ADMINISTRATION

City Purchases Equipment for New Fire Department

The Placentia City Council approved the purchase of the necessary tools and equipment needed for the City's new Fire Department. The City's equipment supplier, Derotic Emergency Equipment surveyed the type and specifications of equipment used by surrounding fire agencies to ensure the City is using similar equipment for compatibility and seamless coordination with our neighboring cities. The equipment has been reviewed by Placentia's fire apparatus consultant, a retired Fire Chief and Placentia's Interim Fire Chief Scott Ferguson with an anticipated delivery of early spring 2020. The equipment purchased includes items such as breathing apparatus, hoses and clamps, multi-purpose tools, bolt cutters, axes, hand tools, hydraulic cutting tools and much more. The City looks forward to continually updating residents on the important steps being taken to prepare our own Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department for operation in July 2020.



"Pump Up" Placentia!

The City of Placentia has partnered with Galaxy Oil Company to operate the Placentia Gas Station, also known as "Best 4 Less 76" gasoline station at 480 S. Placentia Avenue (northeast corner of Placentia and Crowther Avenue). Through this partnership with Galaxy Oil, a portion of the revenue generated by the gas station will go directly back to the City for critical services including Police, Fire, and Public Works projects. This will greatly assist the City with infrastructure maintenance such as roads and facility improvements. The City encourages all residents and visitors to fuel their vehicles at the 76 Gasoline Station and "Pump Up Placentia" by putting money directly back into your local services. Placentia Updates General Plan “Rich Heritage, Bright Future”

At the October 1, 2019 City Council meeting, Placentia Councilmembers voted to certify the final Environmental Impact Report (EIR 2019-01) and adopt the General Plan Update entitled “Rich Heritage, Bright Future – Placentia General Plan.” The General Plan Update is a blueprint for the community’s future growth, establishing a vision for the City for the next 20-30 years.

This General Plan Update goes above and beyond the minimum requirements for General Plan compliance. Three optional sections are included in the General Plan that the City Council felt are necessary to properly plan for the future of Placentia. These elements include economic development, health, wellness & environmental justice and sustainability. These components assist in having a well-rounded document that allows the City to properly adapt to the changing needs of residents now and into the future.

“The General Plan Update is crucial in providing clear direction for the future growth and prosperity of our great City,” said Mayor Rhonda Shader. “This document not only gives vision to the future of our City, but also prioritizes the projects needed to enhance the quality of life for our residents.”

“After a comprehensive review from the City Council Ad Hoc Committee, Planning Commission, City Council, and in collaboration with stakeholders, this General Plan has been thoroughly vetted and is ready to be put to good use,” said Councilmember Chad Wanke. “This is the culmination of years of hard work and determination to develop a General Plan that will help Placentia continue to prosper for years to come.”

“This is the first time in 40 years that the City has been able to bring forward all items of the General Plan for a comprehensive review and update,” said City Administrator Damien R. Arrula. “This vision for the City’s future will allow for a clear path forward, promoting economic development and increased opportunities for grant funding and citywide improvements.”

“This critical document sets vision and policy for multiple areas of our City including land use, parks, health, safety, fiscal sustainability, mobility and so much more,” said Joseph Lambert, Placentia’s Director of Development Services. “We are eager to use this document moving forward to continually improve the City’s physical landscape and programming.”

Annual AlertOC and Nixle Test – Text Messages on October 17th

On Thursday October 17th at 10:17a.m., the City of Placentia's Emergency Services Division will be conducting a joint test of the City's emergency notification systems Nixle and the countywide AlertOC. The primary objective of this joint, regional exercise is to test the City's AlertOC and Nixle capability, capacity, and effectiveness to deliver emergency notifications to the public during times of a major disaster. The annual test will simulate the real-world use of the systems during a "real" disaster or emergency event and ensure the system can deliver a large volume of notifications throughout the City. The Emergency Services Division will gauge the effectiveness of the systems by utilizing a confirmation request for all calls, emails, and text messages sent during the test.

To ensure that you are notified during an emergency, Placentia residents can opt-into the system via text by sending "AlertOC" to 888-777.



Additionally, the City's emergency mass notification exercise will be paired with the Great Shake-out event, which is conducted throughout the State to ensure everyone practices the Stop, Drop, and Hold On technique.

2019 Pink Patch Project

The Placentia Police Department has partnered with the Placentia Rotary Club in supporting Breast Cancer Awareness by helping raise funds for breast cancer research. All proceeds from this fundraiser will be donated to Susan G. Komen of Orange County in their efforts to prevent and cure breast cancer.

The 2019 Pink Patch is available for purchase at the front counter of the Police Department and at various City sponsored events for \$10.00. 

Military Banner Recognition Program

The Placentia Military Banner Recognition Program is now accepting applications for the 2019 installation. The program, known as Placentia "Hometown Heroes," honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as an active-duty member in a full-time capacity in the United States Armed Forces. Branches of service include Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, and Navy. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia, or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia.

The banner will be installed along Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years. The City will not be responsible for replacing banners that are stolen, damaged, destroyed due to sun, weather, vandalism or any act of nature beyond our control such as high winds. Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application.

[Applications](#) are currently being accepted through October 21st, and will be installed during the month of November. The cost to display each customized banner is \$260 and each service person is allowed one banner. Applications can be submitted to the Placentia Police Department. Annual Turfgrass Renovation Program


The City performs annual turfgrass renovations in public parkways and parks in the Fall. Currently, the City's landscape maintenance contractors are lowering the grass blade height in the parkways and parks to be followed up by dethatching, aerification, fresh grass seed and fertilizer. The purpose for this annual process is to promote healthy turf grass and improved sports field playing surfaces by reducing compaction/stress conditions, which will offer greater water penetration and reduce runoff. As part of this process, the grass in the areas being treated will be dry and brown in the initial stages. This is only temporary, and the grass will naturally return to a healthy condition once the process is complete. This annual turf renovation is estimated to be completed by December.

At Kraemer Blvd & Saturn

To access Kraemer Blvd. south of Alta Vista, traffic should travel east on Saturn to Imperial Highway. At Imperial Highway make a right turn. Travel east bound to Rose Drive. At Rose Drive make a right turn. Travel southbound on Rose Drive to Alta Vista. At Alta Vista make a right turn. Third light will be Kraemer Blvd.

At Golden & Valencia

People needing access to their homes can access their streets through side streets both north and south of Golden. Traffic needing to access Kraemer north of Saturn should travel north on Valencia to Imperial Highway. At Imperial Highway make a left turn. Kraemer will be second light from Valencia.

At Bastanchury and Valencia

To access Bastanchury Road west of Kraemer, traffic should be directed northbound on Valencia to Imperial Highway. At Imperial Highway make a left turn. Traffic should travel west bound on Imperial Highway to Placentia Avenue. At Placentia Ave. make a left turn traveling southbound to Bastanchury. At Bastanchury traffic will be allowed to travel west on Bastanchury or continue straight on Placentia Ave.

At Yorba Linda Blvd. & Valencia

To access Yorba Linda Blvd west of Kraemer, traffic should be directed northbound on Valencia to Imperial Highway. At Imperial Highway make a left turn. Traffic should travel west bound on Imperial Highway to Placentia Avenue. At Placentia Ave. make a left turn traveling southbound to Yorba Linda Blvd.

At Rose Drive and Palm

1. Homes located on the following streets can access their homes through Powell (1st street south of Palm): Holt Drive, Sharon Circle, Dunham Lane, Gutmann Lane, Callahan Lane, Farmer Lane, Carole Circle, Eckenrode Way
2. To access Valencia direct traffic north bound on Rose to Yorba Linda. At Yorba Linda make a left Valencia will be about ¼ mile from Rose.
At Valencia traffic will only be allowed to travel northbound.
3. To access neighborhood south of Palm traffic should be directed southbound on Rose to Alta Vista. At Alta Vista make a right.

At Kraemer & Madison

To access Kraemer north of Saturn, traffic should be directed west on Madison to Placentia Avenue. At Placentia make a right turn. Travel northbound on Placentia Ave to Imperial Highway. At Imperial Highway make a right turn. Traffic wishing to travel south on Kraemer will be detoured at Saturn back to Imperial Highway.

At Yorba Linda & Bradford

To access Yorba Linda Blvd east of Rose Drive, traffic should be directed south on Bradford Avenue to Chapman Avenue. At Chapman Avenue make a left turn traveling eastbound to Kraemer Blvd. At Kraemer Blvd. make a left turn traveling to Alta Vista. At Alta Vista make a right turn, traveling eastbound to Rose Drive. At Rose Drive make a left turn traveling northbound to Yorba Linda Blvd.

At Bastanchury & Placentia

To access Bastanchury Road east of Valencia Avenue, direct traffic northbound on Placentia to Imperial Highway. At Imperial Highway make a right turn traveling eastbound to Valencia Avenue. At Valencia Avenue make a right turn traveling south bound to Yorba Linda Blvd. At Yorba Linda traffic will only be allowed to travel east bound.

At Cielo and Kraemer (Beazer Homes)

Access to Cielo will be closed from approximately 7am when parade setup begins to approximately 1pm when the streets reopen. Residents who live off of Cielo will be allowed to leave their housing tract by using Kraemer (Southbound) if it is safe to do so as coordinated by Police on site. They will not be allowed to return until the streets re-open.


