Citrus Pest and Disease Prevention Program

Recently, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) and the United States Department of Agriculture discovered Huanglongbing, also known as HLB or citrus greening disease, in La Habra and Anaheim. HLB kills citrus trees and has no cure. The disease is not harmful to humans or animals. The disease is spread by a pest called the Asian Citrus Psyllid (ACP). ACP is a small insect that feeds on citrus tree leaves, which causes a bacteria called Huanglongbing to spread. If a tree is infected, it can die in as little as five years. 
Placentia Youth Basketball

- On Thursday, October 19th, Fire Prevention Specialist, Kim Brown, took Casey Gnad, Landscape Maintenance Supervisor from the City of Irvine, on a tour of the Canyon Fire #2 burn area, so he could gain a better understanding of vegetation management practices that worked vs. what didn't.

Significant Emergency Incidents

Irvine

Remote Rescue – October 21 - At 10:50 a.m. a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to the Laguna Coast Wilderness Park in southern Irvine for the report of a fallen mountain biker. As ground units started into the area HC1 arrived over the area and was able to locate the patient. Due to the amount of time it was going to take for the ground units to make access to the area HC1 found a suitable location to 'Flat Pitch' land approximately 25 yards up canyon from the patient's location. HC1 landed, and the rescue medic made patient contact. The patient was determined to have an isolated arm injury but due to the pain was not ambulatory. A stokes basket extraction with flat pitch load was determined to be safest for the patient and the aircraft. Pain medication was administered, the patient was packaged in stokes basket and loaded into HC1. The patient was flown to Mission Hospital, Mission Viejo while being treated by the Rescue Medic in the aircraft.

Remote Rescue – October 22 – At 10:16 a.m., ECC received a report from the Orange County Sheriff's Department of a remote rescue on Mustard Trail in Whiting Ranch. A remote rescue response was started with DUKE1 helicopter also en route. At 10:27 a.m. DUKE1 advised they were on scene and had one of their medics with the patient. ORCO HC1 and OCFA ground resources continued to make access as DUKE medics assessed. At 10:37 a.m. DUKE1 advised they would be taking 1 trauma patient by air to Mission Hospital.

At 3:22 p.m. E64 requested the balance of a Working Structure response. At 3:22 p.m. Edison was requested for possible power lines down. The IC also advised that the power lines were not down, they are still attached to the pole just involved with fire. At 3:36 p.m. E64 gave a primary all clear.
