Fire Protection & Emergency Medical Services Update

In our continued effort to maintain and enhance rapid emergency response times and ensure a high level of these life-saving services over the long-term for our residents, the City has been undertaking a competitive process to solicit proposals from qualified service providers for fire protection services and emergency medical services.

Over the last two months, the City encouraged qualified service providers to submit competitive proposals to ensure the City can maintain and enhance rapid emergency response times well into the future. The proposal period has officially ended, and proposals were received on February 28th.

An independent Proposal Review Panel comprised of nationally-renowned experts in Fire and Emergency Medical Services, local leaders, community members and City officials will be recommending service providers to the City Council for consideration in May.



Placentia has a responsibility to its residents to ensure local fire protection and paramedic services are high-quality and are continually improving- as well as financially sustainable for our residents over the long term.

We look forward to updating you on the progress of the City’s process to examine new and innovative ways to improve high-quality emergency response programs and service models while ensuring the cost to provide those programs are reasonable and sustainable for our community.

Addressing Homelessness in Placentia and North orange County

Based on the local mandate presided upon by U.S. District Federal Judge David Carter, North Orange County cities (NOC cities) are required to work on a homeless housing plan for the region, which shall include creating Navigation Centers designed to house and service NOC cities' homeless population. The requirement for NOC cities is to create Navigation Centers that would provide comprehensive supportive services including vocational services, recreational services, mental health, transportation services and 200 beds to the homeless residents of the North Orange County region. Additionally, the City's ability to address homelessness has been further diminished based upon the *Martin v. Boise* (2018) ruling by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals on September 2nd, 2018. The ruling asserted that the City of Boise's camping and disorderly conduct ordinance was unconstitutional, relying upon the U.S. Supreme Court precedent that it is cruel and unusual to criminalize a person's status, as opposed to his or her conduct. Ultimately, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that these types of Ordinances violated the Eighth Amendment when enforced against those who have been forced to sleep outdoors because they cannot obtain shelter.



The City has thus far utilized a variety of tools to enforce the City's anti-camping laws while at the same time providing compassion to the homeless population. The City has established a Homeless Task Force comprised of Mayor Pro Tem Ward Smith, City Staff, HIS House, Cal Trans, BNSF, Department of Transportation and the California Highway Patrol. The Task Force meets bi-weekly and as a result has initiated enforcement and clean up along areas near the 57 freeway and rail road tracks. Despite these collaborative efforts, the homeless population continues to grow.

If cities do not comply with the mandate to add emergency housing, they will be susceptible to significant litigation. The cities of [Irvine](#), [Aliso Viejo](#), [Dana Point](#), [San Clemente](#) and [San Juan Capistrano received a lawsuit](#) on Wednesday, February 27th which focused on lack of shelters and the criminalization of homeless people forced to sleep in public. Cities will not legally be able to enforce their anti-camping ordinance to keep the homeless from creating an encampment in public areas, such as city halls, senior centers, parks and neighborhood sidewalks, including sidewalks in front of residents' very own homes.

In response to these Federal requirements and court decisions, and to ensure that the City maintains local control over enforcement of its own anti-camping ordinance in public areas, including public sidewalks, the City of Placentia along with the NOC cities have identified two potential locations for Navigation Centers – one in Placentia and one in Buena Park. On Tuesday January 15th, 2019 the City Council approved an Exclusive Negotiating Agreement to conduct a due diligence review on a proposed Navigation Center at 527 Fee Ana Street, which is located in an industrial zone portion of the City. City Administrator Damien Arrula provided a comprehensive presentation to the City Council and the public on homelessness in Placentia and encampment areas throughout the City. After extensive Council discussion, the Council agreed to have Staff further analyze homelessness in the City, conduct its due diligence on the proposed site and conduct meetings to receive feedback from the community.

Cont'd Addressing Homelessness in Placentia and North Orange County

The proposed location at 527 Fee Ana Street was determined by identifying a location that is suitable for safely housing persons that are experiencing homelessness as well as addressing the following factors:

- ◆ Siting for Industrial zone (meets SB2 zone criteria)
- ◆ Property is available for purchase and can accommodate up to 100 beds per Federal lawsuit
- ◆ Proximity to residential areas
- ◆ Cost of construction, suitable security and operational plan, and well managed wraparound services.

In addition, the proposed Navigation Center will be contingent upon receiving additional grant funding for construction improvements, operations and maintenance of the Navigation Centers.

The management and operational plan for the Navigation Centers will specify certain requirements to ensure local control for providing safe and secure housing as well as providing comprehensive programs and services. The Navigation Centers will be referral-only based facilities with managed and controlled access in and out via transportation only. The proposed Navigation Centers will work not only to house the homeless, but to provide health resources, job and social skills, and opportunities to reunite with family and friends, with the goal of integrating North Orange County's homeless to become productive members of society while decreasing the number of homeless in public areas.

The City of Placentia hosted two community meetings to further discuss the proposed Placentia Navigation Center, provide a history of homelessness, and give attendees the opportunity to voice their concerns about the project.

The City has partnered with Nixle to provide an Emergency Notification System to alert residents in real-time about critical emergency information and relevant community advisories in Placentia. Notifications may be sent for emergency updates, crime alerts, power outages, road closures, construction advisories, and weather-related issues such as flooding. Subscribers have the ability to select how they would like to receive notifications. These alerts can be sent to a home, cell or business phone, email, text message or hearing impaired receiving devices at no cost to the subscriber. To register, residents or business owners in Placentia can simply text 92870 to 888777 from a mobile phone. Once registered, residents will receive a confirmation text message. Mayor Shader Presents “Do the Right Thing” Award to Brothers Larry & Pat Walters

Brothers Larry and Pat Walters moved to Placentia in 1959 and come from a family dedicated to the Placentia community. Their father delivered mail in Placentia for 28 years and was honored as the Placentia Senior Citizen Volunteer in 2013. Their brother, Mike, is honored on the Placentia Veterans Monument and their sister, Donna, has been the Placentia Community Chorus Director for the last 15 years.

Larry and Pat contacted Staff in early January 2019 regarding the poor field conditions at Champions Sports Complex and Tuffree Park and expressed their willingness to assist with the costs of aerating the top soil at these fields. Larry and Pat organized a “Field Day” event on Sunday, March 3rd and recruited over 50 volunteers consisting of parents, coaches and youth to address many of the field issues. The “Field Day” project prepared a safe playing surface for over 800 youth who participate in Pony Baseball at Champions and Tuffree fields.

Grading and Construction Underway for the Placentia Veterans Village

The City of Placentia, in partnership with the County of Orange, Mercy Housing California, and New Directions for Veterans, has made excellent progress on the beginning stages of construction for the Placentia Veterans Village. Since celebrating the groundbreaking on November 1, 2018, the City of Placentia has worked closely with its partners to quickly process permits to begin construction.

In December 2018, Building and Grading were issued, and demolition and grading is currently underway. The City looks forward to the next steps of construction, beginning the build of the building, in the next few months. Updates on construction phases will be posted throughout the construction.



The development is located on a newly constructed street (Veterans Way) near the intersection of Orangethorpe Avenue and Lakeview Avenue. This previously vacant property was frequently used for illegal dumping and will now be used as permanent supportive housing for Veterans. The address of this new development will be 1945 E. Veterans Way.



The Placentia Veterans Village will include 50 furnished apartment homes, 49 for veterans and one used as an on-site management unit. Amenities include a landscaped courtyard area, community garden, recreation room, and resident services offices. The state-of-the-art development will be LEED Gold certified, utilizing energy efficient design principles, building materials and energy efficient appliances. The

“360-degree” design will be high-quality architecture reminiscent of the “Craftsman” style.

Once constructed, veterans will have access to comprehensive on-site supportive services including case management, physical and mental health services, employment services, life skills training, and counseling. The Placentia Veterans Village is a testament to the City and City Council’s commitment to ending homelessness and providing support to our nation’s veterans.

Compost Giveaway on March 30th

The City of Placentia and Republic Services will hold its annual Free Compost Giveaway for residents of Placentia at Tri-City Park on Saturday, March 30th, from 8:00 a.m. until 10:30 a.m. (or until the compost runs out). This event provides an opportunity to give back and thank residents for their participation in the City's green waste recycling program. Residents must bring in their own containers (no bags please) to receive the loose compost. There is a limit of 60 gallons per household, while supplies last.



Compost creates healthier soil by adding organic matter and improving soil structure. Healthy soil uses water more efficiently, allowing available water to flow toward your plants' roots, storing water in the soil longer, and reducing runoff and erosion. To receive free compost, residents must provide proof of residency (California driver's license or utility bill). Police Department Begins Fourth Annual Citizen's Academy

The Placentia Police Department began its fourth Citizen's Police Academy on the evening of March 6th. This eleven-week course introduces participants to the many facets of the Placentia Police Department including: structure of the department, patrol operations, equipment carried by police officers, weapons, K9 activities, dispatch, detectives, gangs, narcotics, crime scene investigations, traffic operations, DUI enforcement, and the employee hiring process. The Citizen's Academy also allows participants to meet Placentia Police officers and allows open dialogue between public safety and residents.



The Citizen's Academy is intended to foster open lines of communication between the Police Department and the community with course classes taught by personnel from all levels of the department. The interactions provide participants the opportunity to ask questions of how or why police operate in a certain manner, and has resulted in more positive relationships and improved Police resident communications.




