Mayor Shader Presents “Do the Right Thing” Award to Sandy Castillo

On Saturday, July 13th, Mayor Rhonda Shader and Mayor Pro Tem Ward Smith presented Sandy Castillo with the Mayor’s Do the Right Thing Award for her work as founder of the Placentia TOPSoccer league, a community-based recreational program specifically designed to help athletes with physical and mental disabilities participate in soccer. The Junior United Soccer Association (JUSA) TOPSoccer program was established in 1991 with the goal of treating the players as children and soccer players and not as their diagnoses. Placentia is home to one of the largest TOPSoccer clubs in California and registers over 60 players. Sandy currently administers the program including scheduling games, training coaches and High School Buddies, coordinating the TOPSoccer Fest, communicating with parents and JUSA, and supporting the players.



“Pump Up” Placentia!

The City of Placentia has partnered with Galaxy Oil Company to operate the Placentia Gas Station, also known as “Best 4 Less 76” gasoline station at 480 S. Placentia Avenue (northeast corner of Placentia and Crowther Avenue). Through this partnership with Galaxy Oil, a portion of the revenue generated by the gas station will go directly back to the City for critical services including Police, Fire, and Public Works projects. This will greatly assist the City with infrastructure maintenance such as roads and facility improvements. 


Request for Proposals for Navigation Center/Emergency Shelter Operator Now Available

Rich Heritage, Bright Future: The Placentia General Plan Update

The City of Placentia is excited to announce that after a long, collaborative effort, the draft of the Placentia General Plan Update has been completed. This document, titled Rich Heritage, Bright Future: The Placentia General Plan, is a document that serves as a long-term blueprint for the community's vision of future growth. Goals and policies set forth in the document will set the framework needed to shape the City for the next 20-30 years. There are eleven elements in the document which include: Introduction, Land Use, Mobility, Housing, Conservation, Open Space, Safety, Noise, Economic Development, Health, Wellness and Economic Justice, and Sustainability. Each element examines the current state of the City and sets goals and policies that will help guide development and shape the direction our great City takes in the coming decades. The City would like to thank the Placentia residents who have donated their time and offered input by attending public meetings and to those who serve on the various committees and commissions that reviewed the General Plan. The next step of the General Plan Update process is completing the circulation of the Environmental Impact Report, which is available for review [here](#) and can be viewed at City Hall. The 45-day public comment period regarding the Draft Environment Impact Report (EIR) continues through August 26, 2019. The City will await further comments from reviewing agencies, and ultimately hold a public meeting for the anticipated adoption of Rich Heritage, Bright Future: The Placentia General Plan.



The City is looking forward to the adoption of the General Plan, which is tentatively scheduled for City Council consideration in Fall 2019. Back to School Emergency Earthquake Preparedness

The recent earthquakes affecting large portions of Southern California during the 4th of July holiday served as a great reminder to evaluate your personal earthquake preparedness. With Summer in full swing and kids and families in different locations, it's important to discuss earthquake safety.

Many people may be familiar with the old “duck and cover” campaign; while you should still immediately drop to your hands and knees while covering your neck and head, it is now recommended that you also hold on to the object which you are under, so you will move with the object if it shifts. Standing in doorways or the triangle of life are no longer recognized as safe; however, if you are outside, make sure you still drop and cover. Be sure to refresh these skills with your family, especially children, on these procedures for an earthquake or stage your own earthquake drill at home to identify areas which are safer than others.



A critical part of preparedness is equipping your home and vehicles for an emergency by creating multiple emergency kits. Best practices include having snacks, and at minimum, one-gallon of water, per person, per day for at least three days at your home. After the “Big One”, traffic may be gridlocked due to closed and damaged roadways. Drivers should create a small kit for their vehicles with basic necessities for roughly 24 hours. A pack of water, snack bars, a change of clothes and a toothbrush can make the difference if you find yourself away from home when a disaster strikes.

If you have young members of your household who are home for the summer or home before you, parents should discuss the best ways of reuniting after a disaster. Together, families should determine who will pick up children or where to meet, how to establish contact, and practice! For students, school may be the safest place during an earthquake due to regulations which have greatly improved school structures in California. Schools often serve as hosts for disaster shelter; therefore, children may be advised to wait at school for reunification.

Some additional safety tips include:

- Save the address and contact information for your student's school so it is readily available
- Subscribe to Placentia's [Nixle Alert System](#) by texting 92870 to 888777
- Have students keep a hard copy of parents/guardians contact information
- Ensure your student has access to life-sustaining medication, if required

The time directly following a disaster can be some of the most terrifying and uncertain times in a person's life, but simple measures today can make recovery and reunification less stressful. Streetlight Pole Replacement Project

Southern California Edison (SCE) work crews and approved contractors are replacing old steel streetlights with new concrete poles and light fixtures in several neighborhoods throughout the City. A total of 571 steel poles are scheduled for upgrade beginning at the end of July/early August.

Although SCE does not anticipate power loss as a result of its work, it will be notifying impacted residents and business owners in advance of work commencing in their area. New pole locations will be designated by an "S/L" marking on the curb.



Brightview Landscape Inc. has begun trimming Kraemer Avenue and will continue along Golden Avenue, Valencia Avenue, Bastanchury Road, Palm Drive, Yorba Linda Boulevard, Placentia Avenue, Alta Vista Avenue, Rose Drive, Central Avenue and Richfield Road.
