The proposed site under consideration is located at 527 Fee Ana Street, which is located in an industrial portion of the City. ### “Pump Up” Placentia!

The City of Placentia has partnered with Galaxy Oil Company to operate the Placentia Gas Station, also known as “Best 4 Less 76” gasoline station at 480 S. Placentia Avenue (northeast corner of Placentia and Crowther Avenue). Through this partnership with Galaxy Oil, a portion of the revenue generated by the gas station will go directly back to the City for critical services including Police, Fire, and Public Works projects. This will greatly assist the City with infrastructure maintenance such as roads and facility improvements. The City encourages all residents and visitors to fuel their vehicles at the 76 Gasoline Station and “Pump Up Placentia” by putting money directly back into your local services. ### Mayor Shader Presents “Do the Right Thing” Award to Resident Carole Nixon

At the February 19<sup>th</sup> meeting, City Council recognized 49 year resident Carole Nixon with the “Do the Right Thing” Award. The “Do the Right Thing” Award recognizes the everyday heroes in our community actively adding value to the City of Placentia. In 1986, Carole became involved with the Heritage Committee, began serving as Treasurer in 1991 and has held the position ever since. Carole re-started the Band competition in 1998 and this year will mark the 21<sup>st</sup> Band Review. Carole has worked hard to make this one of the best Band Competitions in Southern California and ensures that students have a fun experience. The last few years, Carole has had approximately 30 bands competing even in the heat or rain. Her daughter Patti Martin is continuing the Heritage tradition by being the most recent appointee to the Committee.



### Council Recognizes Police Explorer Poornima Somaiah for Achievement in Competition

At the February 19<sup>th</sup> meeting, City Council recognized Explorer Poornima Somaiah for her achievements at a recent Explorer Competition. The City of Placentia sent the Police Explorer Post to Chandler, Arizona, where over 900 Explorers from 60 Posts competed. Explorer competitions allow Explorer Posts from around the country to compete in scenarios and the Chandler Tactical Competition is known as one of the most difficult. Explorers are evaluated on safety, communication, teamwork, identification of threats, decision making, command presence and leadership. Explorer Poornima Somaiah competed against hundreds of Explorers and Explorer Advisors and placed fourth in the Female Category of the 5K Run.



### Village Plaza Center Update 1

The Village Plaza shopping center has initiated the first phase of a two-phase development and façade enhancement project. To kick start the project, the former 8,370-square foot "El Torito" restaurant building was demolished late December 2018 to accommodate a new multi-tenant pad building at the southeast corner of Yorba Linda Boulevard and Kraemer Boulevard.



The building will be approximately 7,000 square feet and designed to accommodate three fast-casual restaurants with one tenant space designated for a 2,500-square foot coffee shop with a drive-through.

### Cont'd Village Plaza Center Update 1

The building will be enhanced by incorporating Spanish style architecture which will feature such design elements as clay tile, smooth stucco finishes, and decorative metalwork along each of the building facades. The new building will be sited adjacent to the intersection of Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard. The siting of the building is intended to facilitate a strong pedestrian connection between the public right-of-way and the proposed pad building. The building is anticipated to be fully constructed and operational by the beginning of summer, but you may contact the Development Services Department to receive updates on the status of the project at (714) 993-8124.

### Sierra Vista Plaza Façade Upgrade Update

The Sierra Vista Plaza Shopping Center, located on the southeast corner of N. Placentia Avenue and W. Bastanchury Road, has been in the process of upgrading the architectural façade. Over the last several years, the shopping center has lacked an anchor tenant, but with Grocery Outlet coming in as the new tenant, the expansion of existing Crunch Fitness, and the façade improvement of the entire plaza, the revitalization of the shopping center is sure to enhance our great city.

The shopping center will be upgraded by the addition of two outside dining areas next to B&C Burger and K&M Donuts and dedicated handicap crossings to the main building. The remodel will also include the addition of 10 handicap spaces and six electric vehicle charging stations. The shopping center buildings will be refaced with smooth stucco and added LED lighting on the top of the anchor tenants. The monument sign will be remodeled to match the new façade, with changing color LED lights for better viewing and added visual interest.



The City is looking forward to the revival of this neighborhood shopping center. Completion of this remodel is expected to be finished by March 2019. You may contact the Development Services Department to receive updates on the status of this project at (714) 993-8124.

### Old Town Façade Improvement Program

On December 5, 2017, the City Council approved the Old Town Façade Improvement Program (Program). The Program provides financial assistance in the form of a grant to commercial property and/or business owners to make facade improvements to the exterior of their commercial buildings located within Old Town Placentia District. The program is designed to enhance economic opportunities in Old Town Placentia, and to encourage additional investment in the City's historic area. The goal is to create a pedestrian-friendly, aesthetically pleasing environment for residents, visitors and tourists, and generate substantial economic benefits for merchants and property owners as a result of increased investment in this area.

The project at 116 W. Santa Fe Avenue is currently underway. Created and painted by [Tracey Moloney](#), the project consists of a mural depicting Old Town Placentia and key City landmarks.



The project also includes new gooseneck lighting and synthetic ivy across the base of the wall facing Bradford Avenue. To date, the installation of the synthetic ivy and new gooseneck lighting have been completed. The mural continues to make great progress, as seen above. This week, the sketching of the drawing and filling in of the first round of colors was completed. The City will continue providing updates on this project.

Funding for the Program is derived from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) that is administered by the County of Orange. The funding allocation for this program is based on annual allocations provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

### Compost Giveaway on Mach 30, 2019

The City of Placentia and Republic Services will hold its annual Free Compost Giveaway for residents of Placentia at Tri-City Park on Saturday, March 30, from 8:00 a.m. until 10:30 a.m. (or until the compost runs out). This event provides an opportunity to give back and thank residents for their participation in the City's green waste recycling program. Residents must bring in their own containers (no bags please) to receive the loose compost. There is a limit of 60 gallons per household, while supplies last.



Compost creates healthier soil by adding organic matter and improving soil structure. Healthy soil uses water more efficiently, allowing available water to flow toward your plants' roots, storing water in the soil longer, and reducing runoff and erosion. To receive free compost, residents must provide proof of residency (California driver's license or utility bill). ## Vehicle-Residential Burglary Suspect Attempt to Identify/Locate



### DETAILS:

On Tuesday, February 5, 2019, between approximately 1900-1930 hours, in the area of Livingston Ave and Kingston Rd in the City of Placentia, the above pictured suspect is believed to have been involved in several attempted and/or successful vehicle and/or residential burglaries. It appears the suspect went from house to house searching vehicles parked in driveways. In one incident, the victim reported that someone attempted to open the locked front door to her residence. The suspect then made entry into her garage through an unlocked exterior service door, then entered her unlocked vehicle parked in her garage. No suspect vehicle has been seen. Based on the known incident locations, it is possible that the suspect is walking through the neighborhood(s) in the area.

### Suspect description:

Male, White, approximately 18-20 years old, wearing a blue hooded sweatshirt with the word "TRITONS" in yellow writing across the front, a dark hat with a red brim, blue floral shorts with pink flowers, and brown shoes with white soles. He appears to have tattoos on his lower legs. The tattoos appear to wrap around his lower left leg and he has a tattoo on his right calf.

### Vehicle Burglary Suspect – Attempt to Identify/Locate



#### DETAILS:

On Saturday, January 26, at approximately 0426 hours, on the 1700 block of St James Place in the City of Placentia, the above pictured suspect was seen on the reporting party's security camera attempting to open the locked driver's door on his daughter's vehicle. The suspect was then seen riding his bike next door to the reporting party's neighbor's vehicle where he was able to make entry into the vehicle through the unlocked front passenger door. That vehicle was ransacked, but it is unknown if there was any loss. The suspect then went to the next house, looked into the driver's side of the vehicle using a flashlight, attempted to open the locked driver's door, then rode off on his bicycle (pictured above).


