## ADMINISTRATION

### Citrus Pest and Disease Prevention Program

Recently, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) and the United States Department of Agriculture discovered Huanglongbing, also known as HLB or citrus greening disease, in La Habra and Anaheim. HLB kills citrus trees and has no cure. The disease is not harmful to humans or animals. The disease is spread by a pest called the Asian Citrus Psyllid (ACP). ACP is a small insect that feeds on citrus tree leaves, which causes a bacteria called Huanglongbing to spread. If a tree is infected, it can die in as little as five years. ## PUBLIC WORKS

### Kraemer Boulevard Median Renovations

As a result of mandatory water restrictions imposed by the Governor in 2014, Cities are barred from watering turf grass medians. In response, the City Council allocated \$50,000 in available Landscape Maintenance District funds for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 to renovate these medians as well as the medians on Rose Drive between Alta Vista and Buena Vista Streets. The Public Works maintenance staff recently completed renovations of two landscaped medians along Kraemer Boulevard between Chapman Avenue and Alta Vista Street. The renovations entailed the removal of 3,681 square feet of turf grass as well as other associated shrubs and old plant materials which were replaced with low water usage plant materials and a drip irrigation system. Staff anticipates saving approximately 158,283 gallons of water as a result of these improvements each year.




The renovations on Rose Drive are expected to begin in the next three weeks. In addition to these recently completed renovations, the medians on Kraemer Boulevard between Bastanchury Road and the north City limits were completed several months ago along with a median along Chapman Avenue in front of City Hall as well as the medians located in the Civic Center parking lot.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### Man Arrested for Gas Station Robbery

On **November 13, 2017** at approximately 11:06 p.m., Placentia Police Officers were dispatched to the Chevron gas station at 313 W. Orangethorpe Avenue regarding an armed robbery. The clerk reported that a male dressed in dark clothing and wearing a black bandana had just robbed him at gunpoint. A small amount of cash was taken and the suspect was last seen running from the gas station in a southeast direction. Store surveillance cameras captured photographs of the suspect and the photographs were later released to the public. The police department received numerous tips from the public after posting his picture on the Placentia Police Department's Facebook page and Detectives working on the case were able to identify the suspect.

On **November 15, 2017** at approximately 1:45 p.m., Placentia Police Detectives with assistance from the U.S. Department of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) agents and Brea Police Detectives stopped a vehicle in the area of Sunkist and Lincoln in the City of Anaheim and arrested Mauricio Eraldo Esquivel, age 23, of Anaheim for the robbery. Esquivel was taken into custody without incident and later booked into Orange County Jail.

As ground units were making access to the patient Duke1 and Duke6 arrived over the area and were able to quickly locate the patient. Duke6 inserted a rescuer and that rescuer started an evaluation of the patient's injuries. It was determined that the patient would need to be flown to the hospital; so, the patient was packaged in a stokes basket, hoisted into Duke6 and flown directly to Mission Hospital, Mission Viejo.

## Newport Coast

**Remote Rescue – November 11** – At 12:35 p.m. a Remote Rescue response was dispatched to the area northwest of Laguna Beach for the report of a mountain biker down along Big Bend Trail. Ground units were able to make access the trail and located the patient approximately one mile in from Laguna Canyon Rd. It was determined that the patient was a “trauma” and that flying the patient to the hospital would be the most appropriate. Helicopter 1 arrived over the scene and inserted two rescuers. Once the patient was packaged in the stokes basket, patient and rescuers were hoisted into HC1 and they flew directly to Mission Hospital, Mission Viejo arriving at 1:38 p.m.

**Chemical Spill – November 15** - At 2:05 p.m. Engine 38 was dispatched to an Auto Alarm at Boot Barn on Barranca Parkway. The initial report from the alarm company was a Pre Action Alarm in the server room with no other alarm activations and no resets. At 2:12 p.m. Engine 38 arrived on scene to investigate. At 2:19 p.m. Engine 38 advised that workers had hit a Freon line which caused a severe leak in the building. They requested the balance of a Chemical Spill in a Structure response. Engine 38 assumed the Barranca IC and started evacuations of the business. At 2:31 p.m. Engine 38 advised that there were technicians on the roof trying to repair the leak, at 2:37 p.m. the technicians had the leak stopped. At 2:51 p.m. Battalion 5 Chief Bramlette assumed the Barranca IC and advised the Freon leak in the center of the building was isolated, stopped and that units were working on ventilation and had 100% evacuation of the building. At 3:13 p.m. the building was cleared and released back to management, all OCFA units cleared. Irvine PD was notified of the incident.
