canyon in the City of Anaheim. OCFA is in unified command with CAL Fire, Anaheim Fire and Rescue, and Orange City Fire. The fire has burned 9,217 acres, damaged 36 structures and destroyed 23 structures. All evacuations have been lifted and full containment of the fire is expected by 10/14/2017. Photos of crews battling the fire from the ground as well as the air are available [here](#).

The Orange County Fire Authority partnered with the American Red Cross, the City of Santa Ana, the Santa Ana Police Department, and more than 300 community volunteers to install free smoke alarms for residents of Riverview West on Saturday, October 7. A total of 804 smoke alarms were installed, and residents in all 997 homes received information on fire safety and home escape plans in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese.

Come out and meet your local firefighters! Designated [Orange County Fire Authority Fire Stations](#) will be hosting [Open Houses](#) on Saturday, October 14, from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m. The Annual Open House held at our headquarters in Irvine will be held in May of 2018.

This week is Fire Prevention Week. The theme this year is [“Every Second Counts, Plan Two Ways Out”](#). In a fire, seconds count. Seconds can mean the difference between residents of our community escaping safely from a fire or having their lives end in tragedy.
