Applications are now being accepted for an appointment to the position of City Clerk. This appointee will hold the office from April 2019 until the next general municipal election in November 2020.

Applicants must be residents of Placentia and available to attend all meetings of the City Council. The City Clerk is an elected position and, by charter, helps maintain order within the City government by overseeing City Council meetings, official City records, and official City acts. As a custodian of the City Seal, they conduct election activities, for both general and special elections. The City Clerk receives \$150.00 per month compensation.



### Spring Gardening to Protect California Citrus Trees

Placentia is known for its beautiful orange trees, and taking proper care of them is important to ensure these trees stay healthy and fruitful for years to come. In addition to watering, pruning and fertilizing your citrus tree this spring, be sure to inspect your trees for signs of a dangerous pest called the Asian citrus psyllid and deadly citrus tree disease called Huanglongbing (HLB).

The pest can spread the disease as it feeds on citrus tree leaves. HLB is not dangerous to humans or pets, but it is fatal for citrus trees and has no cure. For more information, please visit [CaliforniaCitrusThreat.org](http://CaliforniaCitrusThreat.org).

### SPRING GARDENING TIPS FOR YOUR BACKYARD CITRUS TREE

The Asian citrus psyllid and the disease it can carry, Huanglongbing (HLB), have been found in California, but by following these best practices below you can keep your tree healthy while limiting the spread of HLB:



As the weather warms, apply water at the tree's trunk. As the tree grows, water a larger area around the tree.



Newly planted trees should be watered every 3–7 days. Older trees can be watered every week or two.



Apply fertilizer and keep pests at bay. Ask your local nursery or garden center about which products are best.



When harvesting fruit, clip the fruit off at the stem with sharp clippers, removing all leaves.



Be sure to dry out citrus tree clippings or double bag them before removing the plant material from the property.

### Village Plaza Center Update 2: Construction Underway



The Village Plaza shopping center is undergoing phase one of a two-phase development and façade enhancement project. The project began with demolition of the former 8,370-square foot space in late December 2018, and has completed all grading, underground utilities, and foundation forms. Ongoing framing activities have started to

form the shape of the building and the owner hopes to have construction completed by May with tenant spaces opening by summer. The building will incorporate Spanish style design elements including clay tile, smooth stucco finishes, and decorative metalwork.



When completed, the building will be approximately 7,000 square feet and designed to accommodate three fast-casual restaurants with one tenant space designated for a 2,500-square foot coffee shop with a drive-through. Items such as televisions, computer monitors, game consoles, stereos, cell phones, microwaves, and items containing circuit boards will be collected. Hazardous materials or business e-waste will not be accepted. Residents will be required to provide proof of residency in order to participate. 
