OC Animal Care Ready To Move Into New Facility

Orange County Animal Care will move to its new \$30 million dollar facility the week of March 12th and hold a grand opening March 24th at the facility located at 1630 Victory Road in the City of Tustin.

The new shelter will serve 14 cities, including Placentia, and replaces its current 75-year-old facility in Orange. The facility, built on 10 acres at the former Tustin Marine Corps Air Station, cost nearly \$30 million to construct, with \$5 million coming from the county and the remainder from the cities it will serve.



Beginning March 12th, limited services will be offered at the Orange facility to prepare for the move. As of March 13th, the shelter in Orange is permanently closed and limited services and hours will be offered in Tustin. The new shelter will be at full service following the grand opening on March 24th. Some of the features of the new center will allow for better animal treatment, including climate-controlled buildings, more space for bathing and grooming, more surgery suites and recovery areas, larger cat kennels, dog runs that span indoors and outside, more outdoor space and better natural light.

Beginning March 12th, limited services will be offered at the Orange facility to prepare for the move. As of March 13th, the shelter in Orange is permanently closed and limited services and hours will be offered in Tustin. The new shelter will be at full service following the grand opening on March 24th. Some of the features of the new center will allow for better animal treatment, including climate-controlled buildings, more space for bathing and grooming, more surgery suites and recovery areas, larger cat kennels, dog runs that span indoors and outside, more outdoor space and better natural light.

City Seeks Community Input For District Plan

The City of Placentia is asking for your help planning our City's change to by-district Council elections. What do you consider your neighborhood or "community interest?" Do you want to submit a proposed map, or changes to a map already in discussion? The City Council wants to hear from you!



The deadline for public submission of initial draft maps is **March 11th**. Public input will then be solicited on the draft maps at a public hearing held during the regular City Council Meeting on **March 20th**, to find out what you like and dislike about each map. There will then be a Community Forum on the by-district maps on **March 28th at 6:00 p.m. at the Backs Building, 201 Bradford Avenue**.

This will be followed by another public hearing held during the regular City Council Meeting on **April 17th**, where the Council will solicit public input on selection of a preferred map and election sequence. Finally, the Council will adopt an ordinance establishing a district plan.



Pre Fire Management

- Fire Prevention Specialist Teri Merritt has been assisting the student group, Community Problem Solvers, at San Clemente High School, who want to promote wildland fire prevention, especially along the trails in San Clemente. The group is proposing signs along the trails to deter smoking and prohibit motor vehicles (mostly motorcycles) in undesignated areas, as well as other public education. Teri has been working with the student who is the group's co-founder and will be meeting with the entire group soon to see how OCFA can work together to make their project a success.
- On March 2, 2018, Sr. Fire Prevention Specialist Shawn Fraley met with Keystone Pacific and Crummack Huseby Property Management Companies regarding the new WUI communities of "The Oaks" in Lake Forest, and "Skyridge" in Mission Viejo. Both of these communities have extensive wildfire prevention construction features designed into the homes and have requirements that apply to accessory structures and planting restrictions in the communities as well.
- On Monday, March 5, 2018, Fire Prevention Specialist Teri Merritt attended the annual Foothill Communities Association Meeting, along with BC Ashby and AC Young. The main focus of the meeting was on residential crime; however, OCFA staff talked to residents about the importance of Wildland Preparedness (Ready, Set, Go!) and Home Hardening and also encouraged residents to join their local North Tustin Fire Safe Council.
- Tuesday, March 6, 2018, Sr. Fire Prevention Specialist Shawn Fraley met with Irvine Company and Keystone Pacific Property Management for Orchard Hills Neighborhood 3, "The Reserve", and Orchard Hills NH 1 Phase 4. - Landscape were also in attendance, as they are the entities contracted by Keystone Pacific Property Management for the review process and were also there on the behalf of the homeowners. This information will be helpful for these projects, as well as for others since the concepts of the HOA Review are universal for any community with a Fuel Modification Plan, Fire Protection Plans or that are located in Fire Hazard Severity Zones.
- Fire Prevention Specialist Kim Brown attended the Community Association of Rancho meeting in Rancho Santa Margarita on Tuesday, March 6, 2018, and presented information on Home Hardening and Vegetation Management. The meeting was attended by City officials, Trabuco Canyon Water District, HOA Board Members from Dove Canyon, Trabuco Highlands, Rancho Cielo, SAMLARC, and Walden, along with their Property Managers.
- Pre-Fire BC Brian Norton facilitated a Joint Responders Workshop for Cal OES Regions 1 and 6 on Camp Pendleton on Tuesday, March 6, 2018. The workshop included multiple agencies and was intended to foster relationships between these agencies, as well as provide opportunities to plan for future wildland incidents that involve multiple jurisdictions.
- AFM Nick Pivaroff attended the Board of Forestry and Fire Protection Resource Protection Committee meeting on 3/6/2018 to answer any questions related to the County's Fire Code Ordinance. The Resource Committee recommended that the Board of Forestry certify Orange County's Ordinance, and on 3/7/2018, the Board of Forestry certified it as is.
