Household Hazardous Waste Disposal

If you have household hazardous waste items to get rid of you may take your items to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center located at 1071 North Blue Gum Street, Anaheim. Their hours of operation are Tuesday through Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

This facility is closed on rainy days and major holidays. Household hazardous waste is only accepted in original containers with a limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds per vehicle.

Typical items accepted at the Collection Center include: used motor oil, used oil filters, pesticides/herbicides, paint (latex & oil base), flammables/combustibles, antifreeze, batteries, household chemicals, and household items that contains cathode ray tubes. Nearly all computer monitors and televisions contain CRTs. If a CRT is not working properly or if a charitable organization will not accept it, the collection center will now accept these. Stormwater Tips for Fall Projects

Whether your fall project is a new coat of paint, a thorough house cleaning, or major remodeling, taking some simple preventative measures will keep the waste materials that might be created, from polluting our environment.

PAINTING: Prevent spills by placing your opened paint cans into secondary containment such as a cat litter box or an old cookie sheet. It is imperative that you do not hose down spilled paint.

LANDSCAPING: Protect stockpiles of materials from wind and rain by covering them with tarps or plastic sheeting. Deliveries of soil, sand or fertilizer must not be unloaded onto the street or gutter.

CONCRETE: When demolishing existing pavement, remove and recycle all the waste concrete chunks. You can call Placentia Disposal, Inc. at (714) 238-3300 for assistance with obtaining a waste bin that will suit your needs. Do not wash concrete mixers or pumps into the gutter or street.

Citizen's Police Academy

Window Replacements – What to Expect and Ask of Your Contractor

Like many cities, the City of Placentia requires homeowners and/or contractors to pull permits when replacing or retrofitting windows in a home. Most reputable window replacement companies understand this requirement, but some may try to skip this critical step which leaves you, the homeowner, ultimately responsible.

Replacing your windows is a good improvement to make. The advantages include increased energy efficiency, noise reduction, better visual appearance and increased value to your home. Window replacement may seem like a quick and simple task – and many times it is only a day's worth of work. However, the California Building and Fire Codes have requirements for both window area and egress (the ability to exit through a window space) that must be maintained.

If you are thinking of replacing your windows, make sure to ask your contractor or installer about building permits. The answer should be that all window replacements require permits and inspection. That fact may help you determine what type of window replacement is best for your home. When choosing a window type, make sure to measure the distance from the floor to the window sill. The Codes state that the distance from floor to sill, which includes the frame, can be no more than 44 inches for the primary window of egress (exit) from a bedroom. Additionally, the open width cannot be less than 20 inches nor less than 24 inches in height and the overall window opening less than 5.7 square feet in area. This is important because often a replacement window fills in the frame of an older window, thereby adding an inch or more to that critical distance from the floor and reducing the overall area. While an inch may not seem like a lot, in an emergency such as a fire, an additional inch could be the difference for a person to exit safely. Taking from the old adage, "measure twice, replace once," make sure your window replacement choice is the best fit for your window location.

If you are thinking of replacing your windows, please visit the City of Placentia Building Division. Window replacement permits cost \$105.00 for each group of five windows. Additional fees equate to \$3.81 per every \$1,000 of valuation. For a typical window replacement project, total building permit and inspection fees are generally less than \$300.

Recently Adopted Dog Ordinance

The City receives complaints on a regular basis from sports organizations and residents regarding the issue of dog waste being left behind at various athletic fields and playground areas throughout the City. Although the majority of responsible dog owners pick up after their dogs, some owners do not. Several measures have been attempted to curb this improper use of fields and playground areas, including enforcement of leash laws, signage, and direct communication with dog owners. Nevertheless, the problem continues to occur. Due to health and safety concerns, the City Council has recently adopted an Ordinance that prohibits dogs from athletic fields and playground areas. The Ordinance does not prohibit dogs in other areas of the park. Dog owners may continue to walk dogs on leashes and enjoy City parks with their dogs. Guide dogs, service dogs, and signal dogs are exempt from this Ordinance. For additional information, please call the Community Services Department at (714) 993-8184.

Graffiti Hotline

Placentia residents are eligible for FREE recycling of their used engine, transmission and gear oil, plastic motor oil bottles, oil filters and oily rags from their homes. New Carbon Monoxide Alarm Requirements

According to the American Medical Association, carbon monoxide poisoning is the leading cause of accidental poisoning deaths in the United States. Effective July 1, 2011, a new State law may help prevent senseless carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning in the home. CO is formed from the incomplete lighting of any flame-fueled device, including ranges, ovens, clothes dryers, furnaces, fireplaces, grills, space heaters, vehicles, and water heaters. Carbon monoxide can be dangerous – when inhaled, it passes from the lungs into the hemoglobin molecules of red blood cells. The result is that the body becomes oxygen-starved, which can lead to tissue damage and death.

Per California Senate Bill 183, as of July 1, 2011, all existing single family homes must have carbon monoxide alarms. All other types of residences (apartments, condominiums, etc.) will need carbon monoxide alarms beginning January 1, 2013. The law does not designate local fire departments as enforcing agencies.

Energy Efficiency Ideas for Fall

With the change of seasons and winter approaching, why not take the time now to ensure that your home is well insulated and energy efficient? Simple items around the house will help keep you comfortable in your home this winter while reducing your energy bills.

Conserving energy is made simple with today's available technology. Simply replacing all of your incandescent light bulbs with compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs will provide you savings of over 50% for lighting alone. A 75 watt incandescent bulb can be replaced with a 20 watt compact fluorescent bulb for example. Switching your outside lighting is also another great way to save energy and it lessens the need to replace burned out bulbs. CFLs come in all lighting styles to include flood lights and yellow bug lights. CFLs are also available for dimmable fixtures!

A great way to reduce your energy bills is to insulate or re-insulate your attic and exterior walls. Many older homes do not have exterior wall insulation. Fortunately, there are many firms which are experienced with blow-in insulation for walls and attics, often taking only days to complete the project. Wall insulation reduces heat loss during the winter and also reduces exterior noise intrusion. Check with the Gas Company or Southern California Edison for rebates related to insulation options.

City Partners up with Clean City to Remove Graffiti on Private Property

Graffiti is a problem that affects both public and private property. Both graffiti prevention and removal are time consuming, expensive and require continuous intervention. Graffiti hurts property values, drives away business, and sends the message that nobody cares about the community. The City is responsible for graffiti removal on public property which includes City facilities, parks, street signs and drainage structures. However, due to liability and private property issues, individual property owners are responsible for the removal of graffiti on their own property. Any graffiti on private property must be removed as soon as possible to deter the taggers from tagging it again. The longer the graffiti is up, the longer taggers will keep vandalizing the site.

Studies show that quick removal of graffiti is an effective crime prevention tool. The City's objective is to remove graffiti from public property within 24 hours after being reported. Under the City's Municipal Code, private property owners are required to remove graffiti within 36 hours after receiving written notice from the City. If a property owner fails to remove graffiti from their property within the required time frame, the City can, after proper notice is given, enter the property and remove the graffiti. If the City is required to remove the graffiti from a person's property then will be billed for the cost of the removal plus any additional administrative fees that may apply.

To assist property owners with the removal of graffiti on their homes or businesses, the City has teamed up

Library Director's Message

Our budget for FY 2011-2012 was approved by the Library Board of Trustees on May 16, 2011. It is based on a projected revenue of \$2,082,447 of which 88% is from property tax, 6.5% entrepreneurial revenue, and 5.5% surplus from fiscal year 2010-2011. Entrepreneurial revenue includes passports, test proctoring, and rentals. Recently Governor Brown presented his budget which involves a drastic reduction in public library funding, resulting in a possible 50% cut to Placentia Library District funds from the State. Our FY 2011-2012 budget accounted for this anticipated loss. Thankfully our Placentia Library Friends Foundation provides invaluable funding to support many of the Library's programs such as the computer lab, storytime for autistic children, book discussions, Easter Egg excitement, and the Summer Reading Celebration just to name a few.

Some accomplishments of FY 2010-2011 include:

- Replacements and upgrades of public and staff computers
- Replacement of the entrance automatic door
- Re-flooring of entrance and lobby area
- Thorough deep cleaning of the entire library including bookshelves, carpet, air ducts, and vents
- ADA service desks for the Circulation and Reference departments
- Art gallery display by the checkout desk
- Expansion of fiction collection
- Gordon and Dixie Shaw Children's Library dedication

The Library Board of Trustees and library staff dedicated themselves to preparing and adopting a budget that is fiscally conservative while sustaining library programs and services at the current level. The collaborative efforts resulted in no reduction in workforce

and a renewed commitment to strengthen our community partnerships.

Your Placentia Library District has consistently received high marks for the services and programs offered and as patrons look to us to provide internet access, downloadable e-collections, free programs for children, resources to improve business skills, literacy assistance, a community meeting place, accessibility to historical information, and even passport services, we work diligently to maintain the level of services you've come to expect.

I am proud of the budget we presented and even prouder of the successes your library has achieved thus far. We will continue to provide great service while remaining responsive to your needs in a rapidly changing technological world.

On October 15, 2011 the City of Placentia will be celebrating "A Blast From Our Past" at the 47th Annual Heritage Festival. The day will begin with the Chamber of Commerce Pancake Breakfast from 6:30 a.m.-10:00 a.m. at Tri-City Park. The Parade will begin at 9:30 a.m. and travel from Morse Avenue north on Kraemer to Tri-City Park. The parade will feature over 200 parade entries including bands, marching groups, VIPs, clowns and non-profit organizations. Parade bands will be judged prior to entering the parade line-up at the Band Review held on Palm Avenue. Band Review judging will begin at 9:00 a.m.


