Applications Now Being Accepted for the Position of City Clerk

Applications are now being accepted for an appointment to the position of City Clerk. This appointee will hold the office from April 2019 until the next general municipal election in November 2020.

Applicants must be residents of Placentia and available to attend all meetings of the City Council. The City Clerk is an elected position and, by charter, helps maintain order within the City government by overseeing City Council meetings, official City records, and official City acts. As a custodian of the City Seal, they conduct election activities, for both general and special elections. The City Clerk receives \$150.00 per month compensation.

LA JOLLA FULL STREET CLOSURE – SATURDAY, APRIL 6, 2019

On Saturday, April 6, 2019, the City of Placentia will have a one-day closure on both sides of the road on La Jolla St. between Cypress St. and Tafolla St. for utility work. The closure will be a hard closure (i.e. no access to motorists). Detour signs will be posted during the closure. Please see map below.

The closure will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The street will be reopened shortly after 4:00 p.m. Please plan accordingly by taking alternate routes and allowing more time for travel.

Placentia Meeting with Metrolink CEO Stephanie Wiggins

On Wednesday, April 3rd City Officials including Mayor Rhonda Shader, Mayor Pro Tem Ward Smith and City Administrator Damien Arrula, along with Chairman Tim Shaw of the Orange County Transportation Board of Directors, Chief Executive Officer Darrell Johnson of the Orange County Transportation Authority, Orange County's Fourth District Supervisor Doug Chaffee and District Director Marc Hansen of Congressman Gil Cisneros held a meeting in Old Town Placentia with Chief Executive Officer Stephanie Wiggins of Metrolink. The meeting discussed the proposed Metrolink Station and the regional and local benefits of a new mass public transportation center. The City, in partnership with the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA), has secured funding for the construction of a new, state-of-the-art Metrolink Station and 246-space parking structure. To take advantage of the upcoming Metrolink Station and parking structure, the City has adopted two master plans for the preservation and revitalization of the City's original Old Town and Packing House District areas. This includes the restoration of historic buildings from the 1900s, the development of mixed-use, transit-oriented development, residential and commercial buildings, and a vibrant, multi-modal environment. Collectively, these project areas will create significant economic development impacts to our local, regional and national economies.

Electronic Waste Collection

It is unlawful to throw away electronic waste in the garbage in California. To aid with proper disposal, Republic Services provides on-call curbside collection for household electronic waste such as: TVs, CPUs, monitors, desktop copiers, fax machines, keyboards, microwaves, stereos and CD/DVD/VCR players. Bulky-Item Collection Program

Help keep our neighborhoods, streets, and alleys free of unwanted furniture, appliances, and other bulky items by using Republic Services for bulky item pick-up. If an item won't fit in your trash container, contact Republic Services. All single-family residential customers are entitled to three (3) free bulky item pick-ups per year. Additional pickups are available for a fee. Bulky item pick-ups for multi-family dwellings, properties with five (5) units or more, and businesses come at a cost. Bulky items include, but are not limited to, furniture, water heaters, large appliances, electronic waste and other bulky items. There is a disposal fee for items containing CFC's Freon. For more information and/or to schedule a bulky item pick-up, please call Republic Services at (714) 238-2444.



If you are doing a large clean-out or remodeling your home, call Republic Services at (714) 238-2444 to learn more about renting a larger waste container. These can be delivered and picked up directly from your driveway.

Remember that household hazardous waste is NOT picked up at the curb. If you have unneeded household chemicals, such as tub and tile cleaner, toilet bowl cleaner, paint, stain, paint thinner, used motor oil, antifreeze, pool chemicals, pesticides, and similar hazardous products, you may dispose of them for FREE at the Orange County Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Centers, which are open Tuesday through Saturday, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. (closed major holidays and during rainy weather). Police Department Participates in Baker to Vegas Run

Members of the Placentia Police Department competed in the Baker to Vegas Challenge Cup Relay last weekend. Placentia was joined by La Habra and Brea Police Departments to form one team in a race that covers a total of 120 miles across the California and Nevada desert. Both sworn and non-sworn members partnered to run this 120 mile relay race comprised of 20 different runners with 20 different running "legs." Our team's race took almost 20 hours to complete the entire run. Hundreds of law enforcement teams competed, both across the nation and as far as Australia, with 8,000 runners and a total of 20,000 participants including support staff.




