Measure U Funds Used to replace Aging Equipment

Measure U, the 1% Transactions and Use Tax approved by voters in November 2018, provides a critical, reliable funding source to not only repair and maintain our streets, parks and facilities, but also to replace aging equipment and vehicles in the City's fleet. The newest addition is a forklift used at the City Yard to load and unload large and heavy equipment and material deliveries. The City's existing forklift was purchased in 1981 and despite regular fleet maintenance, the forklift has far outlived its useful service life and no longer functions safely. Measure U Funds were budgeted in this year's Capital Improvement Program to replace the forklift with a brand new model made by Toyota. Public Works staff took delivery of the new forklift last week and have already put it into service! We are thankful to the registered voters of Placentia for having passed Measure U in November.



City Seeks Committee Members for Various Commissions and Committees

The City Council is accepting applications for several Commissions and Committees that have vacancies. The Commissions and Committees serve as advisory groups to the City Council on matters within their area of interest. 

Upcoming Caltrans Closures for State Route 57 Lambert Interchange

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) continues work on the State Route 57 Lambert Interchange Project. On September 3rd - 5th, this work will require closures from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. All closures on mainline SR-57 will be alternate lane closures with a minimum of 2 lanes remaining open at all times. The closures for all three days are: Eastbound Lambert Rd lanes #1 & #2 from State College to Associate Rd., Westbound Lambert Rd lanes #1 & #2 from Associate Rd to State College Blvd., Northbound SR-57 from Imperial Hwy/SR-90 to Tonner Canyon Rd/Brea Canyon Rd, Southbound SR-57 from Tonner Canyon Rd/Brea Canyon Rd to Imperial Hwy/SR-90, the Northbound SR-57 Lambert Rd on and off ramps, and the Southbound SR-57 Lambert Rd off ramp.

Residents Can Sign Up to Receive Local Alerts By Text and Email

The City has partnered with Nixle to provide an Emergency Notification System to alert residents in real-time about critical emergency information and relevant community advisories in Placentia. Notifications may be sent for emergency updates, crime alerts, power outages, road closures, construction advisories, and weather-related issues such as flooding. Subscribers have the ability to select how they would like to receive notifications. These alerts can be sent to a home, cell or business phone, email, text message or hearing impaired receiving devices at no cost to the subscriber. To register, residents or business owners in Placentia can simply text 92870 to 888777 from a mobile phone. Once registered, residents will receive a confirmation text message. Placentia Veterans Village Construction Update

The City of Placentia, in partnership with the County of Orange, Mercy Housing California, and New Directions for Veterans celebrated the groundbreaking of the Placentia Veterans Village on November 1, 2018. Since the groundbreaking, Mercy Housing California and their contractors have been hard at work building this high-quality, service-enriched, affordable apartment development for United States Military Veterans who are homeless and/or at risk of homelessness. This development is located adjacent to a newly constructed street 1945 E.



Veterans Way, near the intersection of Orangethorpe Avenue and Lakeview Avenue; north of the Atwood Flood Control Channel. The new Development will improve the property significantly while addressing a need in Orange County and throughout the nation for veterans housing.



In December 2018, construction permits were issued, and the grading, underground work and exterior block wall construction began and has recently been completed. Framing of the three-story structure is currently underway. The Placentia Veterans Village is a testament to the City's commitment to ending homelessness and providing support to our nation's veterans.

The Placentia Veterans Village will include 50 furnished apartment homes, 49 for veterans and one which will be utilized as an on-site management unit. Amenities include a landscaped courtyard area, community garden, recreation room, and resident services offices. The state-of-the-art development will be LEED Gold certified, utilizing energy efficient design principles, building materials and energy efficient appliances. The "360-degree" design will be high-quality architecture reminiscent of the "Craftsman" style.

Once constructed, veterans will have access to comprehensive on-site supportive services including case management, physical and mental health services, employment services, life skills training, and counseling. For additional information on this unique partnership, please visit



Placentia Police Department Participates in Gang Reduction Collaboration

Detectives Conroy and Gillis from the Placentia Police Department participated in the first meeting of the school year for the Orange County Gang Reduction and Intervention Partnership (OC GRIP) at Melrose Elementary. This award-winning partnership through the Orange County District Attorney's Office, which includes many police departments and school districts throughout the county, work collaboratively to identify at-risk youth and aims to increase school attendance and decrease gang activity. Students who attend a pre-selected OC GRIP school can participate in the program offerings. The Placentia Police Department participates in OC GRIP under the supervision of Sergeant McKenzie, who is a former Gang Detective for our department. The OC GRIP program is predicated on the simple but powerful concept that a community must work together to provide its youth with opportunities to succeed, and that by uniting families, teachers and community leaders, the social forces that breed gang formation can be effectively combatted.



Military Banner Recognition Program

The Placentia Military Banner Recognition Program is now accepting applications for the 2019 installation. The program, known as Placentia "Hometown Heroes," honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as an active-duty member in a full-time capacity in the United States Armed Forces. Branches of service include Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, and Navy. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia, or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia.

The banner will be installed along Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years. The City will not be responsible for replacing banners that are stolen, damaged, destroyed due to sun, weather, vandalism or any act of nature beyond our control such as high winds. Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application.

[Applications](#) are currently being accepted through October 21st, and will be installed during the month of November. The cost to display each customized banner is \$260 and each service person is allowed one banner. Applications can be submitted to the Placentia Police Department. Streetlight Pole Replacement Project

Southern California Edison (SCE) work crews and approved contractors are replacing old steel streetlights with new concrete poles and light fixtures in several neighborhoods throughout the City. A total of 571 steel poles are scheduled for upgrades and work is anticipated to be completed in September. This work is funded and managed by Southern California Edison.

Although SCE does not anticipate power loss as a result of its work, it will be notifying impacted residents and business owners in advance of work commencing in their area. 

CONTINUED WEST NILE VIRUS ACTIVITY DETECTED IN NORTH ORANGE COUNTY *District to continue truck-mounted ULV treatments to reduce mosquito population*

Garden Grove, CA. The Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District (OCMVCD) has continued to detect high levels of West Nile Virus (WNV) activity in north Orange County. OCMVCD routine tests of mosquito samples indicated additional WNV positive mosquito samples found in a 4 square mile area that includes portions of the cities of Anaheim (1 Sq. Mile), Buena Park (0.3 Sq. Miles), Cypress (0.77 Sq. Miles), and Stanton (1.88 Sq. Miles). The increase of WNV positive mosquito samples indicates an increased risk for residents to become infected with WNV through a mosquito bite.

In an effort to reduce the number of mosquitoes, interrupt virus transmission, and protect the public from mosquito-borne diseases, the OCMVCD will conduct truck-mounted ultra-low volume (ULV) applications in neighborhoods where the mosquitoes were trapped. The treatment area will be from Orange Ave to Chapman Ave and Valley View Ave to Dale Street [see attached map]. The applications are scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday, September 25-26 between 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. Application dates and times may change due to weather, environmental conditions or due to other operational needs. Residents can check the spraying schedule and determine whether their homes are located within the treatment area at: <https://www.ocvector.org/ground-based-adulticiding>

The Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District will continue to conduct surveillance and if laboratory results indicate a continued increase in WNV positive mosquitoes, truck-mounted treatments will be scheduled for additional areas.

Residents in treatment areas will be notified prior to the treatment date with signs posted in their neighborhoods. All control products used by OCMVCD are registered by the federal and state Environmental Protection Agency for the purpose of controlling mosquitoes and to safeguard public health. The products are applied according to the label rate (less than 1 fluid oz. per acre) and are not harmful to people or pets, even if they are present during the application. The application will also not harm the finishes on cars or homes. Residents do not have to turn off air-conditioning units during the application.

Mosquito control is a shared responsibility and residents need to take an active role in removing water sources and sharing information with their neighbors to help in controlling mosquitoes.

Residents should take the following precautions to help reduce the chances of getting bitten by mosquitoes:


- Dump and drain any containers filled with water at least once a week
- Clean and scrub bird baths and pet water bowls weekly
- Dump water from potted plant saucers
- Do not transport or share plant stems rooted in water
- Drill a hole or puncture containers to eliminate standing water

To prevent mosquito bites, the District offers the following tips:

- Apply mosquito repellents to exposed skin before going outdoors; reapply as recommended
- Wear repellent containing DEET®, Picaridin, IR3535, or oil of lemon eucalyptus
- Close all unscreened doors and windows to prevent mosquitoes from entering your home or space; repair broken or damaged screens
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants, and opt for lighter-colored clothing



— Adult Mosquito Control Application Area


