City Purchases Equipment for New Fire Department

The Placentia City Council approved the purchase of the necessary tools and equipment needed for the City's new Fire Department. The City's equipment supplier, Derotic Emergency Equipment surveyed the type and specifications of equipment used by surrounding fire agencies to ensure the City is using similar equipment for compatibility and seamless coordination with our neighboring cities. The equipment has been reviewed by Placentia's fire apparatus consultant, a retired Fire Chief and Placentia's Interim Fire Chief Scott Ferguson with an anticipated delivery of early spring 2020. The equipment purchased includes items such as breathing apparatus, hoses and clamps, multi-purpose tools, bolt cutters, axes, hand tools, hydraulic cutting tools and much more. The City looks forward to continually updating residents on the important steps being taken to prepare our own Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department for operation in July 2020.



Coyote Education and Awareness

Orange County cities have seen an increase in coyote activity in neighborhoods. To reduce the amount of coyotes seen in your neighborhood, please follow these tips and share them with your neighbors:

- Do not feed coyotes. Nearly all wild animal bites occur when people attempt to feed them
- Eliminate sources of water particularly during dry weather
- Bird feeders should be positioned so that coyotes can't get the feed. Coyotes are attracted by bread, table scraps, seed, or even birds that come to the feeder
- Secure garbage containers and eliminate garbage odors
- Don't leave small children unattended outside if coyotes have been seen frequently in the area
- Don't allow pets to run free. Keep them safely confined and provide secure nighttime housing for them. Walk your dog on a leash and accompany your pet outside, especially at night.
- Cut back brushy areas of your yard as they provide cover for coyotes and their prey
- Close off crawl spaces under porches and sheds. Coyotes use such areas for resting and raising young
- Don't let coyotes intimidate you. Don't hesitate to scare off coyotes with loud noises, bright lights, or water sprayed from a hose
- Pass this information along. Your efforts will be futile if your neighbors are providing food and shelter for coyotes




Members of the Placentia team were given an opportunity to turn training into action by putting out real fires with an extinguisher. Many participants had never used a fire extinguisher before and the training effectively taught proper techniques and execution.

Placentia Police Department Trains Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District

The Placentia Police Department's School Resource Officers and the Emergency Services Division continue their collaboration with the Placentia-Yorba Linda School District (PYLUSD) to train teachers and staff on the new PYLUSD Emergency Procedures and Active Shooter Awareness. This week, the Police Department trained staff at Valdez Middle School and Tynes Elementary School on new procedures and how their staff can best serve their students by employing enhanced levels of awareness at all time.

The department will continue to train all district faculty within the City of Placentia. The training will cover new emergency procedures to ensure each campus is trained and ready to respond to various incidents. The training provided by the Police Department and School District includes new lockdown procedures, Stop-Drop-and-Hold-on, training specific to persons with disabilities and functional needs, and sheltering in place. The City is excited for the opportunity to collaborate on the training program to ensure the district's faculty are familiar with the above procedures as well as new lockdown systems. PYLUSD staff will be an excellent resource and ready to respond if the City has a large-scale or school-specific incident.



Military Banner Recognition Program

The Placentia Military Banner Recognition Program is now accepting applications for the 2019 installation. The program, known as Placentia "Hometown Heroes," honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as an active-duty member in a full-time capacity in the United States Armed Forces. Branches of service include Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, and Navy. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia, or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia.

The banner will be installed along Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years. The City will not be responsible for replacing banners that are stolen, damaged, destroyed due to sun, weather, vandalism or any act of nature beyond our control such as high winds. Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application.

[Applications](#) are currently being accepted through October 21st, and will be installed during the month of November. The cost to display each customized banner is \$260 and each service person is allowed one banner. Applications can be submitted to the Placentia Police Department. PUBLIC WORKS

Annual Turfgrass Renovation Program

The City performs annual turfgrass renovations in public parkways and parks in the Fall. Currently, the City's landscape maintenance contractors are lowering the grass blade height in the parkways and parks to be followed up by dethatching, aerification, fresh grass seed and fertilizer. The purpose for this annual process is to promote healthy turf grass and improved sports field playing surfaces by reducing compaction/stress conditions, which will offer greater water penetration and reduce runoff. As part of this process, the grass in the areas being treated will be dry and brown in the initial stages. This is only temporary, and the grass will naturally return to a healthy condition once the process is complete. This annual turf renovation is estimated to be completed by December.




