

CITY COUNCIL EXPANDS SMOKING BAN

On December 19, 2017, the Placentia City Council adopted Ordinance Number O-2017-12, expanding the smoking ban to all City facilities. The Placentia Municipal Code (PMC) currently regulates and prohibits smoking inside any building or structure owned or leased by the City for governmental purposes. The adopted ordinance broadens the prohibition of smoking in City facilities to prohibit smoking at all City facilities, including parks, civic center(s), and public facilities. This prohibition would include parking lots, open areas, plazas, and enclosed fenced areas of all the aforementioned facilities. It also includes areas within fifty (50) feet of any park perimeter, provided that if any such perimeter encroaches on private property, the prohibition will not apply to persons and private (non-city) vehicles in route along the public streets and sidewalks, or to private properties not included in the definitions section of the ordinance. This ordinance prohibits cigarette smoking, as well as marijuana smoking, electronic cigarettes ("e-cigarettes") and other electronic smoking paraphernalia, such as vaporizers. In essence, this ordinance would establish that any place where tobacco smoking is prohibited, so too is the use of marijuana and/or e-cigarettes and vaping devices. The ordinance went into effect on January 18, 2018.

Secondhand smoke has been classified as a known human carcinogen by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the U.S. National Toxicology Program, the U.S. Surgeon General, and the International Agency for Research on Cancer. California first banned smoking in enclosed spaces at places of employment, including day care facilities, in 1995. Subsequently, California's smoking ban has grown to include building entryways, playgrounds, restaurants, bars, and public transit. In 2008, it became an infraction to smoke in a car when a minor is present due to the harmful effects of secondhand smoke.

On March 7, 2017, the City Council conducted a Study Session to review the draft Ordinance and to receive public comments. After receiving public comments, staff was directed to receive public comments and return to City Council with an Ordinance that would broaden the prohibition of smoking in City facilities to prohibit smoking at all City facilities, including parks, civic center(s), and community centers. Subsequent to the March 7, 2017 meeting, an additional Public Hearing regarding the Ordinance was heard on December 5, 2017. A TRANSFORMING OPPORTUNITY COMES TO PLACENTIA'S PACKING HOUSE DISTRICT

The City of Placentia has been given a unique opportunity with the state-of-the art Metrolink Station (Station) and 253-space parking structure within the Old Town Placentia area. Operational by 2020, the proposed Station can help transform the Packing House District (near Melrose Street and Crowther Avenue) into an active, vibrant destination. Transit-oriented development, or TOD, is a type of community development that includes a mixture of housing, office, retail and/or other amenities integrated into a walkable neighborhood and located within a half-mile of a public transportation stop. To help this transformation, the City of Placentia has proposed an amendment to the Zoning Code with specific standards to allow a mixed use, pedestrian, oriented retail and residential district, creating new development opportunities for a one-of-a-kind destination. It will also support existing retail and restaurant businesses while growing the City's local economy. The TOD District is scheduled for City Council adoption in April, 2017. PLACENTIA'S METROLINK STATION AND PARKING STRUCTURE

At the June 27, 2016 Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Board of Directors Meeting, the Board Members approved the funding and cooperative agreement for the construction of the newest Metrolink Station in Orange County and a new parking structure. Mayor Craig Green, Mayor Pro Tem Wanke and former Councilmember Scott Nelson along with City Administrator Damien R. Arrula and other City staff were present at the Board meeting along with several representatives from the Placentia Chamber of Commerce, Placita Santa Fe Merchants Association, and Cal State Fullerton's Transportation Department.

"The City has been working with OCTA on the construction of a Metrolink Station and parking structure to serve the City and surrounding area for several years now," said City Administrator Damien R. Arrula. "We are particularly thankful to CEO Darrell Johnson and his OCTA team for their partnership and support in developing a cohesive plan to bring this project to fruition. We are excited for the prospect of having the station serve as the catalyst for making Old Town Placentia a destination while serving regional transportation needs in the North Orange County area" said City Administrator Arrula.

The Cooperative Agreement was presented at the July 12, 2016 Placentia City Council meeting for final approval. The Agreement was unanimously approved by the City Council.

Once constructed, this will be the 13th station serving the 91 Line which runs from Union Station in Downtown Los Angeles to Downtown Riverside. The Placentia Metrolink Station will be the closest station in proximity to Cal State Fullerton and will provide passengers with an alternative to the Fullerton Metrolink Station.

The total cost of the project is \$35 million, of which the City will contribute \$5.4 million. The following is the tentative project delivery schedule:

FOR FALL PREVENTION & A GATEWAY TO ACTIVE SENIORS

Among older adults in the United States, falls are a leading cause of fatal and nonfatal injuries. Even if older adults have not fallen, the fear of falling can keep them from being active. Falling is not an inevitable consequence of aging. Exercise, especially programs designed to reduce falls, is just what the older adult needs.

Tai Chi is a set of exercises that are performed in a slow, controlled manner with a deep inner awareness of using the body in a holistic way and applying controlled breathing as its “tempo”. It demands continuous movement as it requires a constant shifting of weight, which improves both stability and mobility. It also incorporates both asymmetrical and diagonal arm-leg movements and promotes arm swing and rotation at the waist. This low-impact exercise puts minimal stress on joints, making it a low-risk, appropriate exercise for seniors. Tai Chi for Health is offered on Monday mornings starting on April 9. 
