### OC Mosquito & Vector Control Update

A couple weeks ago, the Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District (OCMVCD) launched the 2018 Summer Campaign “Make Your Home Mosquito-Free.” The campaign included bus shelters, billboards, bus tailgates, radio ads, PSA videos, and social media posts. Although some of these items were obtained through paid advertising, OCMVCD relies on collaboration and partnerships with cities to increase visibility of the campaign.

We would like to thank the cities who have already partnered with us and we hope to expand to additional cities.

**Bus Shelters** – Cities are able to obtain bus shelter space for a discounted or no-cost for public service announcements. We have partnered with the following cities: Fullerton, Garden Grove, Huntington Beach, La Habra, and Mission Viejo.

**Digital Billboards** – Cities may have space on digital billboards or reader boards that can display the campaign message or images. A BIG thanks to these cities: Costa Mesa, Garden Grove, Huntington Beach, and Placentia.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### Placentia Police hires an Emergency Services Coordinator

The City of Placentia Police Department recently hired Steven Torrence as the City's new Emergency Services Coordinator. Steven comes to the City of Placentia from the Rancho Cucamonga Fire District where he served as a Fire Prevention Specialist who oversaw fire mitigation for the City of Rancho Cucamonga.

As the Emergency Services Coordinator, Steven leads the City's efforts to prepare, mitigate, respond, and recover from a wide variety of natural and human-induced emergencies. Although the position is held in the Police Department, the Emergency Services Division is tasked with bringing all departments together to facilitate a coordinated and systematic response to a local emergency.

Additional duties that fall under the auspice of the Emergency Services Coordinator is the oversight of the City's Emergency Operations Center, facilitating emergency preparedness training for city staff, ensuring the citizens and businesses of Placentia have the capacity to resist or recover from a local emergency; and coordinating the response efforts of volunteer groups such as C.E.R.T. and R.A.C.E.S.

The Emergency Services Coordinator brings all of these efforts together by writing and maintaining the City's Emergency Operations Plan and Local Hazard Mitigation Plan. These federally mandated documents are the core of the City's response to local emergencies, and the main tools that are needed to ensure an effective and coordinated recovery for every individual in the City of Placentia.

## **Significant Emergency Incidents**

### **Laguna Woods**

July 13: at 0836 hours, units were dispatched to reports of smoke in a unit at the Laguna Woods Towers. Engine 222 arrived on scene and began making access to the fifth floor. Battalion 4 assumed Tower IC. At 0854 hours, Engine 222 advised food on the stove and the fire appeared to be out. Occupants on the fifth floor were evacuated to the lobby. There were no reported injuries and the cause of the fire was deemed accidental.

### **Newport Coast Unincorporated**

July 13: at 1010 hours, a remote response was dispatched to reports of a patient passed out. OC Sheriff's Duke inserted a rescuer and made patient contact. After assessing the patient, it was determined that ground transport would be appropriate. Newport Beach Engine 68 utilized their utility to transport the patient to Fire Station 47, where the patient was loaded into a ground ambulance. The patient was then transported to a local area hospital. OCFA was assisted by units from Laguna Beach Fire and Newport Beach Fire.

### Santa Ana

July 13: at 1122 hours, units were dispatched to reports of a roof fire. Truck 71 arrived on scene and reported a vegetation fire to the rear of a structure. Battalion 9 arrived on scene and established River IC. At 1142 hours, the IC advised that it was a vegetation fire only; no structures. The fire was declared under control at 1148 hours.

### Cleveland National Forest

The patient was airlifted and the ground response was cancelled.

### Rancho Santa Margarita

July 14: at 1334 hours, a remote response was dispatched to reports of a hiker with a medical emergency. Ground units along with OCFA and OC Sheriff's aircraft were enroute. OC Sheriff's Duke located the patient and inserted rescuers to assess the patient. It was determined that there was no medical emergency. The patient was airlifted to a nearby park where she was met by a ground unit and transported back to her vehicle.
