Stamp Out Hunger With Letter Carrier's Food Drive

On **Saturday, May 12th**, the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC), including letter carriers in Placentia, will conduct their 26th Annual "Stamp Out Hunger" Food Drive.


Every year on the second Saturday in May, letter carriers in more than 10,000 cities and towns across America collect the goodness and compassion of their postal customers, who participate in the NALC Stamp Out Hunger National Food Drive — the largest one-day food drive in the nation.

Led by letter carriers represented by the National Association of Letter Carriers (AFL-CIO), with help from rural letter carriers, other postal employees and other volunteers, the drive has delivered more than one billion pounds of food over the past 24 years.

Carriers collect non-perishable food donations left by mailboxes and in post offices and deliver them to local community food banks, pantries and shelters. Nearly 1,500 NALC branches in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam and the Virgin Islands are involved.

To donate, just place a box or can of non-perishable food next to your mailbox before your letter carrier delivers mail on the second Saturday in May. The food is sorted, and delivered to an area food bank or pantry, where it is available for needy families.



Irvine--Two people sustained minor injuries Wednesday night when a Metrolink train struck a vehicle in Irvine.

The collision was reported about 7 p.m. just east of Harvard Avenue and Irvine Center Drive, according to the Orange County Fire Authority.

Silverado Canyon--Two Orange County firefighter's sustained minor injuries and two cats were rescued in an extra-alarm fire in Silverado Monday afternoon. Firefighters arrived on the scene within minutes of calls coming in of smoke billowing from a structure, according to witnesses. The cats saved from the burning structure were given oxygen by emergency responders and were in good shape, according to reports.

April 21: E20 responded on two separate incidents, each reporting a fence on fire at a new housing site under construction near 123 Catalyst, IRV. The incidents appear to have similarities and are under investigation for suspicious circumstances.

Silverado Canyon

April 23: ECC received a report of a house fire at 1142 hours and dispatched a structure response to 29423 Silverado Canyon Rd, SLU. At 1146 hours, P14 reported a working fire to the rear of the structure with no extension into the vegetation and balanced the assignment to a working structure response. B3 arrived on scene at 1204 hours, reporting a working attic fire, and assumed Silverado IC. A second alarm was requested at 1219 hours, a primary all clear was reported at 1227 hours. At 1235 hours, IC requested emergency warble tones to alert crews of a compromised floor on the B/C side of the structure. At 1311 hours, a third alarm was requested. The fire was reported knocked down at 1331 hours. Three firefighters were evaluated for injuries and transported to the hospital for evaluation and treatment. Red Cross was requested to assist with displacement of four adults and four children, and TIP was requested to the scene.

Irvine

D2 handled notifications. There were no injuries reported from the vehicle or the passenger train.

The ground crews were unable to walk the patient out to a ground ambulance due to high tides and treacherous footing on the cliffs. B6, HC2, T9, and HT241 responded to the scene to assist. HC2 escorted the male patient ALS to Mission Hospital, MVO at 2043 hours. A female victim was recovered by OCSD Harbor Patrol and LAB FD in the ocean. The victim was transported to the OCSD Harbor patrol office in DPT harbor. E29 was dispatched and responded to pronounce the victim prior to the Coroner's arrival. All ORC equipment were complete by 2315 hours.

- Related to the San Clemente HS Community Problem Solving Club's project, Fire Prevention Specialist Teri Merritt is also currently working with City of San Clemente Parks Department on verbiage for the trail signs and logo sharing. The City wants to create a standard for signs on other trails throughout the city trail systems, so OCFA is looking for ways to partner with them on this project, including placing OCFA's informational tri-folds and/or other education materials for the public to take with them.
