Do you know what to do in the event of a disaster? Are you prepared if a disaster were to occur and effect your home? If the answer to these questions is "NO", enroll in the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Training to increase your local disaster awareness. CERT Training is FREE and open to anyone interested in learning about how they can be an effective responder in their community. In this 20-hour curriculum approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), participants will learn how to:

- Identify and anticipate hazards in the community
- Prevent and mitigate fire hazards in the home and workplace
- Extinguish small fires
- Assist emergency responders
- Set up medical treatment areas
- Provide disaster first aid
- Help reduce survivor stress

Classes will be held Tuesdays and Thursdays evenings from 6:30 PM - 10:00 PM beginning October 2nd. The course will conclude with one Saturday session on October 20th from 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM. MILITARY BANNER RECOGNITION PROGRAM

On July 24, 2018 the Placentia City Council approved the Placentia Military Banner Recognition Program. The program honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as an active-duty member in a full-time capacity in the United States Armed Forces. Branches of service include Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, and Navy. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia, or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia.

Applications will be accepted from August 1st to September 30th each year, allowing time for the banners to be ordered and installed during the month of November in the same year. The cost to display each customized banner is \$260 and each serviceperson is allowed one banner. The banner will be installed along Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years.

The City will not be responsible for replacing banners that are stolen, damaged, destroyed due to sun, weather, vandalism or any act of nature beyond our control such as high winds. Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application.



UPDATE ON OUR FISCAL SUSTAINABILITY EFFORTS

The City Council adopted the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Operating Budget and 2018-2025 Capital Improvement Program Budget on June 19, 2018. The budget process presented a uniquely challenging environment and opportunity for the City Council and the community to provide input on the financial direction of the City, and to begin to decide whether to take the steps necessary to secure a locally-controlled funding source to protect and maintain essential services the community relies upon. Thank you to the hundreds of residents who have participated to date through community meetings and our online survey. We were gratified to hear that the community values the work that we do and the services our City provides.

Placentia is a community where active citizen engagement is welcomed and encouraged. Therefore, it is only fitting that as part of this year's budget process, City Staff continued to build on recent community engagement efforts. Through these efforts and a recent community survey study completed in late spring, the community has identified the following priorities:

- Repairing and maintaining potholes, streets and sidewalks
- Maintaining rapid 911 emergency medical responses
- Maintaining our local, Placentia Police Department which guarantees proactive neighborhood police patrols and Police Officers
- Reducing gang activity and drug related crimes
- Keeping our City safe, clean and free of graffiti
- Avoiding deep cuts in other quality of life services such as fire protection, emergency services and maintenance of our parks and public facilities

In order to maintain these services and the quality of life our residents expect and deserve, the City will need to secure a reliable source of local revenue that can't be taken by the State. Since 1992, the State of California has taken \$32.8 million from the City. In addition, Placentia has experienced a decline in revenue for two consecutive years. Staff cut \$2.7 million from the General Fund to achieve a balanced budget

for this Fiscal Year. In order to achieve these cuts, eleven (11) vacant full-time equivalent positions were eliminated from this year's budget, which includes 6,444 part-time hours. In addition, several recreational programs were significantly reduced, including closing some of the City's community centers down to operating only one day per week. Additionally, the operating hours of our City swimming pools were cut and the City eliminated the National Night Out community-wide event and reduced our Concerts in the Park series.

While Staff has made every effort to minimize the effect on services, some of the cuts shown above impact our residents on a daily basis. The City seeks to continue maintaining the essential services that protect our residents' quality of life, such as our local police department, fire protection, 911 emergency response times, repairing potholes and streets, and other services that make our City a great place to live.

While the adopted Capital Improvement Program budget is just over \$10.3 million, it does not reflect a shortfall of \$6.1 million. These funds are required annually to maintain the City's infrastructure. This critical deferred maintenance includes:

- Streets and Roads – an additional \$3.7 million required annually
- Facilities and Parks – \$700,000 to \$900,000 per year
- Vehicles and Equipment - \$300,000 per year

It is important to note that there has been extensive and independent financial review and determination by the following entities that the City needs additional revenue in order to maintain quality services and critical infrastructure. These entities include:

- Citizens Fiscal Sustainability Task Force
- City's Auditors
- California State Auditor's Office
- Bond Rating Agencies



Undoubtedly, much work lies ahead to reach our goal of maintaining the City's long-term financial stability and the essential public safety and street and road repair projects our residents desire. To do so, we must achieve financial independence and maintain local control over funding that can't be taken by the state.

In response to these ongoing challenges, on March 3, 2015 the City Council created a Citizens Fiscal Sustainability Task Force and appointed seven members. The main goal of the Task Force was to develop a methodology to assess the City's fiscal sustainability status, identify areas of concern, solicit and evaluate expenditure reduction and revenue enhancement options from the Community, City Council and Staff and report their findings to the City Council. The Task Force conducted over 30 public meetings over a 2 ½ year period. Each public meeting lasted between two and three hours. The Task Force reviewed several financial reports and studies. On September 19, 2017, the Task Force presented a final comprehensive report to the City Council.

The final report included the following recommendations:

- Implementing cost-cutting and emergency reserve measures (the majority of which have now been implemented)
- Identifying options for revenue generation (several have been implemented)
- Continue to engage citizens on our fiscal sustainability efforts (over 40 community meetings have been conducted along with an online survey and quality of life survey of the community)

As a part of the outreach process, the City Council requested that the Task Force along with Staff host community meetings this past Fall to engage residents on the City's fiscal challenges and discuss community priorities and revenue solutions. In those meetings an informal survey was conducted to determine interest in examining a variety of potential locally-controlled revenue solutions designed to make the City more fiscally sustainable. In addition, over the past few months, City Staff has facilitated community conversation meetings with residents and service organizations about the City's fiscal condition and obtained input on service priorities and potential long-term revenue solutions.

As a result of the final report received from the Task Force along with feedback received from the residents of Placentia and service groups, the City Council at their July 24th meeting, unanimously approved (5-0) placing a local, one percent (1 cent) Transactions and Use ("Sales" Tax) on the November 6th ballot for residents to consider. This ballot measure will allow Placentia residents to decide whether or not to approve a locally-enacted revenue measure to ensure that the City is able to maintain the vital services our community has identified. In addition, this measure, if approved by the voters would ensure that any local revenue received is protected from the State of California and all funds would go directly to Placentia.

A TRANSFORMING OPPORTUNITY COMES TO PLACENTIA'S TRANSIT ORIENTED PACKING HOUSE DISTRICT

The City of Placentia is utilizing a unique opportunity provided by a state-of-the-art Metrolink Station (Station) and 246-space parking structure within the Old Town Placentia area to transform the Transit-Oriented/Packing House District (near Melrose Street and Crowther Avenue) into an active, vibrant destination. Transit-oriented development, or TOD, is a type of community development that includes a mixture of housing, office, retail and/or other amenities integrated into a walkable neighborhood and located within a half-mile of a mass transit station. To help this transformation, The Placentia City Council approved an amendment to the Zoning Code with specific standards to allow a mixed use, pedestrian oriented retail and residential district, creating new development opportunities for a one-of-a-kind destination. It will also support existing retail and restaurant businesses while growing the City's local economy. The Station is scheduled to be operational by late 2020 and the first TOD development project will be under construction in September 2018. At the June 27, 2016 Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Board of Directors Meeting, the Board Members approved the funding and cooperative agreement for the construction of the newest Metrolink Station in Orange County and a new parking structure. Councilmember Craig Green, Mayor Wanke and former Councilmember Scott Nelson along with City Administrator Damien R. Arrula and other City staff were present at the Board meeting along with several representatives from the Placentia Chamber of Commerce, Placentia Santa Fe Merchants Association, and Cal State Fullerton's Transportation Department.

The Cooperative Agreement was presented at the July 12, 2016 Placentia City Council meeting for final approval. The Agreement was unanimously approved by the City Council.

Once constructed, this will be the 13th station serving the 91 Line which runs from Union Station in Downtown Los Angeles to Downtown Riverside. The Placentia Metrolink Station will be the closest station in proximity to Cal State Fullerton and will provide local residents and employees with an alternative to the Fullerton Metrolink Station.

The total cost of the project is \$35 million, of which the City will contribute \$5.4 million. The following is the tentative project delivery schedule:






