## Placentia Firefighter Named OCFA Firefighter of the Year

The City of Placentia is proud to announce that Battalion 2 Fire Captain Chuck Hawkins has been named 2018 “Firefighter of the Year” by the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA).

Captain Hawkins was presented this highly distinguished award at the OCFA’s 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Best and Bravest Awards Dinner on February 23<sup>rd</sup>. Though each of OCFA’s nine Battalions nominate and recognize a firefighter of the year, Placentia’s Captain Hawkins was chosen overall OCFA “Firefighter of the Year” from those nine Battalions.



Captain Hawkins is a mentor for the probationary firefighters throughout Battalion 2 and has assisted with training aspiring firefighters and engineers wanting to become company officers. He develops scenarios, sits on interview boards, and assists with administration. He was also recently deployed to ground zero of Hurricane Harvey where he was a vital member of the team, assisting with hundreds of rescues.

The OCFA’s 2018 Annual Best and Bravest Awards Dinner honors agency firefighters on the frontlines during actual fire emergencies and also honors those who help improve the agency through administrative efforts. Firefighter of the Year, Reserve Firefighter of the Year, Professional Staff, Manager of the Year, Unsung Hero and the Medal of Courage are all awarded at the event. Captain Hawkins will be recognized at an upcoming meeting of the Placentia City Council.

### City Seeks Community Input For District Plan

The City of Placentia is asking for your help planning our City's change to by-district Council elections. What do you consider your neighborhood or "community interest?" Do you want to submit a proposed map, or changes to a map already in discussion? The City Council wants to hear from you!

**March 11th** is the deadline for public submission of initial draft maps. Public input will then be solicited on the draft maps at a public hearing held during the regular City Council Meeting on **March 20th**, to find out what you like and dislike about each map. There will then be an additional community meeting on the by-district maps on **March 28th at 6:00 p.m. at the Backs Building, 201 Bradford Avenue.**

This will be followed by another public hearing held during the regular City Council Meeting on **April 17th**, where the Council will solicit public input on selection of a preferred map and election sequence. Finally, the Council will adopt an ordinance establishing a district plan.

### St. Jude Mobile Health Clinic



## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### Pounds of Narcotics Seized By Placentia Police Department

On February 25, 2018 at about 11:00 p.m., Placentia Police Officers received information of possible narcotic sales at the Residence Inn, located at 700 Kimberly Avenue, Placentia. Patrol Officers obtained and executed a search warrant for several hotel rooms. Police Officers discovered over 35 pounds of high grade marijuana, 12 pounds of methamphetamine, an estimated 3 ounces of China White heroin, and hundreds of opiate prescription pills packaged for shipment to various locations across the United States. Two men and a woman were arrested at the scene and later booked in the Placentia Jail. The investigation is ongoing.



## Pre Fire Management

- Feb. 24-March 1, 2018, Assistant Fire Marshal Nick Pivaroff, along with Fire Prevention Specialist Kim Brown, attended the Wildland Urban Interface conference presented by the International Association of Fire Chiefs.
- Wildland Resource Planner Dave Erickson and the Heavy Equipment section started open space access road work at San Onofre State Park. Additional hazardous fuels reduction work was also completed in Crystal Cove State Park. Both projects were collaborative efforts with California State Parks.
- Wildland Resource Planner, Dave Erickson, the Santiago Crew, and the Heavy Fire Equipment section began the next phase of the State grant-funded Canyon Fuels Reduction Project, which should be completed by next week. Outreach & Education was also included as part of the project, allowing additional properties to be included.
- Teri Merritt (PFM) met with County of Orange Public Works (Weed Abatement) to discuss our annual programs and coordinate inspection schedules to better serve the residents.
- Teri Merritt (PFM) worked with Rancho San Clemente Master Association and San Clemente High School's Community Problem Solvers Club to apply for the NFPA Wildfire Community Preparedness Day Grant. Their work was also featured in a recent article and they presented at a San Clemente City Council Meeting. They are lobbying for signage for public awareness along trails to remind people of the dangers of wildland fires.
