## Placentia Purchases State-of-the-Art Fire Apparatuses for New Fire Department

Immediately after hiring an experienced and highly-qualified Interim Fire Chief, the City Council on July 9<sup>th</sup> approved the purchase of state-of-the-art fire apparatus equipment. These apparatuses have been vetted by two retired Fire Chiefs, one active Fire Chief and two fire apparatus experts from active operating fire departments. All apparatus will also be constructed to meet National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 1901: Standard for Automotive Fire Apparatus and utilize the latest technology available to the fire industry.

The state-of-the-art apparatuses include: two Type I Engines, one Quint with a 100-foot ladder, one mini-pumper apparatus, communications equipment for the apparatus, and accompanying equipment including lightbars, hoses, nozzles, any necessary rescue equipment, hand tools and submersible pumps. The apparatuses and equipment have been recommended specifically for Placentia based upon risk profile, typical calls for service, and extended



useful service life. In addition to the apparatuses, Placentia will purchase support vehicles including three incident command units for the Chief and Battalion Chiefs, a passenger van for staff transportation and training and a utility pickup truck to transport tools and equipment.

A separate and identical, brand-new, fully-equipped Type I Engine will be purchased and kept in reserve for training purposes but also be rotated to front line service to ensure even wear and extend the useful service life of both Engines. Maintaining a fully equipped reserve Engine helps maintain the City’s current ISO rating and it can be immediately placed into service in the event of a major emergency or request for mutual or automatic aid.

“Orange County enjoys excellent public safety, continuing in that effort, the Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department will be fully equipped and capable of responding to overlapping emergencies as well as provide like-for-like mutual and automatic aid to our neighbors,” said Mayor Rhonda Shader. “We will continue moving forward, preparing our Department to take full command July 1, 2020.”

“Having been on the OCFA Board for 4 years and approving purchases of equipment and apparatus, I am confident these apparatuses are some of the best in the industry and we are excited to use them in our great City,” said Councilmember Craig Green.


To help address firefighter cancer rate concerns, ensure long-term firefighter health, and utilize the latest technology available, the Engines and quint will be built utilizing the “clean cab” concept which reduces firefighters’ exposure to carcinogens. By storing personal protective equipment (PPE) and turnout gear that have been used during fire suppression in a separate outside compartment, there is a significant reduction in firefighters’ exposure to carcinogens inside a closed apparatus cab.

“The apparatuses fulfill the next step in the City’s Fire Implementation Plan. These vehicles include all the necessary equipment and utilize the latest technology available to equip the Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department to be among the best in Orange County,” said City Administrator Damien R. Arrula. “We are looking forward to utilizing this great equipment to provide excellent 911 services for our residents and businesses.”

### Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District Update: Residents Urged to Remove Standing Water to Reduce Mosquitoes

Orange County has experienced an increase in West Nile virus activities over the last few years and the presence of the invasive Aedes mosquitoes threatens the county with diseases such as Zika virus, dengue fever, and Chikungunya.

Residents should take the following precautions to help reduce the chances of being bit:

- Dump and drain any containers filled with water at least once a week
- Clean and scrub bird baths and pet water bowls weekly
- Dump water from potted plant saucers
- Do not transport or share plant stems rooted in water
- Drill a hole or puncture containers to eliminate standing water

To prevent mosquito bites, the District offers the following tips:

- Apply mosquito repellents to exposed skin before going outdoors; reapply as recommended
- Wear repellent containing DEET®, Picaridin, IR3535, or oil of lemon eucalyptus
- Close all unscreened doors and windows to prevent mosquitoes from entering your home or space; repair broken or damaged screens
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants, and opt for lighter-colored clothing

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

### **Street Improvements and Repairs Coming to Placentia**

On June 4<sup>th</sup>, the City Council awarded a construction contract to Onyx Paving for the FY 2018-19 Residential Street Rehabilitation Project. This project will repave approximately 198,000 square feet of residential streets as well as remove and replace broken concrete sidewalk panels, curb and gutter as well as reconstruct the existing ADA curb ramps to ensure they are fully compliant with current ADA standards. The condition of the pavement on these streets is among the worst in the City and each street will be repaved with new rubberized asphalt. The project is funded almost entirely with SB1 Gas Tax revenues that California voters decided not to repeal last November. Work on this project is scheduled to begin on July 8<sup>th</sup>. In November, Placentia voters overwhelmingly approved Measure U, a 1% increase in the City's Sales Tax to help fund the cost of much needed infrastructure repairs and maintenance as well as public safety and other critical services. The Measure U sales tax increase began collection on April 1, 2019. As a result, for the first time in many years, the City Council will be able to fund much needed road and infrastructure repairs. The City Council has allocated a total of \$3.2 million in Measure U, SB 1 Gas Tax and Measure M Funding to continue funding street repairs and maintenance for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.



City staff anticipates presenting a professional services agreement for engineering design services for the FY 2019-20 Arterial Roadway Rehabilitation Project and the FY 2019-20 Residential Slurry Seal Project to the City Council for its consideration at the July 23<sup>rd</sup> City Council Meeting. The [arterial roadway rehabilitation project](#) will repave more than 800,000 square feet of pavement on Bastanchury Road, Golden Avenue and Kraemer Boulevard. This project also includes replacement of broken concrete, ADA-compliant curb ramps and traffic safety improvements. The residential slurry seal project will slurry seal more than 2.6 million square feet of residential streets noted in the [project area map](#). Replacement of broken concrete and new ADA-compliant curb ramps will also be included as part of this project. Staff anticipates a 6-9 month engineering design phase with construction bids solicited in March 2020 and construction set to begin in June 2020.
