Military Banner Recognition Program

On **Tuesday, July 24th** the Placentia City Council approved the Placentia Military Banner Recognition Program. The program, known as Placentia "Hometown Heroes," honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as an active-duty member in a full-time capacity in the United States Armed Forces. Branches of service include Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, and Navy. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia, or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia.


The banner will be installed along Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years. The City will not be responsible for replacing banners that are stolen, damaged, destroyed due to sun, weather, vandalism or any act of nature beyond our control such as high winds.

Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application.

Applications will be accepted from **August 1st** to **September 30th** each year, allowing time for the banners to be ordered and installed during the month of November in the same year. The cost to display each customized banner is \$260 and each service person is allowed one banner. Applications can be submitted to the Placentia Police Department.

Annual Turfgrass Renovation Program

The City performs annual turfgrass renovations in public parkways and parks from September to October. Currently, the City's landscape maintenance contractors are lowering the grass blade height in the parkways and parks to be followed up by dethatching, aerification, fresh grass seed, and fertilizer. The purpose for this annual process is to promote healthy turf grass and improved sports field playing surfaces by reducing compaction/ stress conditions, which will offer greater water penetration and reduce runoff. As part of this process, the grass in the areas being treated will be dry and brown in the initial stages. This is only temporary, and the grass will naturally return to a healthy condition once the process is complete. This annual turf renovation is estimated to be completed by December. Update on Citywide Traffic Signal Repair Project

Early this month, the City started its Citywide Traffic Signal Repair Project, a Capital Improvement Project to upgrade and repair our traffic signal equipment to improve traffic circulation and reduce congestion. These repairs include replacement of damaged traffic signal loop detectors, repair malfunctioning video detection cameras, replacement of damaged or malfunctioning signal cabinets as well as replace damaged wiring and upgrading electrical lines. These upgrades will alleviate a number of the routine complaints we receive from the public on malfunctioning traffic signals.



As part of this project, the following traffic signals at Kraemer Boulevard/Chapman Avenue are scheduled to be offline between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., on **September 28th & October 1st**.

During these scheduled traffic signal outages, the flashing red signal will not be functional since this work involves upgrading electrical lines for the signals. There will be stop signs in place at these intersections. For the duration of the repairs, each intersection will function as a four-way stop. Please proceed with caution and enter the intersection when it is safe to do so. Remember to always yield to pedestrians. We encourage the public to find an alternate route during this time and apologize for any inconvenience.

Please note that these dates and times may change due to field conditions or unforeseen circumstances. We will provide updates regarding changes to the project schedule. Safe Medication Disposal Box at the Placentia Civic Center

The Placentia Police Department and the Rite Aid Foundation have forged a new partnership to provide the residents of Placentia with a Safe Medication Disposal Box at the Placentia Civic Center. The Safe Medication Disposal Box was installed in the Civic Center parking lot to help prevent the exposure of prescription medications to children and youth within our community. The Placentia Police Department understands that many children have unrestricted access to prescription drugs within their homes, and this may ultimately lead to prescription drug use and addiction as they age. Limiting the amount of accidental ingestions and un-prescribed medication use is critical to the members of our community and the Placentia Police Department; therefore, the Placentia Police Department believes that a proactive approach to limiting accidents and abuse throughout our community is in the best interest of our entire community.

In the past, Placentia Police Department has worked with the Department of Justice – Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) to conduct the DEA – Take Back Day. Take Back Day has been successful each year; however, the Police Department would like to provide our community with a readily available option for prescription drug disposals year-round.


The Safe Medication Disposal Box is located in the parking lot of Placentia City Hall, 401 E. Chapman Ave, Placentia California, 92870. The prescription medication box has been installed in the parking lot for easy, drive-up disposal of prescription medications. The following items are accepted in the drop-off box:

- Legally-prescribed medication
- Over-the-counter medication

The following may not be disposed of in the Safe Medication Drop:

- Illegal Drugs
- Needles (any type)
- Lotions and Liquids
- Inhalers and/or Aerosols

The Placentia Police Department urges residents to go through their homes and bring unused, expired, or excess prescription drugs to the Safe Medication Disposal Box. The drop box is available in the Civic Center parking lot 24-hours a day, 7-days a week. Placentia Police Department Front Counter Hours of Operation

The Placentia Police Department has changed their front counter hours of operation. Starting on **September 24th**, the lobby hours will be Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., and closed on Sundays.

With the implementation of these new hours, the following guidelines apply:

- Persons who have come to the Department for assistance after business hours should use the service phone affixed to the wall south of the front doors. This phone calls directly into the Police Communications Center.
- Anyone whose immediate safety is in jeopardy shall be met immediately by Police Staff and brought into the lobby.
- Victims who come after hours and report non-violent crimes or other non-urgent matters shall still be assisted in the Civic Center courtyard or they can simply wait in their vehicle for an Officer to arrive. For those persons living in the City, they can also elect to have an Officer meet them at their residence
- Persons requesting citation sign offs, copies of reports, parking permits, etc. are asked to come in during normal business hours.






