The Great California Shake-Out

On Thursday, October 17th at 10:17 a.m., the Emergency Services Division led the City of Placentia's participation in a multi-dimensional, regional exercise which included the Great Shake-Out and the AlertOC mass notification system test. The combined emergency alert test and earthquake drill encouraged City staff to react to the sudden impact of an incident and appropriately respond with a mass notification.

The Great Shake-Out included a full-scale evacuation of City Hall, the Police Department, Library District, and all City facilities. To ensure all field personnel were accounted for, the Emergency Communications Center conducted a roll-call procedure to test communications and confirm personnel safety.

The AlertOC test was conducted along with all Orange County cities to ensure that the region can send out mass notifications to businesses and residents that may be impacted by an emergency situation. During the emergency alert test, nearly 6,000 calls, texts, and e-mails were sent to Placentia residents and members of the community. Sign up today by texting 92870 to 888777.



Fire and Life Safety Department New Mini Pumper Under Construction

The new Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department will soon be equipped with a brand new mini pumper quick response apparatus. This apparatus has been designated as Patrol 2 and will be staffed by two firefighters and assigned to respond to routine service calls as well as provide suppression of outside, trash dumpster and vehicle fires. The new mini pumper is a modified Type VI apparatus that can be taken off road and used to respond to brush fires as well. The unit, currently under construction, will be upfitted with a high-pressure pump and able to carry 350 gallons of water or fire fighting foam. The unit will also be equipped with additional tools and equipment used for patient extrication at auto accidents as well as other routine and/or emergency incidents. This unit will allow the City's front-line fire apparatus', Engine 1 and Truck 2, to remain in reserve during routine non-emergency calls and available to respond to larger scale emergencies. Patrol 2 is much smaller and agile and will be able to respond to emergencies much faster than the larger engine and truck. The City expects Patrol 2 to be fully ready for service by late February 2020, and the new firefighters and command staff of the Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department will be able to begin training on this unit in March.







Measure U Funds Residential Slurry Seal Project

On October 15th, the City Council approved a construction contract totaling \$682,300 with Petrochem Manufacturing, LLC, for construction of the FY 2019-20A Residential Slurry Seal Project. This project, funded by Measure U, will slurry seal more than 1.8 million square feet of residential streets in three different neighborhoods. Slurry seal is a preventative maintenance surface treatment designed to extend the useful service life of road pavement. The streets receiving this treatment are generally rated in good condition so it's critically important that the City provide preventative maintenance to keep those streets in good condition. As long as a pavement surface is resealed on a regular basis, the useful service life of that street can be extended almost indefinitely. Slurry seal treatments are also extremely cost effective, between .30 and .40 cents per square foot. However, if the pavement surface is never maintained and needs to be completely redone, it will cost more than \$1.40 per square foot to re-pave it.



This project is a first in a series of street maintenance and rehabilitation projects budgeted by the City Council this fiscal year. A larger slurry seal project covering more than 2.6 million square feet is currently in design, as well as an arterial roadway pavement rehabilitation project. The arterial road project encompasses more than 800,000 square feet of arterial roads and will completely repave Golden Avenue, Kraemer Boulevard between Golden and Bastanchury, Bastanchury Road between the Fullerton City limits and Kraemer, as well as between the Yorba Linda City Limits and Valencia Avenue. Both of these projects are expected to be in construction by Summer 2020. Every street in Placentia will be addressed within 5-7 years and the City appreciates residents patience while the City works on future paving projects. Residents Can Sign Up to Receive Local Alerts By Text and Email

The City has partnered with Nixle to provide an Emergency Notification System to alert residents in real-time about critical emergency information and relevant community advisories in Placentia. Notifications may be sent for emergency updates, crime alerts, power outages, road closures, construction advisories, and weather-related issues such as flooding. Subscribers have the ability to select how they would like to receive notifications. These alerts can be sent to a home, cell or business phone, email, text message or hearing impaired receiving devices at no cost to the subscriber. To register, residents or business owners in Placentia can simply text 92870 to 888777 from a mobile phone. Once registered, residents will receive a confirmation text message. Placentia Updates General Plan “Rich Heritage, Bright Future”

At the October 1, 2019 City Council meeting, Placentia Councilmembers voted to certify the final Environmental Impact Report (EIR 2019-01) and adopt the General Plan Update entitled “Rich Heritage, Bright Future – Placentia General Plan.” The General Plan Update is a blueprint for the community’s future growth, establishing a vision for the City for the next 20-30 years.

This General Plan Update goes above and beyond the minimum requirements for General Plan compliance. Three optional sections are included in the General Plan that the City Council felt are necessary to properly plan for the future of Placentia. These elements include economic development, health, wellness & environmental justice and sustainability. These components assist in having a well-rounded document that allows the City to properly adapt to the changing needs of residents now and into the future.

“The General Plan Update is crucial in providing clear direction for the future growth and prosperity of our great City,” said Mayor Rhonda Shader. “This document not only gives vision to the future of our City, but also prioritizes the projects needed to enhance the quality of life for our residents.”

“After a comprehensive review from the City Council Ad Hoc Committee, Planning Commission, City Council, and in collaboration with stakeholders, this General Plan has been thoroughly vetted and is ready to be put to good use,” said Councilmember Chad Wanke. “This is the culmination of years of hard work and determination to develop a General Plan that will help Placentia continue to prosper for years to come.”

“This is the first time in 40 years that the City has been able to bring forward all items of the General Plan for a comprehensive review and update,” said City Administrator Damien R. Arrula. “This vision for the City’s future will allow for a clear path forward, promoting economic development and increased opportunities for grant funding and citywide improvements.”

“This critical document sets vision and policy for multiple areas of our City including land use, parks, health, safety, fiscal sustainability, mobility and so much more,” said Joseph Lambert, Placentia’s Director of Development Services. “We are eager to use this document moving forward to continually improve the City’s physical landscape and programming.”



Military Banner Recognition Program

The Placentia Military Banner Recognition Program is now accepting applications for the 2019 installation. The program, known as Placentia "Hometown Heroes," honors and recognizes Placentia residents currently serving as an active-duty member in a full-time capacity in the United States Armed Forces. Branches of service include Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, and Navy. Honorees must have a current place of residence in Placentia, or have an immediate family member (parent, spouse, son, daughter, grandparents) residing in Placentia.

The banner will be installed along Kraemer Boulevard and Yorba Linda Boulevard based on the City's discretion and will remain on display for two years. The City will not be responsible for replacing banners that are stolen, damaged, destroyed due to sun, weather, vandalism or any act of nature beyond our control such as high winds. Upon the end of the display period, the banner will be given to the person named on the banner application.

[Applications](#) are currently being accepted through October 21st, and will be installed during the month of November. The cost to display each customized banner is \$260 and each service person is allowed one banner. Applications can be submitted to the Placentia Police Department. PUBLIC WORKS

Annual Turfgrass Renovation Program

The City performs annual turfgrass renovations in public parkways and parks in the Fall. Currently, the City's landscape maintenance contractors are lowering the grass blade height in the parkways and parks to be followed up by dethatching, aerification, fresh grass seed and fertilizer. The purpose for this annual process is to promote healthy turf grass and improved sports field playing surfaces by reducing compaction/stress conditions, which will offer greater water penetration and reduce runoff. As part of this process, the grass in the areas being treated will be dry and brown in the initial stages. This is only temporary, and the grass will naturally return to a healthy condition once the process is complete. This annual turf renovation is estimated to be completed by December.
