



## Street Sweeping Cancelled During the Holidays

The City of Placentia's Public Works Department will be cancelling residential street sweeping operations during the winter holiday season, starting on **Friday, December 22<sup>nd</sup>** to **Tuesday, January 2<sup>nd</sup>**. Parking Enforcement will also suspend issuing street sweeping citations during this time. Street sweeping operations and Parking Enforcement will resume on **Wednesday, January 3<sup>rd</sup>**. During this time however, residents are reminded that all vehicles determined to be in violation of a parking ordinance other than the street sweeping violation ordinance, will remain subject to a parking citation. ## Kraemer Boulevard Street Rehabilitation Project Completed

Paving work on Kraemer Boulevard between the Brea/Placentia City Limits and Golden Avenue was recently completed. This was a joint project with the City of Brea to repave Kraemer Boulevard to Lambert Road. Placentia's portion of Kraemer received a new 2-inch rubberized asphalt cap along with concrete repairs and new traffic loop detectors. The City took the opportunity to partner with the City of Brea to deliver much needed road repairs in a more cost-effective manner by combining efforts to rehabilitate public roads across City boundaries. Placentia's portion of the project cost \$90,000 which was covered by Measure M2 road maintenance funds. The road repairs coupled with landscape median improvements completed last year provide for a new aesthetically pleasing streetscape entrance into Placentia.
